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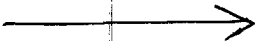
NOW was called Pedro Rodriguez, janitor of the Court House, and discussion ensued relative to cleaning thoroughly the Court House.

Now appears Mr. Perry Sears, ^{and others} of Capitan. Mr. Sandoval asks Mr. Sears the results of a meeting held in Capitan. Mr. Sears states: "The opposition presented their objections, which were mostly opposed to a Pond Issue for the proposed Village, and loss of School revenues, no other opposition developed."

Now appears Mr. S. E. Greisen, sheriff, and a resident of Capitan. He states that he is not satisfied with the water situation. He believes that the land on which the Village proposes to drill a well may not produce water, subsequently what would the town do with the well? Mr. Hall and Mr. Holmes say that now water is beside the question, it is incorporation they desire. Mr. Greisen is of the opinion that water should be a question. He does not believe that he can stop incorporation, but he wishes to object to the manner that the question of water has been handled.

AN ORDINANCE CONFIRMING THE CORPORATION OF THE VILLAGE OF CAPITAN; PROVIDING FOR THE GOVERNING BODY; PROVIDING FOR MEETINGS; ELECTIVE OFFICIALS, ELECTION PROCEEDINGS; DUTIES AND POWERS OF THE ELECTIVE OFFICIALS; ORDER OF BUSINESS; ETC.; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAPITAN, LINCOLN COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, that:

ARTICLE 1

HISTORICAL INFORMATION

Section 1. The Village of Capitan, New Mexico, was duly incorporated on the 1st day of February, 1937, by order and proceedings of the County Commissioners of Lincoln County; a certified copy of said proceedings are on file in the office of the Municipal Clerk.

ARTICLE 2

FORM OF GOVERNMENT, ELECTIONS, DUTIES, ETC:

Section 1. GOVERNING BODY. The governing body of the Village of Capitan shall consist of a Mayor and four (4) Councilmen, known as the Board of Trustees, all of whom shall be elected as provided by law, and all legal powers of the Village of Capitan shall be vested in said Board of Trustees. The other elective officer of the Village of Capitan shall be a Municipal Judge whose term of office is two (2) years.

Section 2. MEETINGS. The Board of Trustees shall hold regular meetings on the first Wednesday of each month at the hour of 7:30 o'clock P. M. and may hold special meetings from time to time, if business requires, upon the call of the Mayor, or Mayor Pro-Tem who is elected and named by the Board of Trustees at their organizational meeting after each municipal election. A majority of the members of the governing body may also call special meetings upon proper notification of same to each member.

Section 3. TERMS. The regular term of the Mayor shall be for a period of two (2) years, and the regular term of the

Trustees shall be for a period of four (4) years, and the election for a Mayor and the Trustees shall be held on the first Tuesday in March in each even-numbered year. The term of office for the members of the Board of Trustees shall be staggered so that the term of office for one-half of the members of the Board of Trustees will expire every two (2) years. The newly-elected officials shall, within ten (10) days after their certification of election by the Clerk as provided by law, take an oath or affirmation to support the Constitution of the United States, the Constitution and Laws of New Mexico, and to faithfully perform the duties of his office. The governing body, consisting of the newly-elected and qualified officers, and the officers whose terms have not expired or whose successors have not been elected and qualified, shall meet on the second Monday following the municipal election to organize itself.

Section 4. ELECTIONS.

(A) Members of the Board of Trustees shall be elected on an at-large basis.

(B) Any qualified voter residing within the corporate limits of the Village of Capitan shall be eligible for election to the office of Mayor or as a member of the Board of Trustees and may have his name placed upon the official ballot by filing with the Clerk, after the publication of the notice of the election and before 5:00 o'clock P. M., not less than thirty (30) days before the day of election, a declaration of candidacy containing the following:

1. Name and address of the candidate for office;
2. Office and position to which the candidate seeks election; and,
3. Signature of the candidate seeking that particular office and position.

(C) The municipal Clerk shall determine if the candidate filing a declaration of candidacy is a qualified elector and resident of the Village of Capitan.

(D) All election proceedings for the Village of Capitan elections shall be conducted in the manner prescribed by the Laws and Statutes of the State of New Mexico in force and as the same may from time to time be amended.

Section 5. DUTIES AND POWERS.

(A) The duties and powers of the Mayor shall be in accordance with the Laws and Statutes of the State of New Mexico in force and as the same may from time to time be amended.

(B) The duties and powers of the members of the Board of Trustees shall be in accordance with the Laws and Statutes of the State of New Mexico in force and as the same may from time to time be amended.

Section 6. ORDER OF BUSINESS, ORDINANCES AND RESOLUTIONS.

(A) The order of business at all regular meetings shall be in accordance with the agenda as prepared by the Clerk and/or the governing body.

(B) All Ordinances and/or Resolutions enacted by the governing body of the Village of Capitan shall be done in accordance with the Laws and Statutes of the State of New Mexico in force and as the same may from time to time be amended.

Section 7. A SEAL, the impression of which shall be as follows: In the center the word "Incorporated-Seal"; around the outer edge, the words, "Village of Capitan, New Mexico", shall be and hereby is declared to be the SEAL of the Village of Capitan.

Section 8. ALL ORDINANCES or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

ORDINANCE NO. 66-2

AN ORDINANCE STATING CERTAIN APPOINTIVE POSITIONS AS OFFICERS OF THE VILLAGE OF CAPITAN; METHOD OF APPOINTMENTS; ETC; DUTIES OF SAME; AND ESTABLISHING A BASIS FOR THEIR SALARIES AND/OR COMPENSATION; AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF CAPITAN, LINCOLN COUNTY, NEW MEXICO, that:

ARTICLE 1

VILLAGE OFFICERS--APPOINTMENTS:

Section 1. The officers of the Village of Capitan, other than those elected, shall consist of a Clerk, Treasurer, Manager, Attorney, Marshall, Policemen, and others as may be deemed necessary for the welfare of the Village.

Section 2. At the organizational meeting of the governing body the Mayor shall submit, for confirmation by the governing body, the names of persons who shall be employed to fill the appointive offices. If the governing body fails to confirm any person as an appointive official or employee of the municipality, the Mayor at the next regular meeting of the governing body shall submit the name of another person to fill the appointed office or to be employed by the municipality.

ARTICLE 2

DUTIES OF APPOINTIVE OFFICERS

Section 1. CLERK-DUTIES. The Clerk of the municipality shall perform all duties as required by the Laws and Statutes of the State of New Mexico and as required by the municipality and/or governing body of the municipality. With the approval of the governing body, the Clerk may name deputy clerks.

Section 2. TREASURER-DUTIES. The Treasurer of the municipality shall perform those duties as required by law. The office of Clerk and Treasurer may be combined.

Section 3. MANAGER-DUTIES. The Manager of the municipality shall perform those duties as provided for by the Laws

and Statutes of the State of New Mexico and policies of the governing body of the municipality. The offices of Manager, Clerk and Treasurer may be combined.

Section 4. ATTORNEY-DUTIES. The Attorney of the municipality shall perform those duties as provided for by the Laws and Statutes of the State of New Mexico.

Section 5. MARSHALL, POLICEMEN-DUTIES. The Marshall and other Policemen shall perform those duties as provided for by the Laws and Statutes of the State of New Mexico and other duties as required by the governing body of the municipality.

ARTICLE 3

OATH OF OFFICE, ETC.

Section 1. Any officer appointed or employed by the municipality shall take an oath or affirmation to support the Constitution of the United States, the Constitution and Laws of New Mexico, and to faithfully perform the duties of his office.

Section 2. The municipality shall require a corporate surety bond from any officers and/or employees designated by the governing body. The municipality shall pay for the surety bond.

Section 3. The governing body of the municipality may declare vacated the office of any person who fails, within ten (10) days after he has been notified of his appointment to office, to take the oath of office or to give bond when required.

ARTICLE 4

SALARIES AND/OR COMPENSATION

Section 1. The governing body of the municipality shall prescribe and approve the salaries, fees and compensation to be paid to municipal officers and employees. This may be done on a merit system, if same exists or is enacted.

Section 2. The governing body shall enact and/or approve, if same exists, vacation and sick-leave policies as a form of extra compensation for the employees.

Section 3. Each member of the governing body may be paid compensation not to exceed ten (\$10.00) dollars for each meeting he attends. No compensation shall be paid for attending more than four meetings a month.

ARTICLE 5

REPEAL

ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH ARE REPEALED.

Two positions wide open

Write in votes important in Carrizozo town election

Voters going to the polls in the March 5 election next Tuesday in Carrizozo will need to make use of a pencil in two places to vote for candidates in all four positions.

There will be only the problem of selecting the candidate of your choice in the mayor race where Bill Payne and Ed Jones will be shown in positions 1 and 2. You simply turn a voting pointer down over the candidate's name.

Willie Silva's name was in position 3 but has been scratched because he failed to register to vote and thereby became ineligible except as a "write in" candidate.

Both Positions 3 and 4 are open to "write in" voting. To "write in" a candidate for office or trustee, (or any other office), make sure the voting pointers, in this instance 3 and 4, are up. Then near the top of the machine, push up the

slide, numbered 3 and 4, and write in the name of your choice for that office. You can write in two trustee names, one in position 3 and one in 4.

Some care should be given to writing in the name of candidate. For instance, there are two Leandro Vegas in town and one is sheriff and not up for election. The other is Leandro Vega Sr. and you should be sure to add the Sr. to his name. James Willie Silva is also an announced write in candidate, and being the only Willie Silva in town, just two words, Willie Silva, should convey your intent to the election judges in such an instance.

S. M. Ortiz is the one candidate for municipal judge and you turn down the voting pointer same as for you mayor candidate. Should you wish to write in a candidate for either mayor or judge you follow instructions as for councilman.

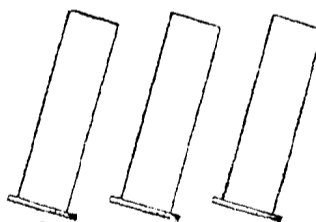
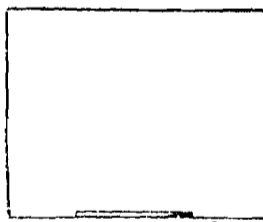
Attention, Voters!

DIRECTIONS FOR VOTING

1. Move the Red Handle completely to the Right (til the bell rings). This closes curtains and unlocks the machine for voting.
 2. Turn down a voting pointer over each candidate's name you wish to vote for from this position to this position X
CANDIDATE CANDIDATE
LEAVE THE POINTERS DOWN
 3. To "Write in" a Candidate for any office, make sure all voting pointers for that office are up. Then, near the top of the machine, push up the slide, bearing the numeral corresponding to the office, and write in the name of your choice for that office.
 4. Move the Red Handle completely to the Left. This records your vote, closes the machine and then opens the curtains. No one outside the machine can tell how you have voted.
- IMPORTANT:** You can make as many changes as you desire while the red handle is to the right. The machine is arranged so you cannot turn down more than the proper number of voting pointers for each office, so you cannot spoil your ballot by voting for too many candidates. **BUT YOU MUST NOT LOITER:** The Voting Machine Act of New Mexico allows each elector a maximum of three and one-half (3 1/2) minutes in which to vote. Vote promptly and leave the machine to the next elector. Follow the "Vote" arrow.

The following named persons, J. O. Payne, R. T. Freeland, Jake Binyon, H. O. Smith, Roy Freeland and Earl Binyon appeared before the Board protesting the changing of the road, that they travel to and from their ranches, by L. D. Merchant. This road is in L. D. Merchants ranch and has been in use by parties living north of said ranch for years. The Commissioner agree to investigate the matter.

Mr. Leopoldo Pacheco Jr., appears before the Board regarding changing the Arabela Road where same crosses his land and E. H. Latham, agreed to give the County right-of-way easement to the proposed change. Discussed the matter of the County furnishing some powder to shoot off bluff on said road. Also agreed to use his team on making change in road without charge to the County. Agreed to by Commissioners, and Mr. Pacheco and Latham to execute right-of-way easements to County Commissioners. Roman Sanchez to view the proposed changes and all about the work necessary.

Whereas, it appearing to the Board of County Commissioners that the said Petition was signed by a majority of the owners of real estate residing within the area of the proposed incorporation, who had paid a real estate property tax for the year 1946, and,

Whereas, there was deposited with the Board of County Commissioners, a sufficient sum of money to cover the expenses of a survey and census of the proposed Village of Green Tree, and

Whereas, there is no licensed Surveyor within and for Lincoln County, it was ordered
