SYNOPSIS OF GAME LAWS

The following is the synopsis of the 1909 game and fish laws as follows.

OPEN SEASONS FOR GAME AND FISH

Deer with horns—With gun only; October 15th to November 15th of each year. Limit, one deer to each person.

Wild Turkey—With gun only, November 1st to December 31st of each year. Limit, four in possession at one time.

Grouse—With gun only; October 1st to December 31st of each year. Limit, thirty in possession at one time.

Native or Crested Quail—With gun only; October 1st to December 31st of each year. Limit thirty in possession at one time.

Albuquerque is the leading city of New Mexico and it is just such work as the boosters are doing that made it so. They feel proud of their city and are justified in doing so. No town can expect to develop without the support and efforts of the business men and citizens. It would be a great help to all the towns if they would follow the example of the Albuquerque Boosters. GOVERNMENT EXTENDS WORK WITH WHOLESALE LUMBER PRICE RECORDS TO SOUTHWEST

Albuquerque, N. M., April.—The wholesale lumber price record work for Forest Service District No. 3, including Arizona, Arkansas, New Mexico and Oklahoma, which formerly has been handled by the district headquarters at Denver, has been transferred to the headquarters in this city. Form letters have been sent out to cooperators for the first time and returns up to the present indicate that the work in the Southwest will be put on just as satisfactory a basis as it is in other sections of the United States.

During the past ten months the Forest Service has been compiling a monthly record of wholesale prices of the principal grades of lumber in the leading markets of the country. In making a compilation of a continuous record of the selling prices of lumber the government is filling a distinct gap in the information available upon the lumber industry—a gap which does not exist in any other great industry. In all important fields of business and commerce where raw materials are produced and handled, with the exception of the lumber industry there are detailed statistics upon production, consumption and prices. In almost any leading newspaper there are quoted the current selling prices of live stock, cereal, cotton, and other agricultural products, of pig iron, copper, silver, petroleum, and other mineral products.

The lumber industry, ranking fourth among the industries of the country, has not even had annual statistics of production until the last three years. Up to the present time, neither the producers nor the consumers of lumber could get a very authentic and general statement of the price for which the leading grades have recently sold in the great centers of distribution.

Prices asked for lumber are not compiled by the Forest Service. All that it does is to compile as best it can, through the help of cooperators in every section of the country, a record of what lumber has actually sold for. Several representative wholesalers in each market report to the Service at the end of each month the average high and low prices received by them during the month. These reports are combined in a single statement for each market.

In the selection of grades reported upon and of the firms from which reports are received, every effort is made and caution exercised to get sales that are representative. The cooperators upon whose reports the record is based voluntarily report their actual sales in the same manner that the lumber manufacturers voluntarily report their annual production to the Bureau of the Census and the Forest Service. The manufacturers report their information promptly and accurately and few pieces of cooperative work done by the government are more appreciated by them than this.

The success of the work in other markets of the country is sure to have similar results in the Southwest. Heretofore, reports on wholesale lumber prices have been available for only a few markets of state in this section. Officers of the Forest Service at Albuquerque think that this territory offers an excellent field for the work and with the voluntary cooperation of operators in this district it promises many future benefits to all who take part in it.
