### MUDDLE MAY ARISE OVER GOVERNORSHIP

**Delay of de Baca in Taking Oath of Office and Attempt of McDonald to Remain May Cause Mixup.**

### GOVERNOR-ELECT SAID TO BE SERIOUSLY ILL IN CALIF.

Santa Fe, Dec. 10—A most interesting question has arisen over the governorship which doubtless will be determined by decision of the supreme court. Because of the illness of Governor elect E. C. De Baca, who is now on the Pacific coast and contemplates remaining there for some months, no arrangements are being made here for his inauguration, and it is said that Governor McDonald will continue to discharge the duties of the office until such time as Mr. de Baca shall be able to qualify.

This power Governor McDonald will assume under Article 20, Section 197, of the state constitution, which says: "Every officer, unless removed, shall hold his office until his successor has duly qualified."

But it is understood that the republicans will contest, should de Baca not appear to take the oath of office, that the provision of Article 5, Section 69, of the constitution which says that the terms of all state officers shall be in on the first day of January next after the election, will displace McDonald.

It is intimated that an action will be brought to have the office of governor declared vacant, if de Baca does not come forward and take the oath of office, thus turning the executive power over to Lieutenant Governor Lindsey under provision of the constitution, Article 5, Section 75, which says:

"In case the governor is absent from the state, or is for any reason unable to perform the duties, the lieutenant governor shall act as governor, with all the powers, duties and emoluments of the office until such disability be removed."

"If the court should declare a vacancy, the lieutenant governor would automatically become governor. But, if before such decision was rendered Mr. de Baca should appear and qualify, and after that he should, because of his health, not be able to discharge the duties of the office, Mr. Lindsey would become acting governor during such disability.

The chief questions involved in the matter have to do with legislation and appointments. With de Baca governor he would be expected to veto any political legislation passed by the republican legislature, there not being two-thirds in either house to pass such measure over his veto.

Should Mr. Lindsey become acting governor for even a day, it is not unlikely that he would nominate all of the appointive offices and the members of the

At the special term of the district court held here the latter part of last week the two boys, Birge Smith and Ivory Phillips, who were held in jail in default of \$1,000 bonds each, pleaded guilty before Judge Edward L. Medler, to the charges of burglary, robbery and the killing of a yearling belonging to the Carrizozo Cattle Company, and each received sentences in the state reform school. The sentences were suspended by the court during good behavior and the boys have been released from the custody of the sheriff.

He was a little past thirty-seven years of age and was brought here after his death, the body being embalmed by Ed Kelley, licensed embalmer.

### Powder Explosion Victims Discharged From Hospital

William Brazel and son, Jack, who have been inmates of the Dr. Lucas hospital for the past three weeks were sent to their home Friday of this week. It will be remembered that Mr. Brazel and his son were severely burned in a powder explosion which occurred on the Water Canyon ranch, about eight miles south of Carrizozo, the latter part of November. Immediately after the explosion the Brazels were brought here and placed in the hospital where they have been under careful medical treatment, only being discharged today. Their injuries were of a serious nature and for a while it was feared that the eyesight of either or both father and son would be permanently injured.

### Apportionment for Schools is \$1.75 per Pupil

What is probably the largest quarterly apportionment for school purposes in the history of New Mexico was announced last week by State Superintendent Alvan N. White who gave out the information that every one of the 118,236 pupils will receive \$1.75 each, or \$201,001.20 for all. The apportionment for Lincoln county with her 2,800 school children is \$4,769.00.

### Manuel Analla, of Arabela, Dies at Lincoln

Manuel Analla, of Arabela, died in Lincoln, where he was under medical treatment, Saturday, December 2nd. He had been in bad health for a long time, although a very robust man. He was the Republican nominee for county commissioner from Precinct No. 1, in the recent election. Mr. Analla was a member of one of the oldest native families in the Hondo valley, who have lived there for at least a quarter of a century. He was a man of considerable means and was popular among his people. He was buried at Lincoln.



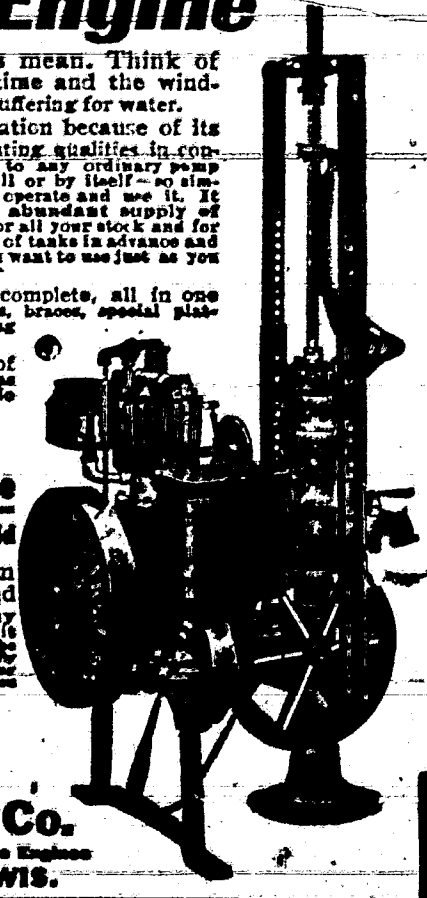
