## NATIONAL BANK IS NOW A CERTAINTY

Charter Approved by Department and Carrizozo is Soon to Have Another Banking Institution.

#### CAPITAL STOCK SUBSCRIBED IS 50 THOUSAND DOLLARS

Carrizozo gets another bank, this time a national bank.

Such is the announcement made this week by E. M. Brickley, of Corona, who has been chosen as cashier of the new institution. Mr. Brickley further states that "The First National Bank of Carrizozo" will be ready of thirty days which he is now for business very shortly. It is serving in the county jail. planned by the new organization to erect a modern building as early as practicable but for the time being a building will be rented in which to house the new and expensive fixtures which they have planned to install, According to amount menty the

new bank's equipment will be of the most modern and substantial throughout, including one of the new Burroughs posting machines ("human" mechanical bookkeeper) which are revolutionizing the clerical work of the bank, doing away with extra bookkeepers and rendering errors impossible.

Ine application for the charter for the First National bank of Carringzo was approved Decemment as the First National Bank of Tucumcari, First National Bank of Santa Rosa, Torrance County Savings Bank, Willard; Roy, and the Stockmen's State Bank, of Corona, New Mexico, with the addition that David T. Beals, assistant cashier of the Inter-State National Bank, of Kansas City, Missouri, one of the heaviest stockholders, will go on the board of directors and his bank will be added to the chain already mentioned. Also a connection will be formed with the National Bank of Commerce, or New York City.

Cashier Brickley further states that practically all the equipment, stationery, etc., has been ordered and the bank will be ready for business very soon. and that the First National Bank of Carrizozo expects to give to the people of Lincoln county all that could be required of an upto-date progressive bank.

## 640 ACRE HOMESTEAD **BILL BECOMES A LAW**

for Enlarged Homesteads in Arid Regions.

President Wilson has signed the Ferris hill opening 640-acre homesteads for stock raising and grazing purposes. It is accounted of great importance to the western states.

The bill authorizes the secretary of the interior to designate the land which will be subject to entry under this bill. It will require some time to do this and those who attempt to make fi'ings under the bill prior to such designation by the secretary must do so at their own risk. The bill provides, however, that leap from the tottering car. settlers may file on lands before the secretary has completed the work of designation. The application must be accompanied by affidavits showing that in the opinion of the entryman the land is of the character-contemplated by the act. In addition to that the entryman must deposit with the land office the regular fees and thereupon the land will be withdrawn from entry until the secretary of the interior shall have an opportunity to determine its character. The entryman, however, will not be permitted to occupy the land until the . secretary has actually designated it as subject to entry.

Any person qualified to make entry under the general homestead laws of the United States may make a stock raising homestead entry. Instead of cultivation, as required by the general homestead laws, the entryman will be required to make permanent improvements upon the land of a value of not less than \$1.25 per acre, and at least one-half of the improvements must be (Continued on Page Three.) | uel Gonzales.

#### OVER HALF BILLION OF COPPER.

The production of copper in the United States in 1916 surpassed all previous records, according to the United States Geological Survey. Preliminary figures and estimates have been collected by B. L. Butler, who has received reports from all plants known to produce blister copper from domestic ores and refined copper. At an average price of about 27 cents a pound the output for 1916 has a value of \$520,000,000, compared with \$242,900,000 for the output for 1915 and with \$189,790,-000 in 1913.

## 64@ACRE HOMESTEAD **BILL BECOMES A LAW**

President Wilson Signs Bill for Enlarged Homesteads in Arid Regions.

(Continued From Front Page.) placed on the land within three

years from the date of entry. The bill provides that settlers who have made filings under the general homestead law and amendments thereto may make lage of Carrizozo on Saturday, additional filing sufficient to give toem 640 acres. However, they must show that the land on whibh they originally filed is of toe same character as the land affected by the 640 bill. In other words, that it is chiefly valuable for grazing and raising forage crops, does not contain mercyantable timber, is not susceptible of irrigation from any known source of water supply, and is of uch character that 640 acres are reasonably required for the support of a family.

The land covered by an additional entry must be within a radius of 20 miles from the settler's first entry, and entrymen is required to file on contiguous areas which may be open to entry prior to filing in not-contiguous land. "

Homesteaders who are living on their original entries are not required to establish residence on their additiodal entries. When they come to prove up it will only be necessary for them to show that they have made the required permadent improvements. In case a homesteader finds he is place which will materially short ever, must be in the same land or 30 feet of dirt while some of office district as the first. Home the cuts will be 35 feet or deepe for 90 days after the secretary of the interior has designated the land subject to entry under the provisions of the bill. In case this preferential right leads to a conflict between homesteaders the secretary is authorized to make a division of the land.




