## Scene of Many Historic Pageants

(Capital News Service)

Washington, D. C., June 14.— Pennsylvania avenue, scene of many history pageants, probably never presented a more colorful picture than it did today as 20,000 Nobles of the Mystic Shrine marched over its two miles of "burning sands" from the capitol to Washington circle.

As the procession passed thru "the Garden of Allah" reproduced in front of the White House, it was reviewed by the president—Noble Warren G. Harding and Imperial Potentate James S. McCandless ("Sunny Jim") and his divan.

This parade, one of four planned for the forty-ninth annual convention of the Shriners, which got under way today, was designed as the big spectacle of the gathering of the Nobles and it proved all of that. The long line of marchers presented a riot of color that for vividness and contrast scarcely could have been surpassed. Only a little less picturesque was the setting, with a canopy of red, yellow and green streamers, the shrine colors—overhead and the national colors blended with these in the decorations of buildings along the route. Each of the scores of temples in the line had the drill team and with the broad expanses of the avenue cleared of all traffic there was ample room for the execution of even the most complicated of formation.

**NOTICE**

To the Sheep Owners of New Mexico: You are hereby notified that a law was enacted by the Sixth Legislature of New Mexico, a copy of which is attached hereto, requiring that the owners of all ear marks recorded in the office of the Sheep Sanitary Board are required to have the same re-recorded in the records of this office within three (3) months from the date of this notice. All ear marks not so re-recorded will, at the expiration of three (3) months, become the property of the public and will be available to the first applicant on the expiration of time required to elapse by this law.

A fee of one dollar is required to accompany the application for re-recording.

Copy of bill is as follows:  
Section 1. The Sheep Sanitary Board of New Mexico shall have the power to and shall cause all marks and brands now in actual use to be re-recorded. For this purpose, the Sheep Sanitary Board shall issue and mail a circular letter through the United States Mail addressed to each owner of any marks and brands now of record with said board, to the postoffice address shown on the brand record, requiring the owner or owners of marks and brands to file with the Secretary of said board an exact facsimile of any mark or marks, brand or brands now being used or owned by such owners. In addition to the above notice the Sheep Sanitary Board shall cause to be published in either English or Spanish, or both, in at least one newspaper in each county in this State where there is a newspaper, a copy of this Act, said publication to continue for at least four (4) consecutive weeks.

Section 2. Within three months from date of the first publication of this Act as aforesaid, it shall be the duty of all owners of marks and brands now of record in the office of the Sheep Sanitary Board, to file with the Secretary of said board, a facsimile of the mark or marks, brand or brands now in actual use and owned by them. A fee for the re-recording of brands shall be one (\$1.00) dollar for each mark or

brand re-recorded, the proceeds to be used for the cost of notice given as provided by Section 1 of this act; provided, that any excess money from such fees shall be placed in the Sheep Sanitary Board fund.

Upon the receipt of the fee to be paid and the facsimile of marks and brands hereinbefore provided for, the Secretary of the said Board shall, as soon as said marks and brands have been re-recorded, mail to the owner or owners of said marks and brands, a certificate for each mark and brand so re-recorded and for which said fee has been paid, showing the date of the re-recording and also showing that the fee herein provided to be paid has been paid. A failure to make such payment shall forfeit the right to use any mark or brand now in use. When the right to use any mark or brand now of record shall have become forfeited for failure to comply with the provisions of this act, the said mark or brand shall not be recorded to any other person or persons until after the expiration of two years from the date of forfeiture; PROVIDED, that this Act shall not apply to those who have in compliance with Chapter 71 of the Laws of 1921 re-recorded their marks and brands, if the marks so re-recorded are the same as those used by them on sheep. Provided, this re-recording of marks and brands shall not be required oftener than once in five (5) years."

We expect to have baptismal  
services at the morning hour.

through the following week.  
This is a part of the work plan-  
ned all over the state. The peo-  
ple of the church and community  
are cordially invited to these  
meetings. The work will be  
conducted in such a way as to  
interest any one.

Last Sunday was a high day  
at Montezuma Baptist Assembly.  
Sec. C. W. Stumph of the State  
Mission Board brought a great  
message at the morning hour, at  
which four surrendered for work  
as preachers and missionaries.  
The state B. Y. P. U. contest  
was announced, Clovis winning  
the pennant with a grade of  
96.58 per cent. Tucumcari was  
a close second with a grade of  
96.18 per cent.

In a great rally Sunday after-  
noon led by Pres. Layton Mad-  
dox, a campaign was launched to  
secure \$50,000 cash for Monte-  
zuma College. More than \$5,000  
of this amount was raised at the  
time, two men giving a thousand  
dollars each. In his ad-  
dress the president said that the  
policy of the college was not to  
have a faculty of little men on  
small salaries, but big men on  
large salaries. At the same time  
he showed that practically all  
the members of the faculty had  
come to Montezuma on much  
smaller salaries than they were  
offered elsewhere. A letter was  
read from the state superintend-  
ent showing that the work of  
the college is recognized as  
standard.
