EDITORIAL COLUMN

"Daily Worker" Against Lindy

National Republic:
One of the few publications in the United States which withholds praise from Lindbergh is the national organ of the Communist Party, the Daily Worker of New York, says the National Republic in its current issue.

It attacks Lindbergh "for lending his name" to commercial aviation, under which, it says the United States is "disguising its war preparations" and adds: "His refusal of the hundreds of thousands of dollars offered by movie magnates was prompted by guarantees from the war mongers."

The Daily Worker calls attention to the fact that "planes manufactured in so-called commercial plants are as useful for dropping bombs upon armies, warships and unarmed populations as planes manufactured under the direction of the United States Army."

Lindbergh, adds the Daily Worker, "is the tool of Wall Street, and every worker should understand his role and refuse to be deceived by the propaganda of our exploiters who want to use us as cannon fodder in order that they may exploit the rest of the world."

In view of the fact that as these lines were written the announcement issued from Russia that a nation-wide movement was in progress to vastly increase the soviet arial fleet, and that further steps in the militarization of the country had been taken, and the further fact that the soviet government and its agents in the United States have sworn the overthrow of the United States government, the animus of this attitude by the Daily Worker.

Some of the Americans will not for the present risk having their families exposed to insult and violence on the other side, small though the risk may be.

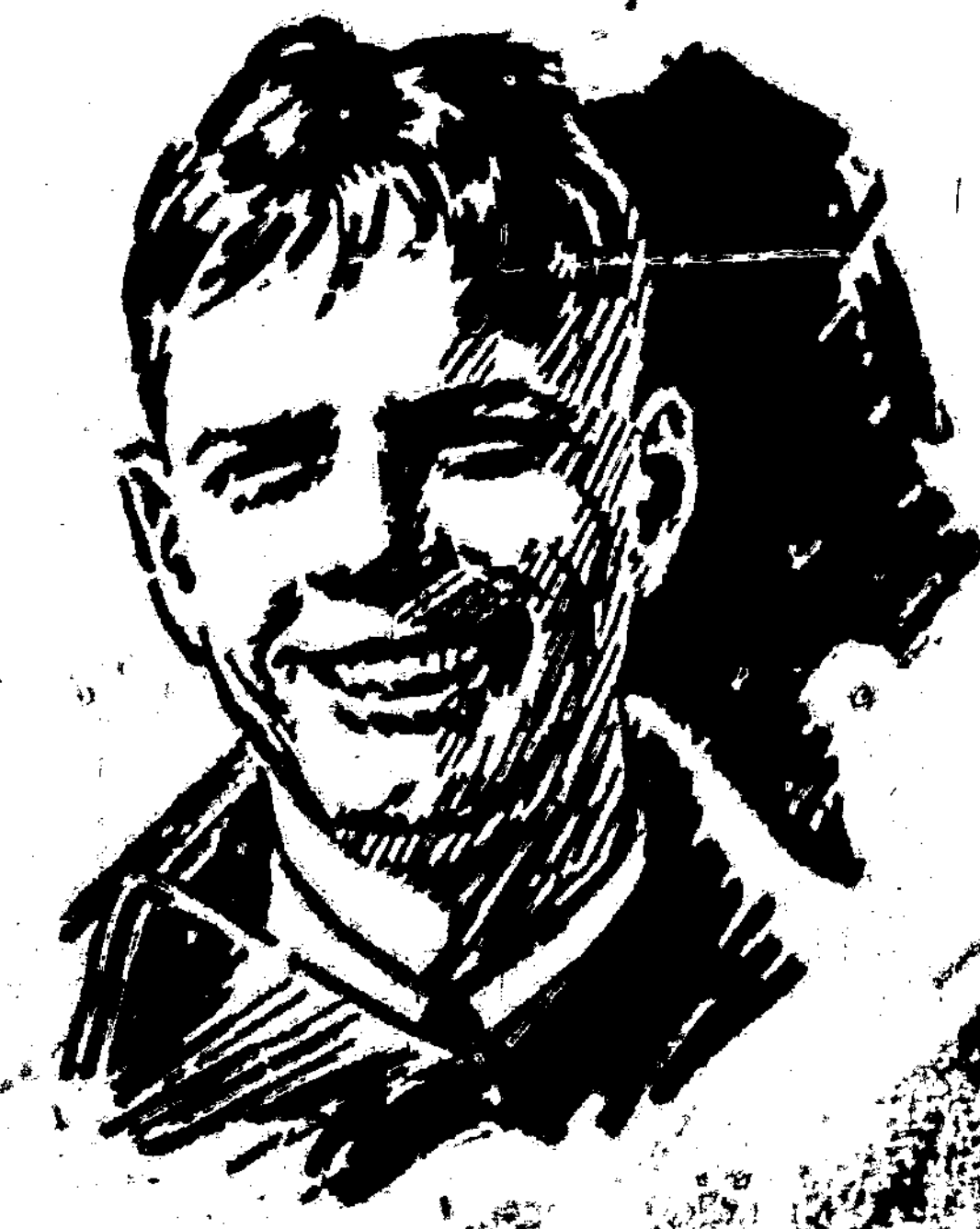

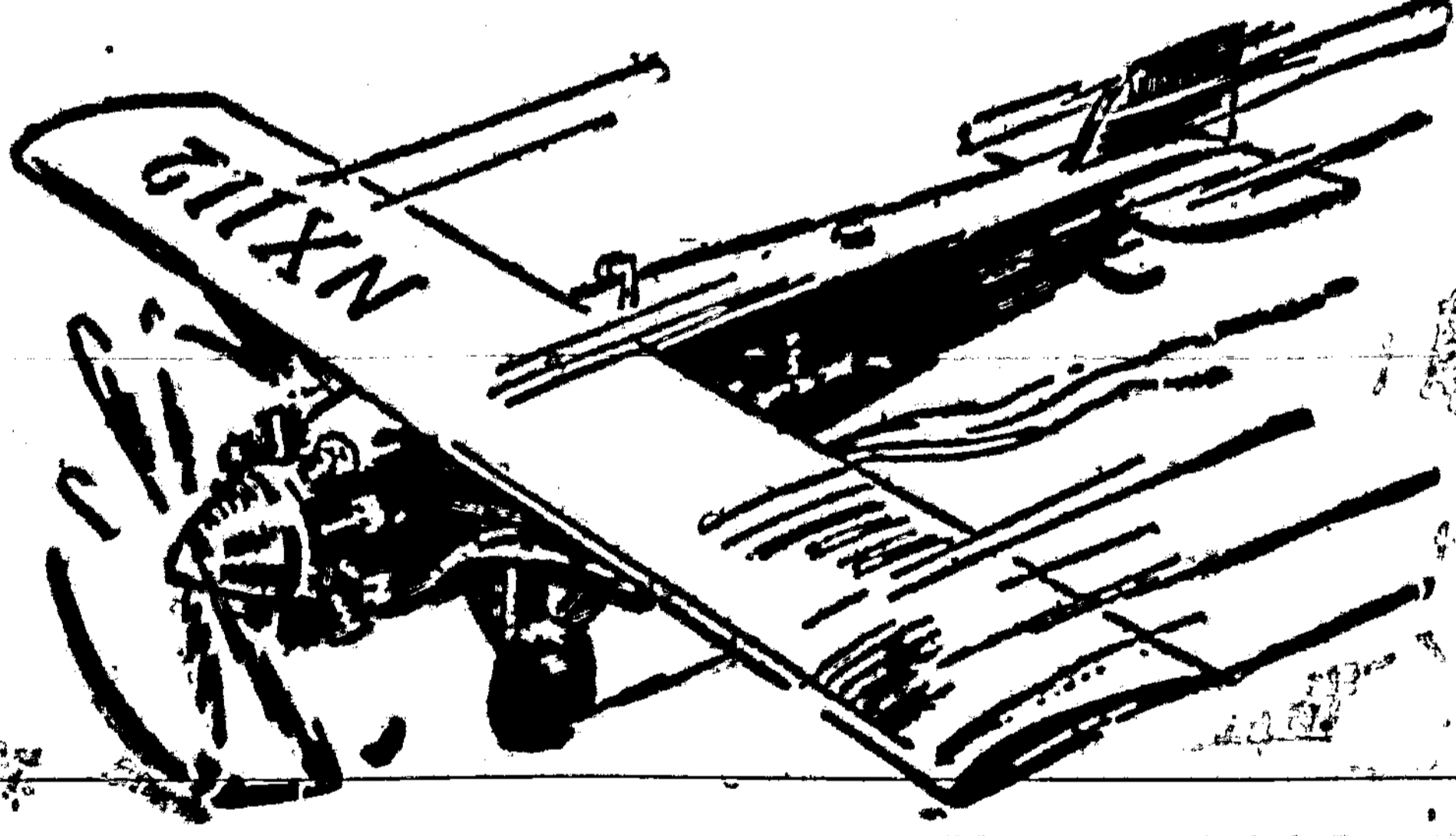

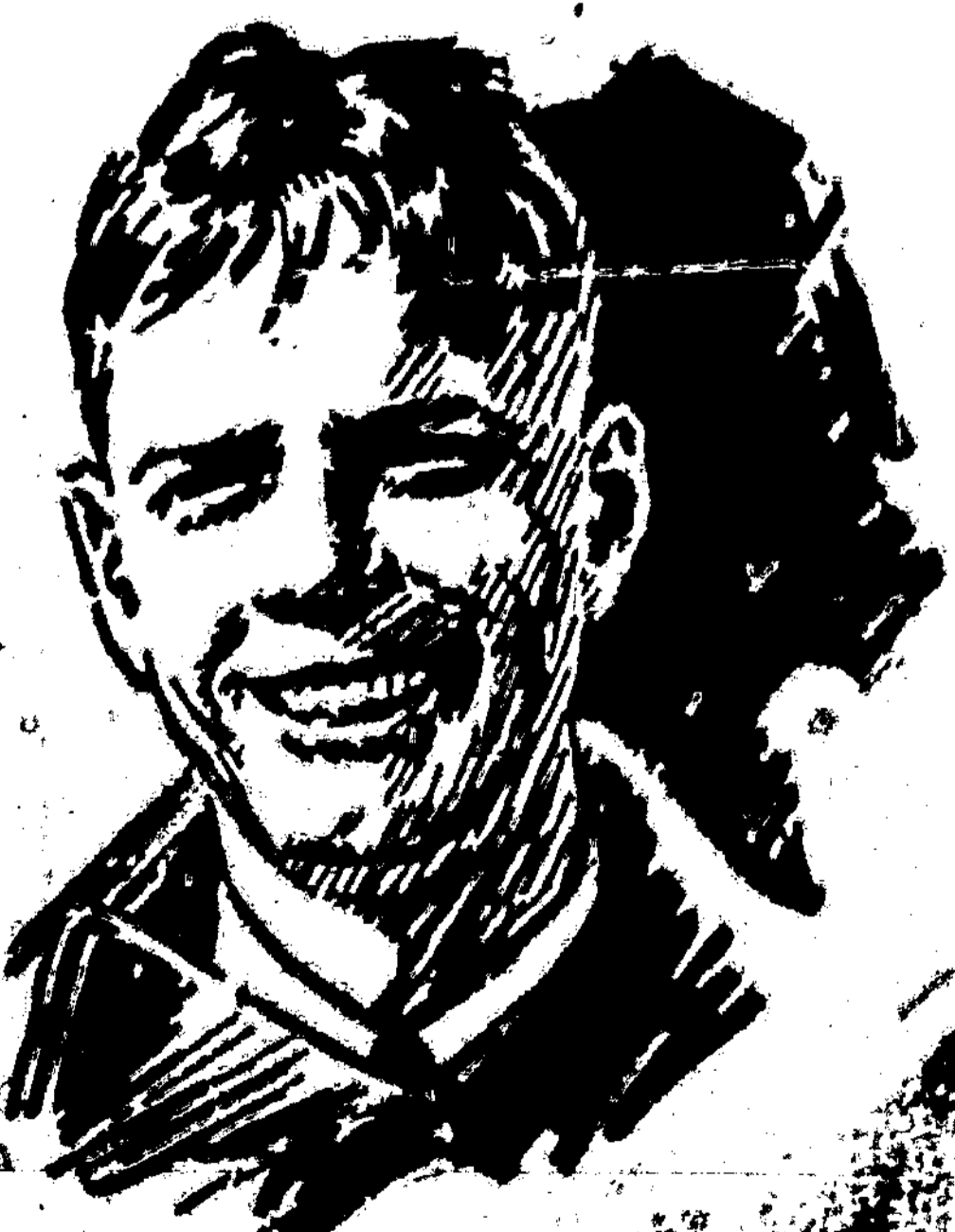
