The railroads of the United States have created the most effective, useful, and by far, the cheapest system of transportation in the world.

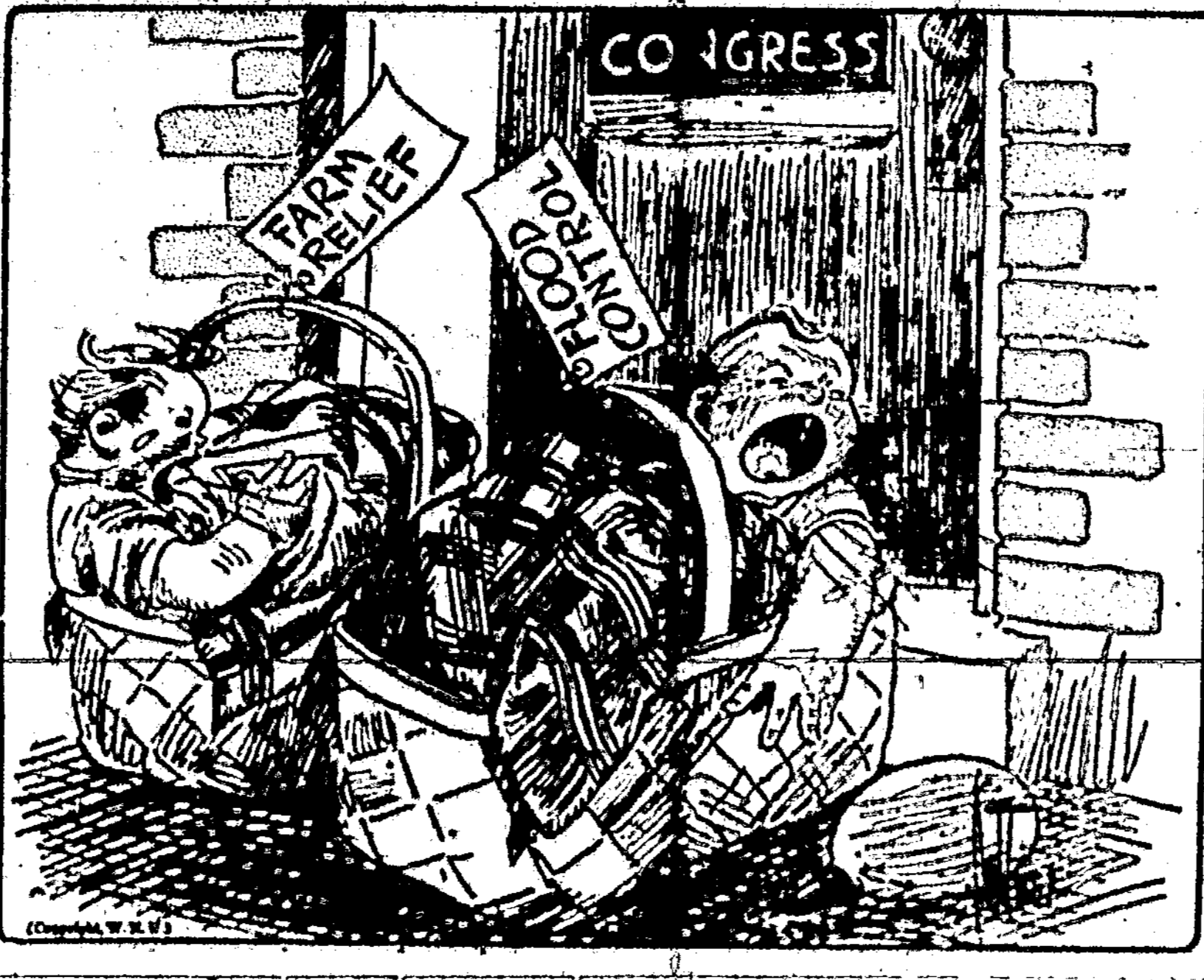

##### Grazing Prohibited on Bonito-Eagle Creek Watershed

Alamogordo, Oct. 11. - Grazing of sheep, goats and hogs will be prohibited on the Bonito-Eagle creek watershed which supplies domestic water to 10 towns and communities between Oscura and Santa Rosa. It was announced by Lincoln Forest officials here.

This action was taken at the request of Southern Pacific officials, their railroad also receiving its water supply at the affected towns from the watershed which covers an area of about 25,000 acres. The forest service also will protect the area against forest fires, the railroad co-operating by employing a fire guard during the dry season and calling out their employes in case of fire.

Officials of the state game protective association and the state game commission are interested in establishing a game refuge there and introducing big game, having recently made a survey of conditions there.
