EDITORIAL COLUMN

Examine the Map

Judging from the word given out by the Democratic Central Committee after the election, one might think, without taking the pains to look over the tabulation of the different counties, that Lincoln had gone Democratic, but on a closer examination we find that only two of the nine offices in the courthouse for the coming term will be held by the Democrats, the other seven, being held by the Republicans.

In times like these, the records should show in the different counties which had contributed to the success of the victorious state ticket, before any political favors could be granted, but it seems that old Lincoln County did not contribute to the state ticket when the records show that all of the state candidates on the Republican ticket received majorities, headed by the candidate for Governor, who received 240, the other majorities ranging down to 100, with the exception of Judge Hudspeth, who received a complimentary majority as a home man and of which he should be justly proud.

In the new administration, as is the custom in political circles, when an application is made for appointment to a State office, the question is always asked: "where was your vote for the State ticket, and how would we have succeeded had other Counties gone the same as yours?"

This question will have to be answered before any political favors can be granted, unless things go differently from what they usually do, as it was in the Democratic National Convention when Bryan was nominated for a second time, Wm. Randolph Hearst, who had done nothing for Bryan before, and came to the Committee on Resolutions for a favor, he was asked: "Where were you in the last National Campaign?"

Struck with the force of the question, he retired from the committee room without protest.

The new Governor will have the tabulation before him when he is ready to make his appointments, and to those who contributed to the victory, will come the rewards, else an injustice will be done those who, by their labor, helped to make said victory possible.

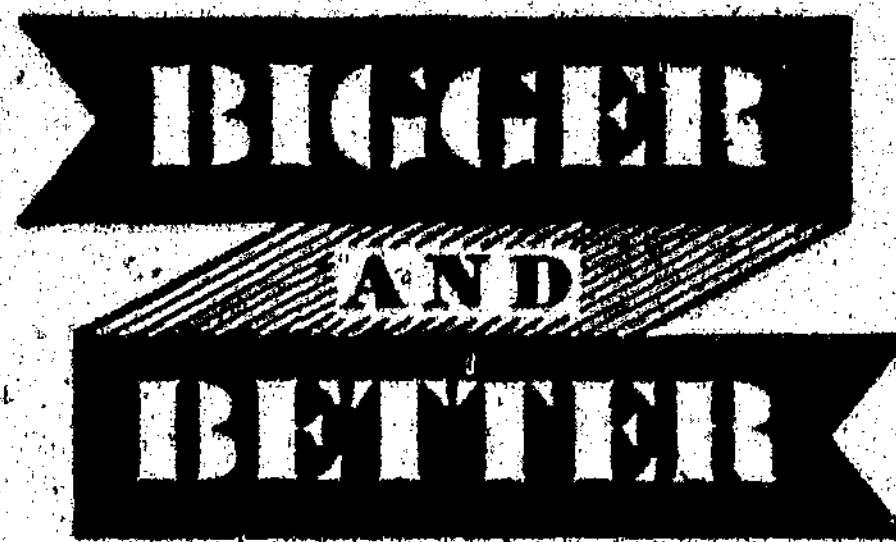

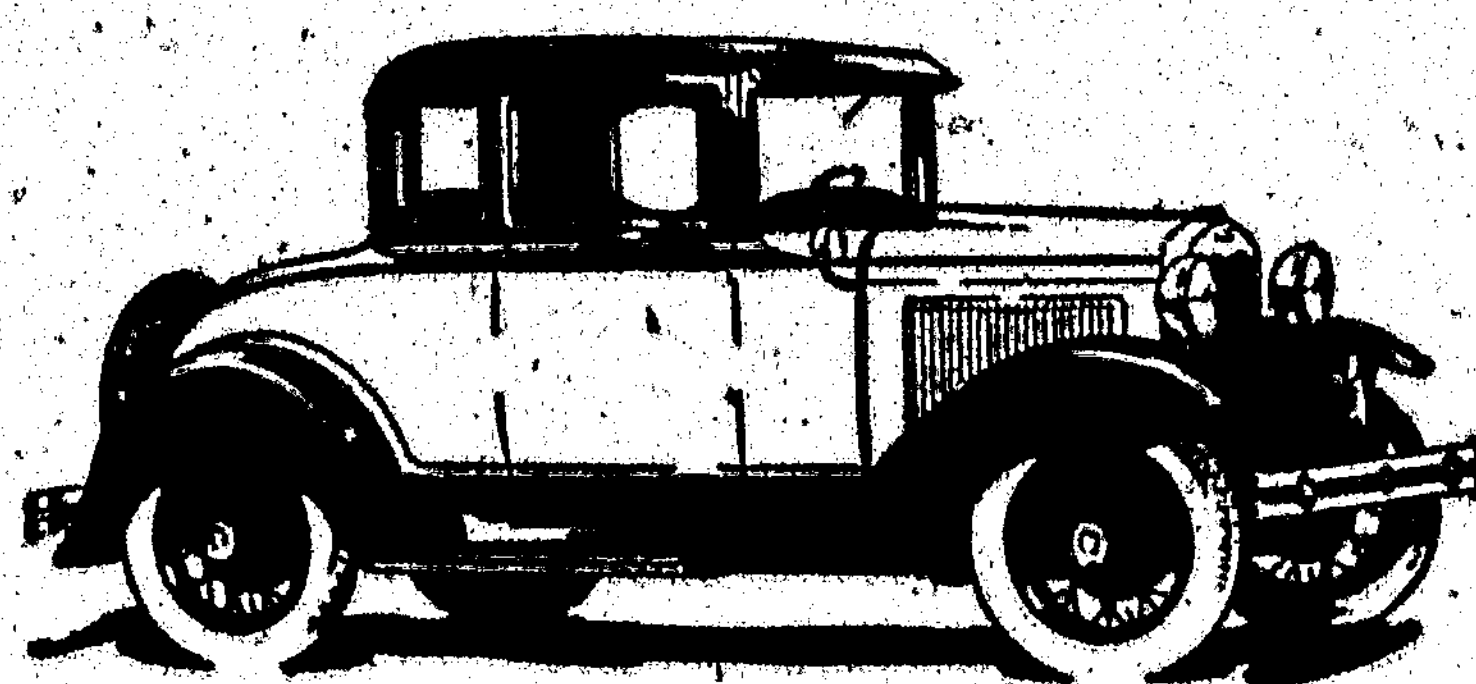

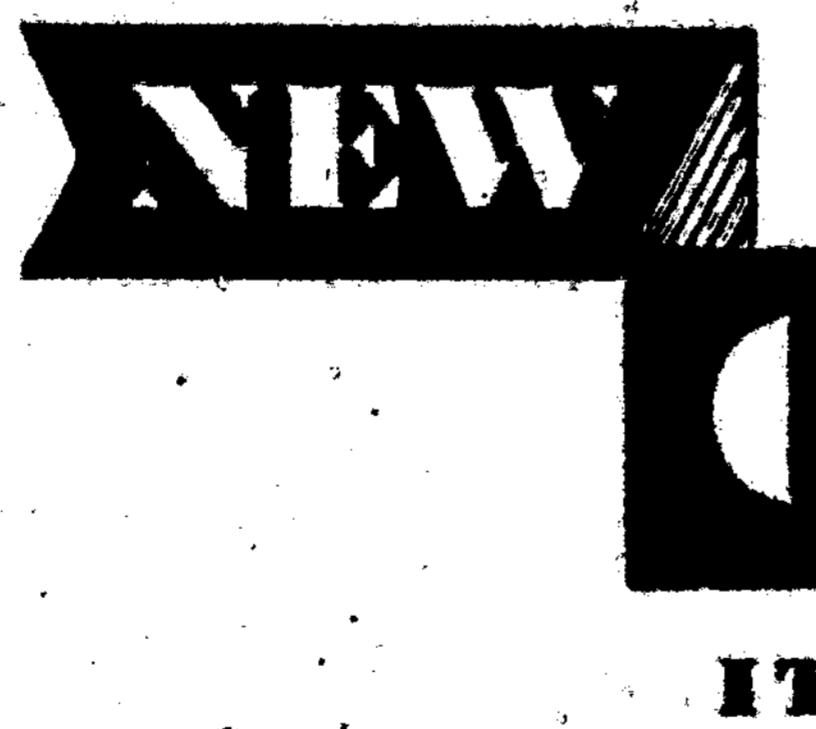

Civil Service Examinations Announced

The U. S. Civil Service Commission has announced open competitive examinations as follows: Medical officer, associate medical officer and assistant medical officer, various branches of the service.

Senior agricultural engineer, \$4,600 to 5,400 a year; agricultural engineer, \$3,800 to 4,600; associate agricultural engineer, \$3,200 to 3,800; Bureau of Public Roads and Bureau of Chemistry and Soils.

Senior patent attorney, \$4,600 a year; office of the Judge Advocate General of the Navy Department. Associate biochemist (animal body fluids), \$3,200 to 3,800; Bureau of Animal Industry. Junior home economics specialist (clothing design), \$2,000 to 2,600; Bureau of Home Economics. Associate pharmacologist, \$3,200 to 3,800; Public Health Service, Washington, D. C.; and Bureau of Biological Survey, for duty in Denver, Colo.

Associate physiologist, agriculture, \$3,200 to 3,800 a year; associate technologist, honey, \$3,200 to 3,800 a year; Bureau of Entomology.

All States, except Maryland, Virginia, Vermont and the District of Columbia have received less than their share of appointments in the apportioned Department Service at Washington, D. C. Application blanks may be obtained from Wm. T. Evans, Secretary of the U. S. Civil Service Board of Examiners at the U. S. Land office, Las Cruces, N. M.
