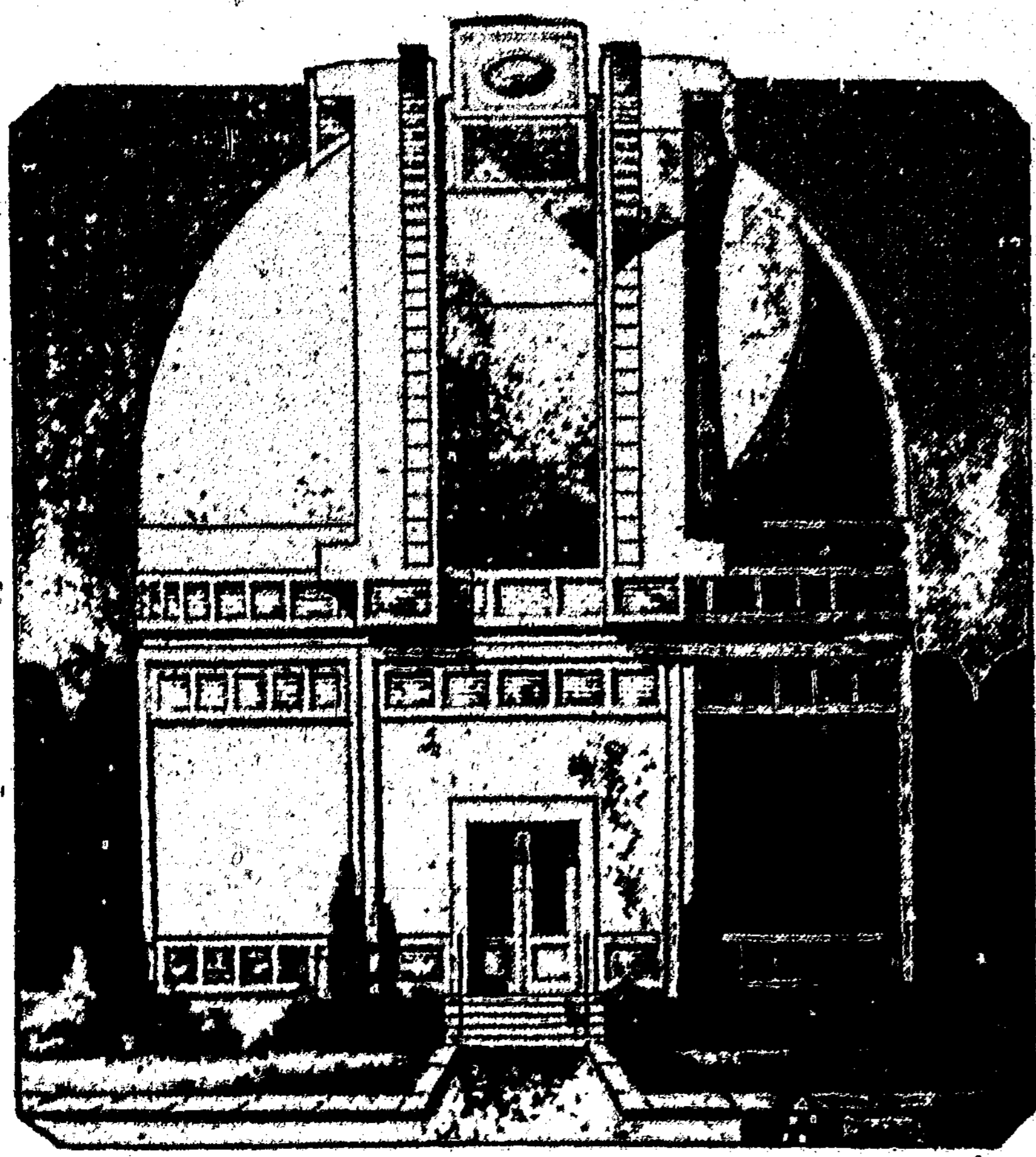

Modern Contract Bridge

No. 16. Responding to No Trump Bids. THE next opponent passes after your partner has opened with one or two no trump, and you have from 1 1/2 to 2 1/2 honor-tricks, look first for a regulation take-out in a biddable five-card suit.

Examples where partner has opened with one no trump which has not been overcalled: Raise to Two No Trumps S-A-Q H-K-54 D-J-108 C-6482

The Forcing Bid of Two

When you find yourself the happy possessor of 5 1/2 honor-tricks, which by the yardstick measurement tell you that there are no more than three defensive tricks outstanding, you are practically assured of game if you can be certain of playing at the best possible contract for your partnership hands.

Requirements for forcing two-bids are: With 5 1/2 HONOR-TRICKS in three suits—you may make an opening two-bid in any biddable four-card, or longer, suit.

With 5 HONOR-TRICKS in three suits—you may make an opening two-bid with a powerful five-card suit with additional outside playing-tricks; with a strong six-card suit; with a two-suiter; or with a practically solid five-card suit.

With 4 1/2 HONOR-TRICKS in three suits—you may make an opening two-bid with a long solid trump suit or a freak two-suiter.

Examples of regulation two-bids with 5 1/2 honor-tricks are: Two Spades S-A-Q92 H-A-K D-A-K4 C-6548

Examples of exceptional two-bids with 4 1/2 honor-tricks: Two Spades S-A-K-Q-J97 H-A-Q D-K-Q43 C-8 Two Diamonds S-A-Q H-none D-A-QJ548 C-A-QJ104

READY FOR GUESTS

THERE are so many dishes which may be prepared the day before, saving the time and nerves of the hostess that one should gather as many of such recipes together for time of need. Here are some suggestions:

Fruit Dessert. To one-half pound of marshmallows cut fine add a can of shredded pineapple, with enough of the juice to moisten well; add to one pint of lemon gelatin and mold in small cups.

Whole Wheat Bread Sandwiches. Cut quarter-inch slices of whole wheat bread and spread with butter. Mix salted peanuts, finely chopped, with cottage cheese and spread as filling.

Fruit Courses. Prepare cantaloupe, removing the seeds and slicing in suitable portions for serving. Serve with quartered lemons, sugar and powdered sugar.

Jellied Tongue. Take a tongue from the glass jar and cut into thin slices. Prepare a jelly by soaking one tablespoonful of gelatin in one-fourth cupful of cold water and adding one cupful of boiling water in which has been dissolved a bouillon cube, salt and pepper to taste.
