**EDITORIAL COLUMN**

**American Bar Association's Stand Against Crime**

The American Bar Association is undertaking a comprehensive survey of the problems of law enforcement, presumably incited to action by the lynchings and other lawlessness that have occurred in several states recently.

It is a subject for unhappy comment that the votaries of our legal system wait for lawless mobs to shock their sensibilities into action. "But 'twere ever thus." It appears to be the way of progress that we lock the stable after the horse is stolen.

Lawlessness has been rampant in the large cities for several years. Gangsters, racketeers, kidnapers and murderers have terrorized these communities.

The American Bar Association is directing its movement not only against lynching and other lawlessness, but is attacking abuses in the administration of the law.

There is plenty of opportunity for public spirited citizens to play their part, not only in developing a workable program, but in executing it after it is set up. —Scottish Rite News Bureau.

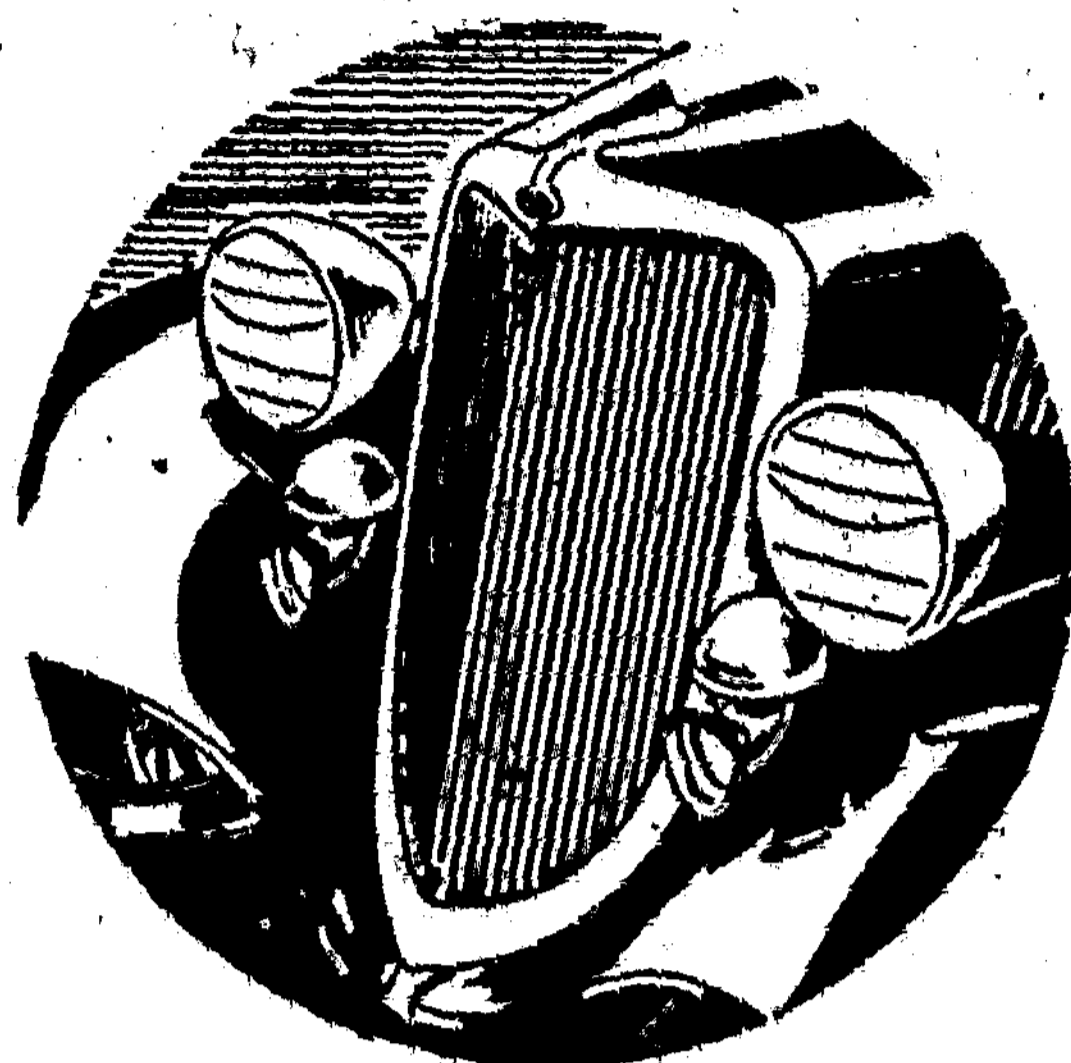

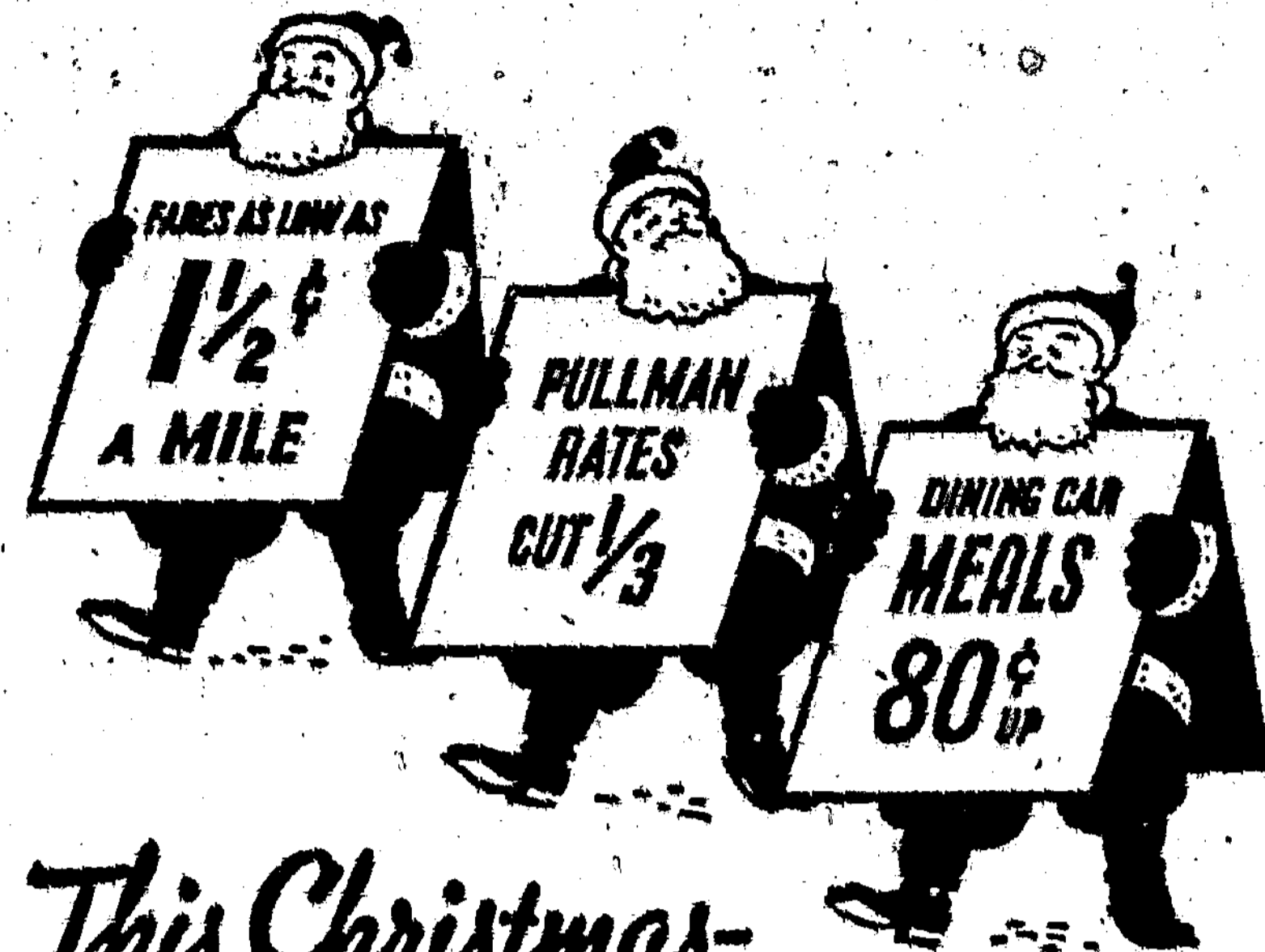

**NEW MEXICO TAXPAYERS' ASSOCIATION SUGGESTS PROGRAM FOR SPECIAL SESSION OF LEGISLATURE**

Santa Fe, N. M., Dec. 20 Thirteen proposals were submitted today to Governor A. W. Hockenull by H. J. Hagerman and Rupert Asplund of the New Mexico Taxpayers' Association, regarding a special session of the legislature and involving taxes and governmental functions. The Governor said there was merit in the list and said he would study them.

The proposals are:

- Repeal the oil and gas severance tax and substitute therefor a severance tax of three per cent of the value of the product and a tax on land surface value and improvements.
- Repeal the chain store tax (the cupation tax) and substitute therefor a selective sales tax on commodities such as tobacco, candy, cosmetics and luxuries.
- Repeal the state income tax law because of the steeply graduated federal income tax.
- Repeal the tax on intangibles and substitute therefor a registration or document tax.
- Suspend all property taxes for roads, and divert the lubricating oil tax to the state road fund.
- Repeal the highway debentures act and confine highway work to revenues accruing to the department and within the state's ability to pay.
- Repeal the state central purchasing agency and provide a supervisor of purchases working

with the state finance board. Repeal the delinquent tax collection law and substitute therefor a measure which will meet the objections of the taxpayers.

Amend the Lano liquor law to make it enforceable and to produce the revenues it should.

Enact a potato production tax along the lines of substitute suggested for oil and gas severance tax.

Have the state legislature pass a resolution turning over 4,000,000 acres of land for national forests and take in lieu therefor the remaining 10,000,000 acres of public domain.

Enact a county salary reduction law effective for those taking office Jan. 1, 1935.

Reorganize the state board of finance to include as one of its executives the state comptroller, and put the auditing work of the comptroller under that head; divorcing the motor vehicle department into its own setup.
