EDITORIAL COLUMN

What a Mess

In bringing to light the withholding money that has been sent to him to pay delinquent taxes, the Albuquerque Journal performed a valuable service to the state of New Mexico. The act not only involves Justice Zinn as the principal actor in the play, but also brings to light J. D. Mell, member of the state tax commission, who by defending Judge Zinn, places himself in a position equally as guilty as the member of the Supreme Bench.

Think of it—a Judge, sitting as one to decide certain measures of interest to the people of a great state — and then being guilty of appropriating money to his own use from a party placing confidence in him, a Supreme Justice, and sending Zinn the money to pay his delinquent taxes. Where shall we go for justice if it is not on the supreme bench? Not alone that, but here comes Mr. Mell, of the state tax commission to defend him.

It is such corruption as this that makes the soil rich for anarchy and communism. We are taking the liberty of clipping a portion of a recent article appearing in the editorial columns of the Albuquerque Journal:

"Mr. Mell's position in the Zinn case is that of a public official who did not take the proper steps to see that delinquent tax payments were paid into the proper channels. And beyond that, in his defense of Mr. Zinn, he placed himself in a position opposed to the interests of the state.

"Mr. Mell has stated in official correspondence, that he was familiar with all the facts in the Zinn case. That being the case, and Mr. Mell being a lawyer, he must have known or should have known, that the money involved was being wrongfully withheld from the proper public channels. Yet he did nothing about it but write a few letters for more than a year and until persistent publicity had forced action through other public channels.

"Public officials who thus allow themselves to be diverted from their sworn duties should not be countenanced. The tax problem is one of the most critical and pressing in the state administration. Neither the commission nor Mr. Mell, in this Zinn case, have shown a regard for public duty that the state demands at this time.

"The governor will be fully justified in demanding the resignation of Mr. Mell and completely reorganizing the state commission."

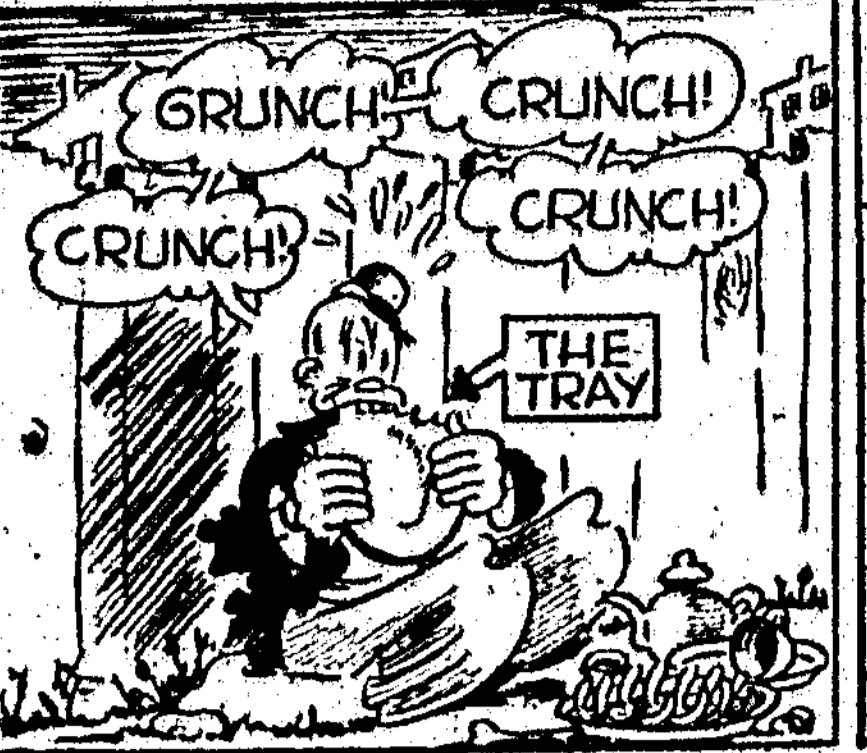

Railroad Consolidation and Efficiency

Third Installment

Railroad men of experience are quite generally agreed that economical and efficient operation becomes more difficult as a railroad system expands beyond the effective control of a single head. It has been well said that "railroading is 95 per cent human." The consolidation of the entire railroad plant of the United States into seven large and impersonal systems would completely submerge any human or personal consideration in the operation of railroads.

Far-sighted and progressive policies of a railroad president may be hampered, delayed or modified by the inherent difficulty of inducing their application by subordinate officials too numerous and remote for control by a single mind. On the other hand, illiberal policies of higher officials may be modified and liberalized by subordinate officials if a closer relationship exists. Far-spread systems make the acquiring and handling of traffic difficult. The particular needs of one section of the country cannot be met because of the conflicting demands of another section served by the railroad system.

In his opinion handed down in 1929 as an Interstate Commerce Commissioner, Joseph B. Eastman, present Coordinator of Transportation, had the following to say: "There are strong grounds for belief that the best results in operating efficiency and service are secured when a railroad system is small enough so that the executive can maintain something like personal contact with the employes all down the line and also with the shippers in the territory served."
