Maybe you've already got a hunch what this story is going to be about. Maybe that mention of Kinsale Head has struck a responsive chord in your memory.

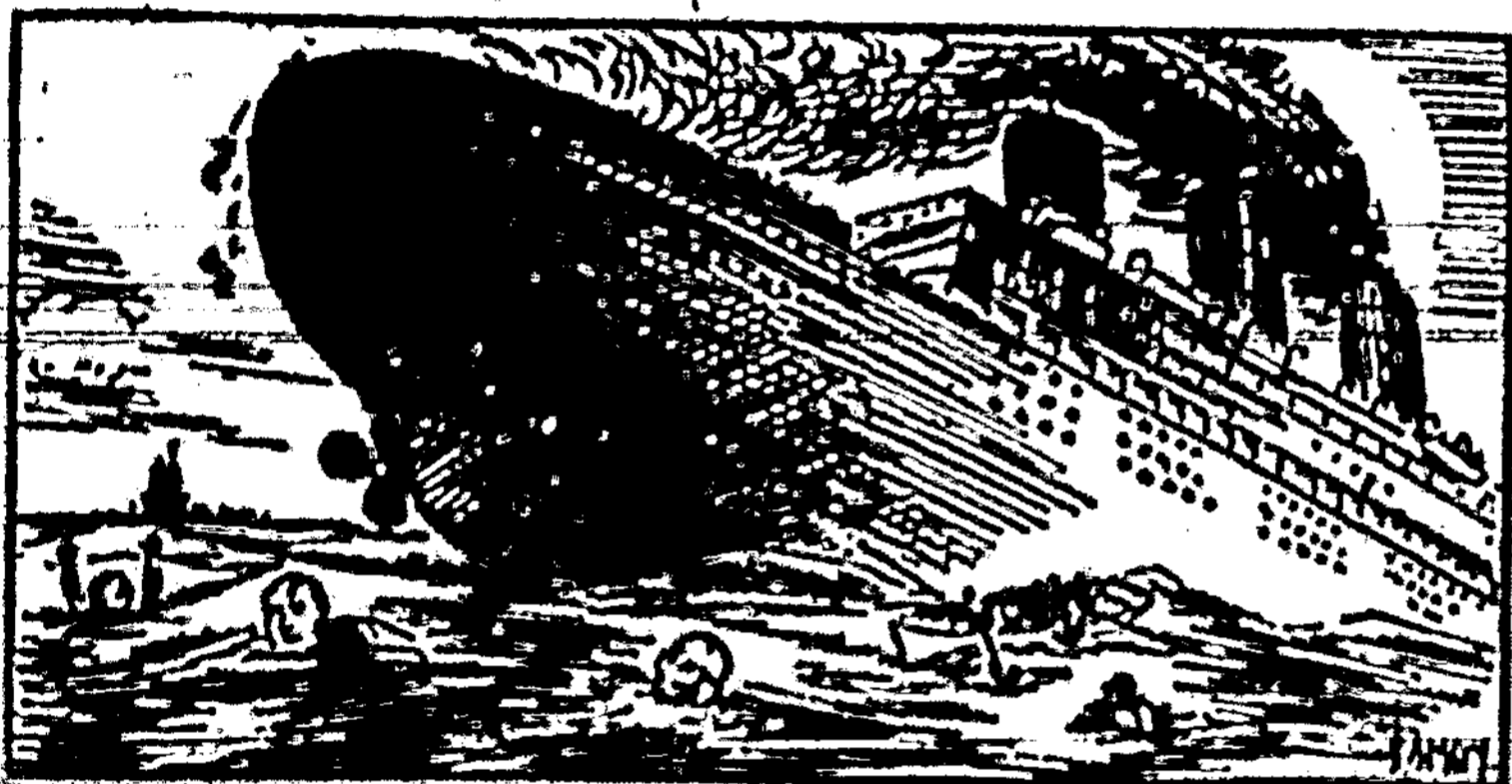
Was Passenger on the Lusitania.

Yes—Pat Hanley was on the Lusitania when a German submarine shot a torpedo into its innards and sent it plunging to the bottom.

Pat Hanley had shaved and come up on deck about 15 minutes before, and he saw it all, right from the first. A panic started immediately. People ran wildly about the ship searching for their friends and children.

Pat found a life preserver and started stripping off his outer clothing. A woman ran into him, and down he went on the slippery deck.

Only five life-boats got clear of the ship with passengers. A sixth got fouled in the davits and the people in it were dumped into the water.

of them seemed to survive that upset. I saw two more boats hurriedly pushed off so that people in the water could cling to them.

Pat arrived safely at the stern of the ship and, with about 40 other men, made ready to jump. "We couldn't take a chance jumping from the side," he says, "for it looked as though the ship might turn over on top of us if we did.

Fishing Trawler Came to Rescue.

By that time an Irish fishing trawler—the first craft to come to the rescue—was just arriving at the scene of disaster. Pat, held up by his life preserver, began swimming toward it.

Less Than 800 Were Saved.

Pat clung for his life to the man next to him. Now the waters were full of other craft steaming—rowing—sailing to the rescue.

But the trawler didn't pick up another load like her first, for the records show that less than 800 people were saved out of a total of nearly 2,000.

The boat that Pat was on landed him in Queenstown at about nine o'clock that night. The next morning he was asked to go down to the Cunard pier, which had been converted into a temporary morgue, to see if he could identify any of the poor souls who had lost their lives.

Pat still has the life preserver he wore when he jumped over the stern of the ill-fated Lusitania—a souvenir of a remarkable adventure.

HEALTH

Second growth tonsils sometimes cause serious trouble, authorities discover.

A PATIENT consulted his physician about a sore throat. The physician informed him that it was his tonsils that were likely causing the symptoms.

The physician made no reply but he knew that the tonsils had not been completely removed at that age or they would not have returned.

they had their tonsils removed in childhood. They admit that they have remnants of tonsils, or tags, still present in the throat, and also that they sometimes have a sore throat but there is such a small piece or pieces of the tonsils left that they could not possibly cause the arthritis or rheumatism.

In speaking of these "secondary" tonsils or tonsil stumps, Dr. Paul H. Browning, New York, in Medical Clinics of North America, states that they are one of the most vicious types of all infected tonsils in producing inflammation in joints and muscles at distant parts of the body.

Infection Often Hidden.

The great amount of scar tissue which resulted from the healing of the partly completed operation for removal, seals or covers the surface of the piece of tonsil left in, and underneath this scar there may be much infection.

The thought then in searching for the cause of arthritis is that not only the cases of inflamed tonsils with frequent sore throats should be investigated but these "second growth" tonsils and tags should be investigated also.

Insidious Nature Of Modern Ills

"The average person is not particularly interested in the fact that cancer may kill him, nor is he seriously concerned with his death. The average person does not think about his health, but he does think about the impression he will make, his social standing, his capabilities, his ability to beat a neighbor at a game, his chances of promotion and his appearance.

Disease Has Changed.

The trouble with the average person and his physician is that neither of them is interested in the other unless some real disease is present. Yet, as Dr. Todd points out, disease today has changed.

Tiredness, fear and despondency are the symptoms of the early stages of disability.

The thought then for the physician is not to spend all his time and energy on those who are already diseased in mind and body (worthy as this may be), but to look more fully or completely into the case of the average person who is restless, discontented and impatient.

The thought for the average person is that life is more than existence and that it may be a physical reason (defects) that is causing the tiredness, restlessness, worry and discontent that a physician or dentist could locate and remove.

WHAT to EAT and WHY

Are Your Children Eating Clean Food? Asks C. Houston Goudiss—Points Out Hazards of Neglected Hand-Washing

"I DO feed my Johnny correctly," a young mother said to me not long ago. "I give him milk and eggs and vegetables and fruits. And still he has colds! Would you mind telling me just how you reconcile that with all this talk about our newer knowledge of nutrition—and how it helps children to have better health?"

"I don't know," I answered. "But I wonder if it would be convenient for me to meet Johnny?"

"Certainly," she replied. "He'll be home from school in a few moments. He usually stops at the school playground for an hour or two, to play dodge ball with the other boys."

A moment or two later Johnny appeared. And a more grimy little lad I had seldom seen, certainly not outside of a neighborhood such as we sometimes describe as underprivileged!

I could not refuse his hand when he put it forth in a gentlemanly gesture, though I noted that some of its visible soil, and doubtless some unseen germs, were transferred to my own hand during the greeting.

No sooner had we clasped hands than a tremendous sneeze all but engulfed Johnny. And in spite of his almost adult manner at meeting a stranger, he had not learned to cover his nose—and mouth during a sneeze.

Contaminated Food

I have pointed out many times that in my opinion, a mother's foremost responsibility is to feed her children a diet that takes into account all the recent amazing discoveries of nutritional science.

But the parent who permits her offspring to eat with unwashed hands and thus take countless germs into his body with every mouthful of food is scarcely giving that food a chance to build the kind of body and brain every mother desires for her child.

Health Linked to Cleanliness

All of us have heard the expression: "Cleanliness is next to Godliness," though to observe some of our school children eating their lunches, one might have reason to believe that both mothers and school boards have forgotten this old copy-book maxim!

We often compare a correct diet to the bricks with which a well-constructed building is erected. But if food represents the bricks with which the edifice of health is built, surely cleanliness is the mortar!

Keeping Everlastingly at It

Most babies are kept clean by their mothers because mothers know that they cannot keep their

elimination; regular hours for meals; and the necessary hours for outdoor play and for sleep.

What About the School?

Mothers must remember—and must emphasize to their children—that diseases may often be traced to unclean hands, and to germs sprayed in the air by persons having coughs and colds.

Teach your children to sniffle every cough and sneeze in a handkerchief. And be sure they have a handkerchief handy for the purpose. Teach them to keep their fingers out of their mouths, like-wise pencils and other objects.

If they are to carry out this last instruction, it is imperative that soap and towels be available in school washrooms, as well as at home. Investigate conditions at the school your child attends.

By teaching cleanliness to your children, by making it a regular part of their training, you will help to safeguard their health and the health of every other child with whom they come in contact in their daily lives.

**Armistice Day 1938**

At the Arc de Triomphe, in Paris, where rises the undying flame. . . .

At the Cenotaph, in London, where black-veiled women weep. . . .

At the Memorial Amphitheatre, in Arlington, where sleeps our Unknown Soldier. . . .

At these and many other shrines sacred to the memory of hero dead, the world pays reverent tribute.

For again we observe Armistice Day this year on its twentieth anniversary. Again we honor the men who died in the hope that they were making the world a happier place in which to live.

To the young this celebration may mean much or little. But to millions of older men it brings each year more poignant emotions. Not only the recollections of war and sturdy comrades who now sleep in honored graves. Not only disappointment because a brave new world which was to rise from the ashes of holocaust failed, somehow, to materialize. But deeper still, a sense of loss and disenchantment, when the high courage and the high idealism that marked those days is compared with the attitude of many of our leaders today.

Then the men in high places preached a united nation pressing onward to great and noble ends. Now too many of them preach a message of group and class hatred.

Then we were told that it was the duty and the privilege of citizens loyally to aid and support their nation. Now, from countless political platforms we hear the reverse—that the people should expect the Nation to support them.

Then men strove for leadership on the basis of what they could do for America. Now too many of them speak only of what they can get for their political supporters.

Undoubtedly these attitudes are temporary. Only the body of the Unknown Soldier in dead and buried. The spirit there suspended is eternal. And if this year's celebration serves to bring that spirit more actively into our National life; if the observance recalls to men, in high place or low, the exaltation that comes with true co-operation by which a noble end—then Armistice Day will again have served its great and patriotic purpose.

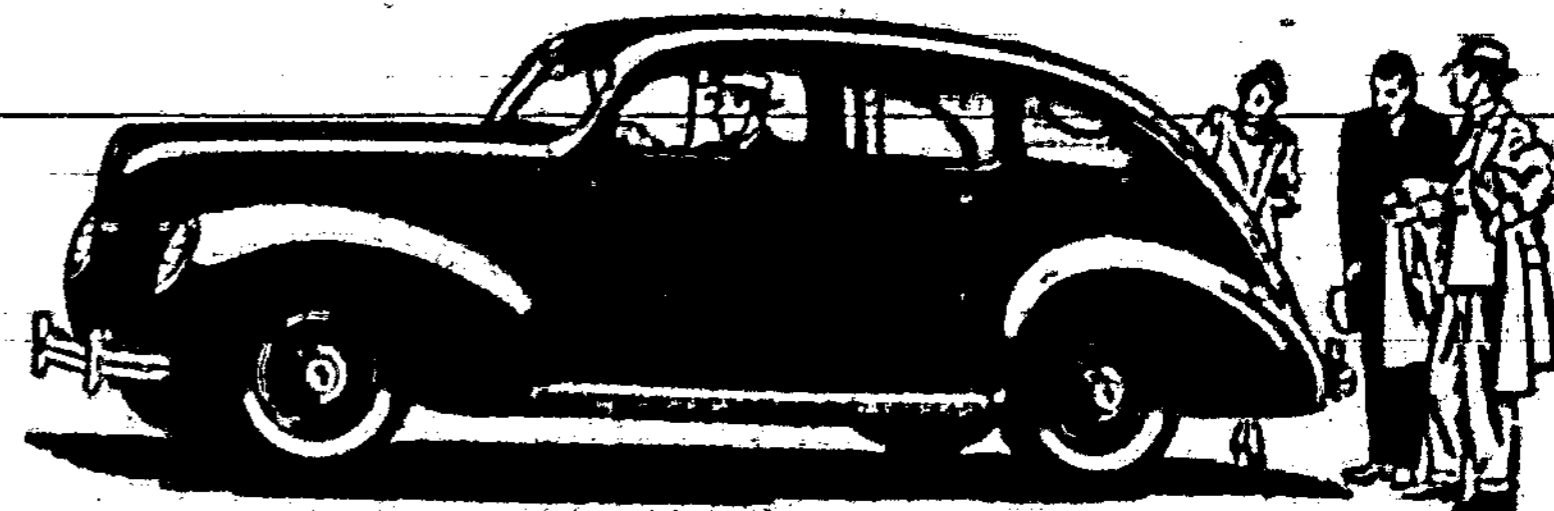

THE SACREDNESS OF HUMAN LIFE Lesson for November 13

The sanctity of human life finds its foundation in the fact that God created man in His own likeness and image.

I. The Prohibition of Murder (Exod. 20:13). The word "kill" in this commandment is one which means a violent and unauthorized taking of life.

II. The Cause of Murder (Matt 5:21, 22). The Sermon on the Mount, team which the rest of our lesson is taken, while it "describes the character of the citizens of the earthly kingdom which the Messiah came to set up" and "assumes a class of people already saved, regenerated, and in fellowship with their King" (James M. Gray), does provide fundamental principles for the guidance of the Christian.

III. The Prevention of Murder (Matt. 5:23-25, 28-32). Prevention with God means more than putting up a barrier to keep us from killing. He deals with the heart, and thus puts the whole life right. It is not even a question of how we may feel against our brother. If he has sinned against us we are to do all we can to win him. He may be untractable, grasping, and unfair. However, the spirit that will win him is not that of retaliation or silent submission to the inevitable, but rather a free and willing going even beyond what is required.

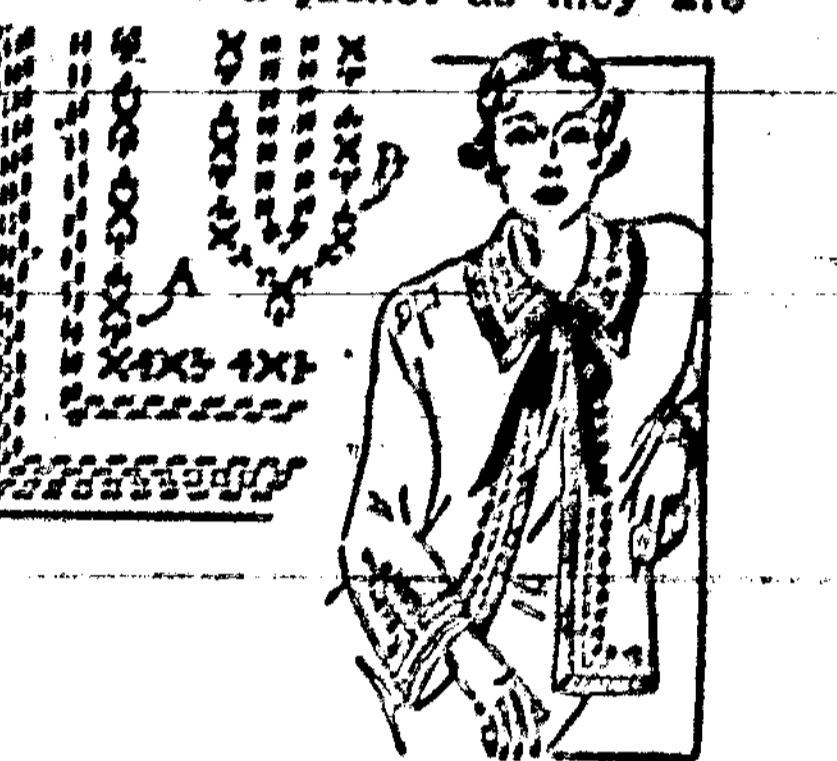

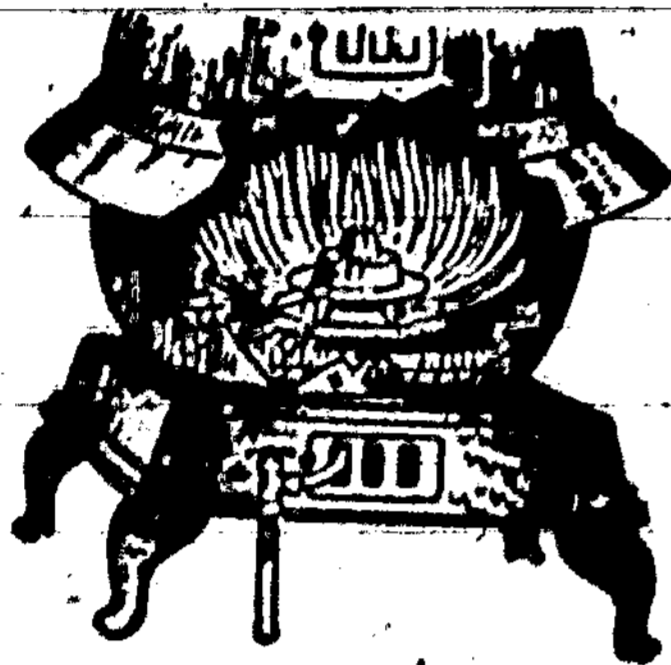

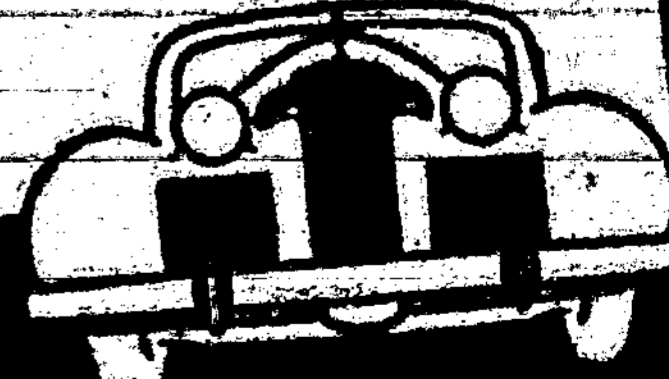
