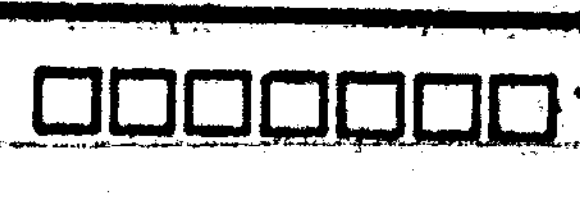

But it is theirs also to preserve for the generations that follow. The future of America is not in the hands of an abstract fate. As always, it is in the hands of youth. It is the responsibility of youth, now and through the years ahead, to keep our nation as bright in opportunity, as gloriously free, as did their forbears in the past.

And as we consider the need to preserve that spirit of freedom, which America above all nations represents, will may an older generation bow in respect to the responsibilities—and the opportunities—which await our young graduates today.

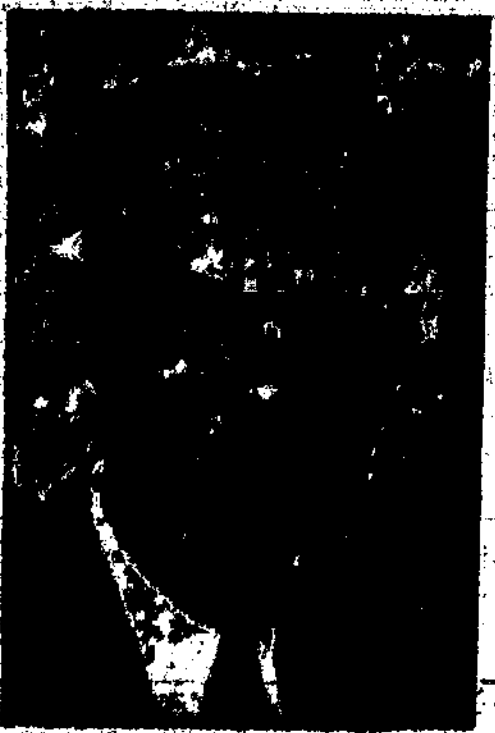
"ORPHANS OF THE STORM"

In several recent utterances, advocates of the various forms of totalitarian government have described their methods as evidence and attributes of strength.

But they are wrong. The surrender of the rights of the common citizen to either one man, as in dictatorship, or one group, as in Communism, indicates precisely the opposite. It is an evidence of national weakness.

The rise of a dictator to unlimited power does not prove that that dictator is strong. It shows that the people who accept his tyranny are weak.

The success of a clique in grasping control of an entire nation does not prove that that clique is able and courageous. It shows that the national character has become feeble and timid.

For both the dictator and the political clique gain power in proportion as the people lose courage, self-reliance and the civic virtues. That's why the new lords of Europe, however they may fascinate the few, can never win the great body of American citizens.

Courage, pride and self-reliance are part of our national heritage. They are the seeds from which grew our Constitution. They constitute the basic elements of our Bill of Rights. They are the qualities which give reality to our boast of "government of the people, by the people, for the people."

And so long as the American people treasure that heritage of strength and courage, neither threats from without, nor persuasions from within, can shake the sure foundations on which rest our precious rights of liberty, opportunity and self-government for all.

Nations are as strong as they are free.
