Paul Revere Rides Again



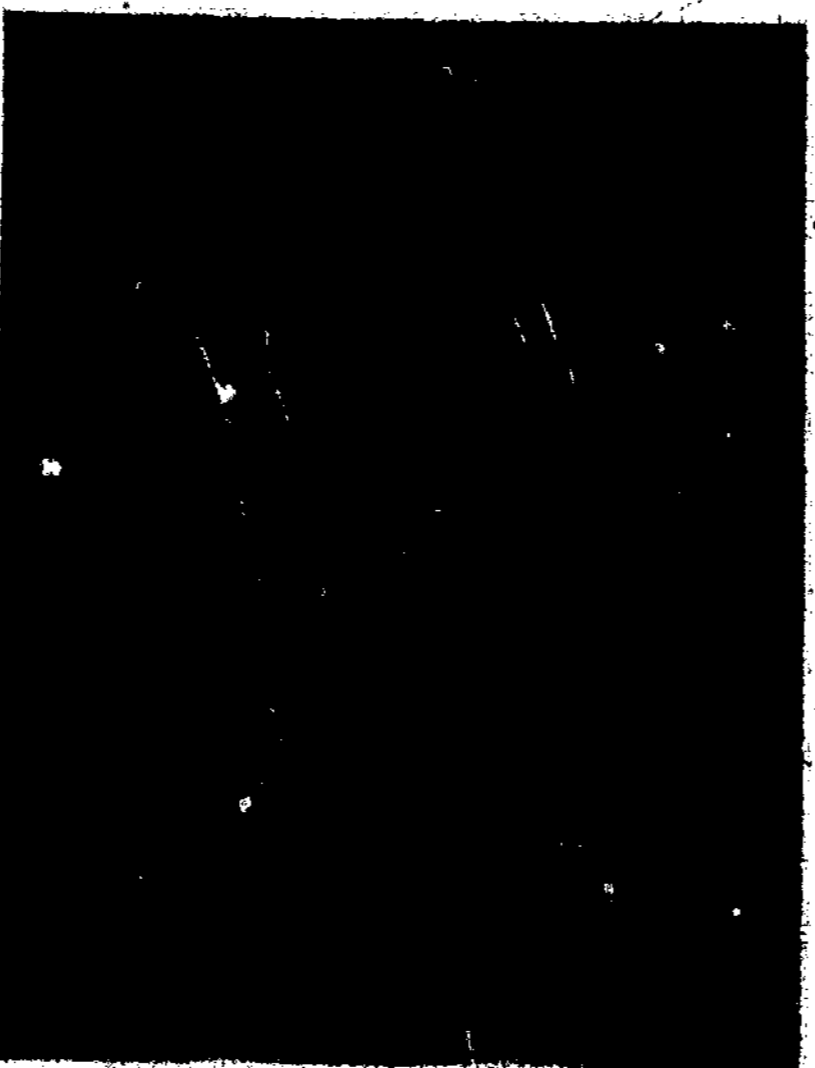

Air Raid Battle Of 46 Elements

Moscow Scientist Lists the High Number of Rare Materials Used.

KUIBYSHEV, RUSSIA.—Scientifically describing an air raid as a battle of 46 elements—more than half of all that Mendeleev listed—the Academician A. E. Fersman, in Moscow News, details the high number of rare materials used in modern warfare.

He counts more than 140 substances in the category of raw materials, headed by steel and metals that make it into armor plate; then the nonferrous metals and minor minerals; then the rarest of metals, such as cesium, used in the membranes of sound detectors; rare earths in igniters of incendiary bombs, mesothorium, whose salts glow at night on instrument boards, and titanium, an ingredient of smoke screens.

As Scientist Sees It. Fersman says that to the scientist the phrase "A Fascist plane was shot down" means that "the most powerful of chemical reactions has been completed and chemical equilibrium restored.

"Imagine the vast quantity of aluminum wrought into the wings and fuselages hurtling through the night," he goes on. "Picture the beryllium, the sheets of mica or special boron glass covering the map before the men at the controls; the thorium and radium compounds emanating the bluish light on the instrument boards and, below, the bombs with detonators of pulsating mercury.

"The sky is lit by a compound of particles of carbon, boron salts and calcium salts burning with a reddish yellow flame on parachute flares and brightening as magnesium and barium fires. The selenium and cesium membranes of the sound detectors pick up sounds, and when the probing fingers of searchlights catch the enemy it is the dazzling reflection of gold and palladium, silver and indium, that makes the duraluminum plane glow. The carbons used in a searchlight are impregnated with the salts of 14 rare earths. Thorium and zirconium salts add intensity, causing it to pierce London fogs.

And There You Are. "Now a raider hurls titanium salts or tin, but flashes of calcium and strontium salts interfere with his action. Brittle steel, antimony and explosives extracted from coal and oil launch a destructive chain of chemical reactions. The plane crashes with an inferno of exploding fuel tanks and highly volatile oil, bombs turn the duraluminum creation of genius into a twisted mass of shapeless oxidized metal."

154 Alerts Sounded For London in 1941

LONDON.—London had 154 air raid alerts during 1941.

During the last 4 1/2 months of 1940 there were more than 400 warnings. Londoners who dove into underground shelters for the duration of each raid spent 300 hours below ground throughout the whole year, as compared with 1,100 hours during the intense raids from August to December, 1940.

August, September and October last year were entirely free from warnings. During December there was one alert. Officials wanted to make sure the sirens were still in working order so they sounded a "two-minute alert."

Crude Rubber 'Mine' Is Found in Ohio Field

NEWARK, OHIO.—To Vernon Johnson goes credit for discovering a rubber "mine" near Newark. Mr. Johnson noticed that the earth had a springy reaction when he walked on it. He scraped away the dirt and found a gummy substance, later analyzed as crude rubber. He took a truckload of it to town and sold it to an Akron rubber dealer. Since then ten tons of rubber have been taken from the field, which is thought to contain 300 to 500 tons. The rubber is believed to have been discarded as "second-grade" by a rubber company years ago.

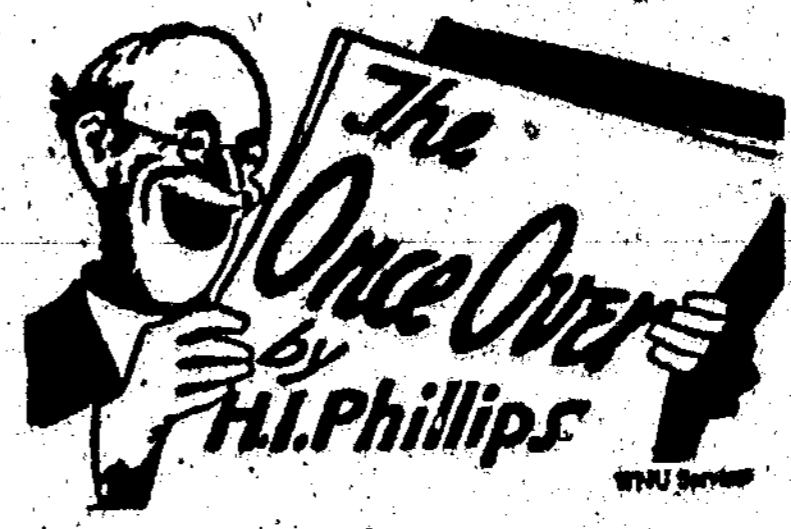
This Bird Is Puzzle to California Truck Driver

Minnesota Farmer Has Wind Machine Hobby

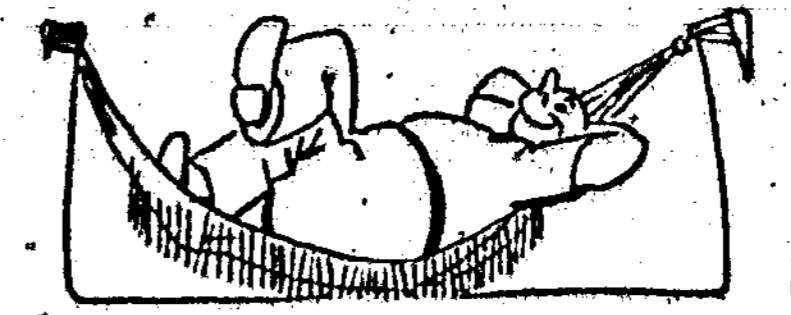

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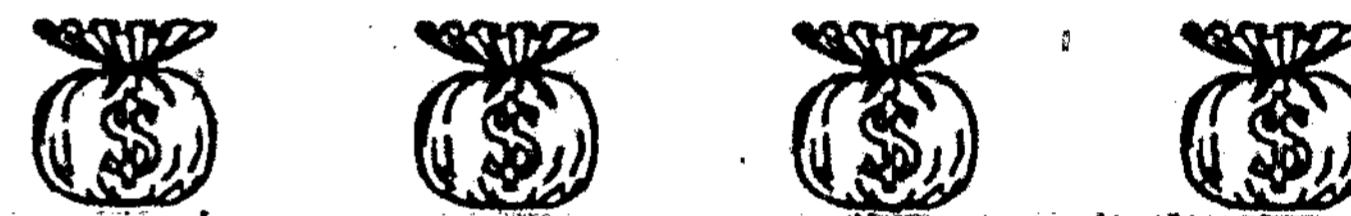

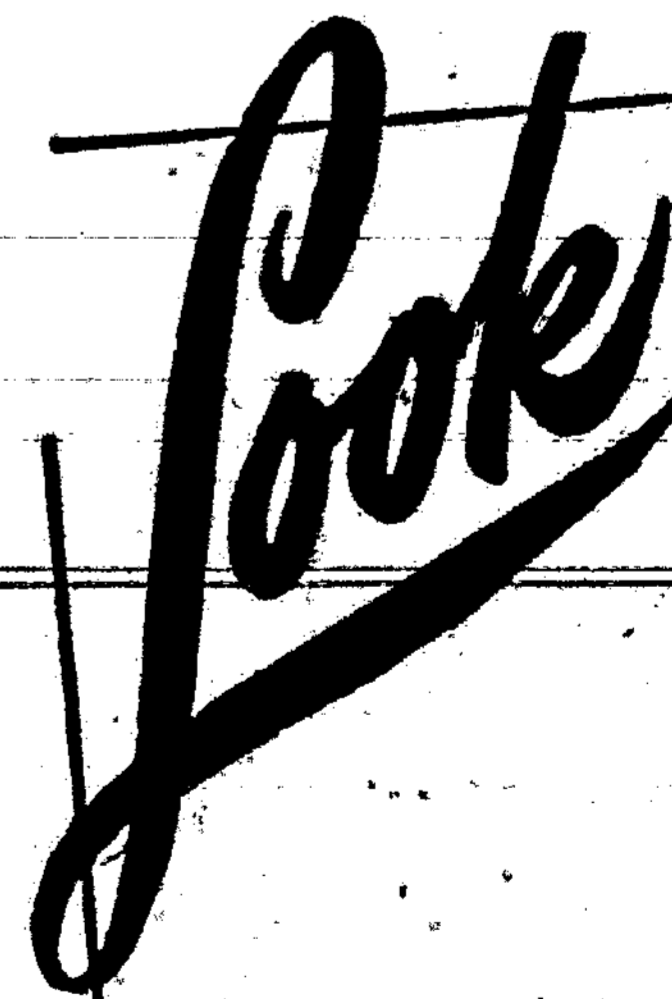


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SCRAP CAMPAIGN

majority of the legal voters as well as a majority of the adult male citizens but Gov. Samuel Ward King and his administration denied this.

It was rejected by the people the next month and in April the Suffrage party held an election, chose Dorr governor and organized a legislature composed entirely of its party members.

Meanwhile the other legislature was holding its sessions in Newport and when Dorr, at the head of 300 men, attempted to seize the state arsenal, Governor King proclaimed martial law and called out the militia.

Dorr returned to Rhode Island and rallied his followers to march on the capital and seize the government by force.

Again Dorr fled from the state, this time with a reward of \$5,000 offered for his arrest. But he remained at large for another year.

The next year, however, Dorr was set free. Eight years later his civil rights were restored but, broken in spirit and embittered by the stigma of "traitor" upon his name, he died in Providence on December 27, 1864.

Dorr was born in Providence on November 8, 1805, the son of a successful manufacturer. He was a student at Phillips academy at Exeter, N. H., and at Harvard college where he was graduated in 1822 with second highest honors.

ABRAM: A PIONEER IN FAITH

LESSON TEXT—Genesis 12:1-9; Hebrews 11:8-12. GOLDEN TEXT—Fear not, Abram; I am thy shield, and thy exceeding great reward.—Genesis 15:1.

Without faith it is impossible to please God (Heb. 11:6). The opposite is also true, namely, that faith always pleases God. As we read the Bible and consider Christian experience, it is evident that God is constantly longing to show Himself strong in behalf of them who believe Him (II Chron. 16:9).

Abraham was not the first man to walk by faith. Before him came such men as Abel, with his acceptable sacrifice; Enoch, with his walk pleasing to God; Noah, who believed and obeyed; and others.

But Abraham was nonetheless a pioneer of faith. He had many other noble characteristics, and was a man of such distinction that his memory is venerated by Jews and Mohammedans as well as Christians. Yet his real claim to an outstanding place in history is that by faith he responded to God's sovereign act in choosing him to begin a new nation, to be His chosen people.

We note two important points about faith:

I. Faith Makes Demands.

In the very nature of things, faith calls for action consistent with belief. "Faith without works is dead" (James 2:20), that is, not a real faith at all. In Abraham's life (and in our life) faith calls for:

1. Separation (Gen. 12:1).

"Get thee out" was God's command to Abraham. To accomplish His divine purpose God had to take him out of the heathendom of his fathers, and start anew. It is His command to His followers today, "Come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord" (II Cor. 6:17).

Who will doubt that this is the crying need of the church today, for instead of the church being in the world seeking to win it to Christ, worldliness has come into the church and devitalized its message.

2. Obedience (Gen. 12:4-6; Heb. 11:8, 9).

"Abram departed, as the Lord had spoken" (v. 4). He didn't know where he was going, but he did know who had called him, and he went. Faith knows God, and obeys Him without hesitation and without reservation.

Obedience is a virtue that needs to be revived, in the home, in school, in society, and especially in our relation to God, for there surely should be no disobedient children in the family of God. He merits and expects obedience.

3. Trust (Gen. 12:7-9; Heb. 11:10).

An assured reliance on the Word of God is a part of faith. God made a promise to Abraham. He accepted it, and worshiped. Here was no questioning, no bargaining, but simple trust in God's word. In fact, there was anticipation of even greater things to come (Heb. 11:10).

We need men of vision and that means we need men who by faith can see the unseen, who can see "a city which hath foundations" even in the midst of destruction and disorder. "In God We Trust" must be more than a motto on our coins if America is to survive.

II. Faith Brings Results.

The world wants to know if a thing works before accepting and approving it. Well, faith really does work! It brings:

1. Blessing (Gen. 12:2, 3).

God is always on the giving hand. "I will bless," was His word to Abraham, not only for Abraham himself and for the great nation of which he was to be the father, but to "all the families of the earth" (v. 3).

How gloriously that promise was fulfilled in the coming of Christ our Redeemer, who also was a "son of Abraham" (Matt. 1:1).

2. Protection (Gen. 12:3).

"I will curse him that curseth thee." That promise to Abraham is still binding and valid. God is not through with Israel. The nations and persons who have vented their hatred upon the children of Abraham need to take notice.

We need to be reminded that God's protecting care is just as sure over us who bear His name. We too are "safe in Jehovah's keeping," even in what is perhaps the darkest hour in the history of the world. Faith in God brings to us the protection of His almighty hand.

3. Fulfillment of Promise (Heb. 11:11, 12).

The entire promise to Abraham hinged on the birth of a son, something which was, humanly speaking, beyond all possibility. But because Sara, joining Abraham in believing God, "judged him faithful who had promised," it came to pass.

"With God all things are possible" (Matt. 19:26). He delights in doing the impossible in response to the faith of His children. Apart from that fact we might be fearful, yet despondent, but "with God" we say again, "All things are possible."

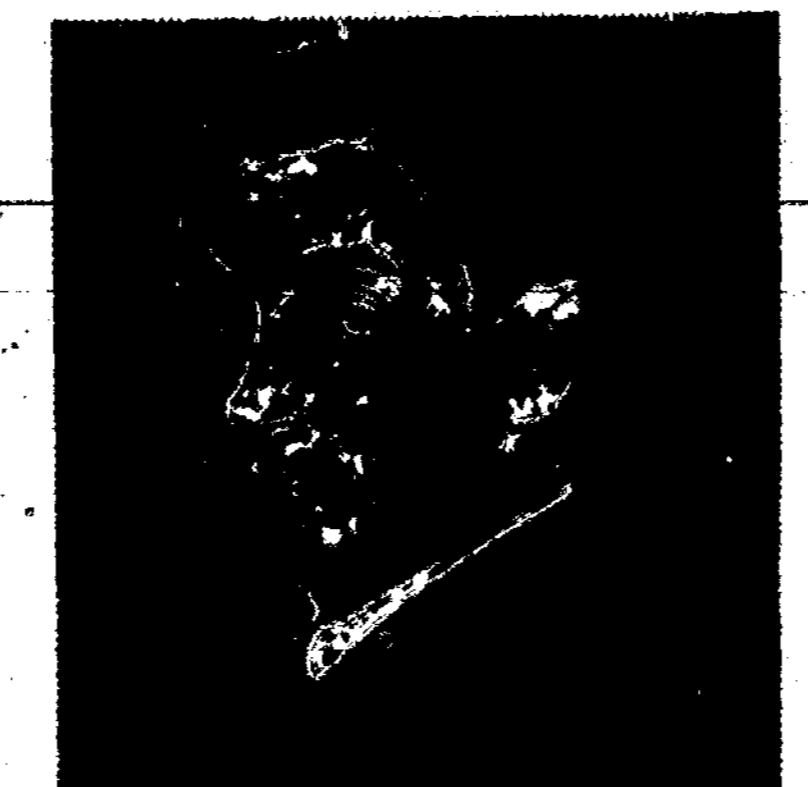
Star Dust STAGE-SCREEN-RADIO

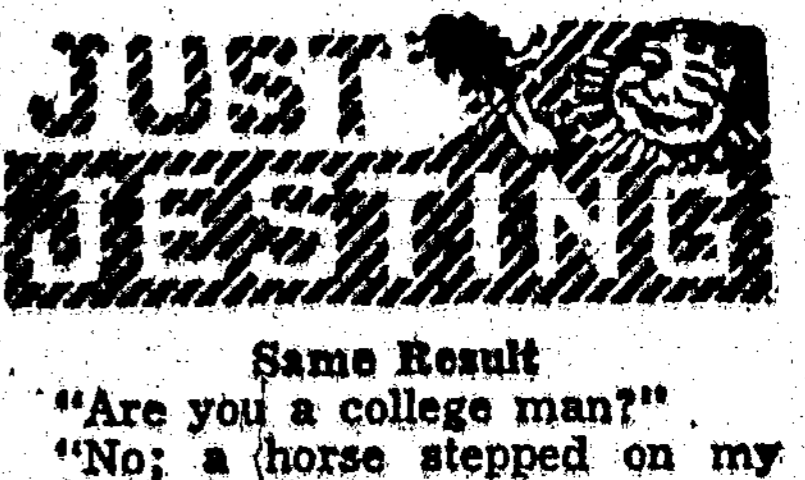

1 1/2 cups prepared biscuit flour  
2 tablespoons sugar  
2 well beaten eggs  
1/2 cup Pet Milk
