## Carrol G. Gunderson and Other Candidates Speak in Carrizozo

A crowd which jammed the Community Hall in Carrizozo Monday night heard Carrol G. Gunderson, Republican Candidate for Governor and other Republican State Candidates including Ben F. Meyer, Mrs. E. A. Persault, George Shipley and R. C. Dillon pledged a cleanup of state affairs after January 1st.

Mr. Gunderson again pledged to build highway 54 from Tularosa to Santa Rosa, and also to

make improvements necessary to highway 880 so that it would be an all-weather road. He severely criticized the Democratic administration for not completing this road during the past 12 years that they have been in power.

The candidates spoke to big crowds at other points in the county during the day making their final addresses at Carrizozo at a night meeting.

## Planless Planners

SCRAP TO JAPS For years the Republicans fought to place an embargo on scrap iron to Japan. On January 3, 1939, Rep. Fred Crawford, (R. Mich.) introduced a bill in Congress to stop the sale of scrap iron, pig iron, and steel scrap to that country. Not until 1941 did the administration stop the sale of scrap. This was too late to prevent the building of the Jap war machine.

In the first 8 years of the New Deal, over 10,000,000 tons of scrap iron went to Japan. This amount would have built 20 battleships of 45,000 tons each; 50 plane carriers of 20,000 tons each; 100 cruisers of 15,000 tons each; 500 submarines of 2,400 tons each; and still leave nearly 5,000,000 tons for planes, tanks, bombs, torpedoes, and bullets.

During the Roosevelt depression we were buying toys, novelties and crockery from the Japanese while American plants remained idle. Our plants could not compete with 25-cents-per-day Jap labor.

THE OLD JUDGE SAYS...



"We can't argue with the Judge on that point, can we Mabel? It's not fair to penalize the many for the actions of the few."  
"That, folks, is exactly what we would be doing in this country if we ever voted for prohibition again. Authorities who have made a careful study of the problem, report that only about 5% of those who drink abuse the privilege occasionally... 95% drink sensibly. Probably doesn't compare with the number of folks who overeat and do other things to excess. Prohibition certainly

isn't the answer. It's not that simple. We had nearly 14 years proof of that, didn't we?"  
"The real answer is education and better control. In fact, the responsible members of the distilling industry are working assiduously toward that end. They don't want anybody to abuse the use of their product any more than the three of us do."  
"If everybody would take that sensible attitude, Judge, and... as more and more are now doing, it'll be a lot better off a lot quicker."
