## The Vast Difference Between United Nations Charter and the League of Nations

(By A. L. Burke)

It was 26 years ago when Pres. Woodrow Wilson presented the League of Nations to the Senate. We remember that on both sides of the proposition it was purely political. We also remember that about four months before the President submitted it to the Senate, Henry Cabot Lodge, chairman elect of the foreign relations committee, had laid before the Senate, a round-robin, of the covenant as it existed and which was never changed, was unacceptable. It was rejected by one-half dozen more votes than were necessary.

President Wilson had made the fight for its acceptance by urging, before he left for Paris, that a Democratic Senate and House of Representatives be elected. What aroused the fighting blood of the Senate was that he said he would "force" get the term? acceptance of the Senate and that action bordering so close on dictatorship, the covenant was defeated—and in that, the Senate showed its teeth.

Now, gentle reader, let us lead you to the difference between the covenant of the league of Nations and the charter of the United Nations. The first

was political; the Charter of the United Nations is purely to the opposite, non-political. In other words and better to be understood, the League of Nations was framed by the Democratic party, while the Charter of the United Nations was framed by the best brains of the world in the interest of peace and not for private political fodder for the Democratic party.

The foregoing shows that dictatorship began with the "force" President Wilson tried to stuff down the shirts of the Senators at that time, but he failed to get away with it. This act on the part of President Wilson, was the first attempt at dictatorship, but has since that time, been too a large extent, improved on. The League of Nations, had it been accepted, would have been through the "force" of dictatorship—the Charter of the United Nations, if signed and accepted, will be a charter made agreeable by the nations of the earth and not by any one decree or by any one man. The United States will be the first of fifty nations to sign the charter, which will, quoting Commander Stassen of Minnesota, be the means of preserving peace among the nations on earth for the next 50 years.

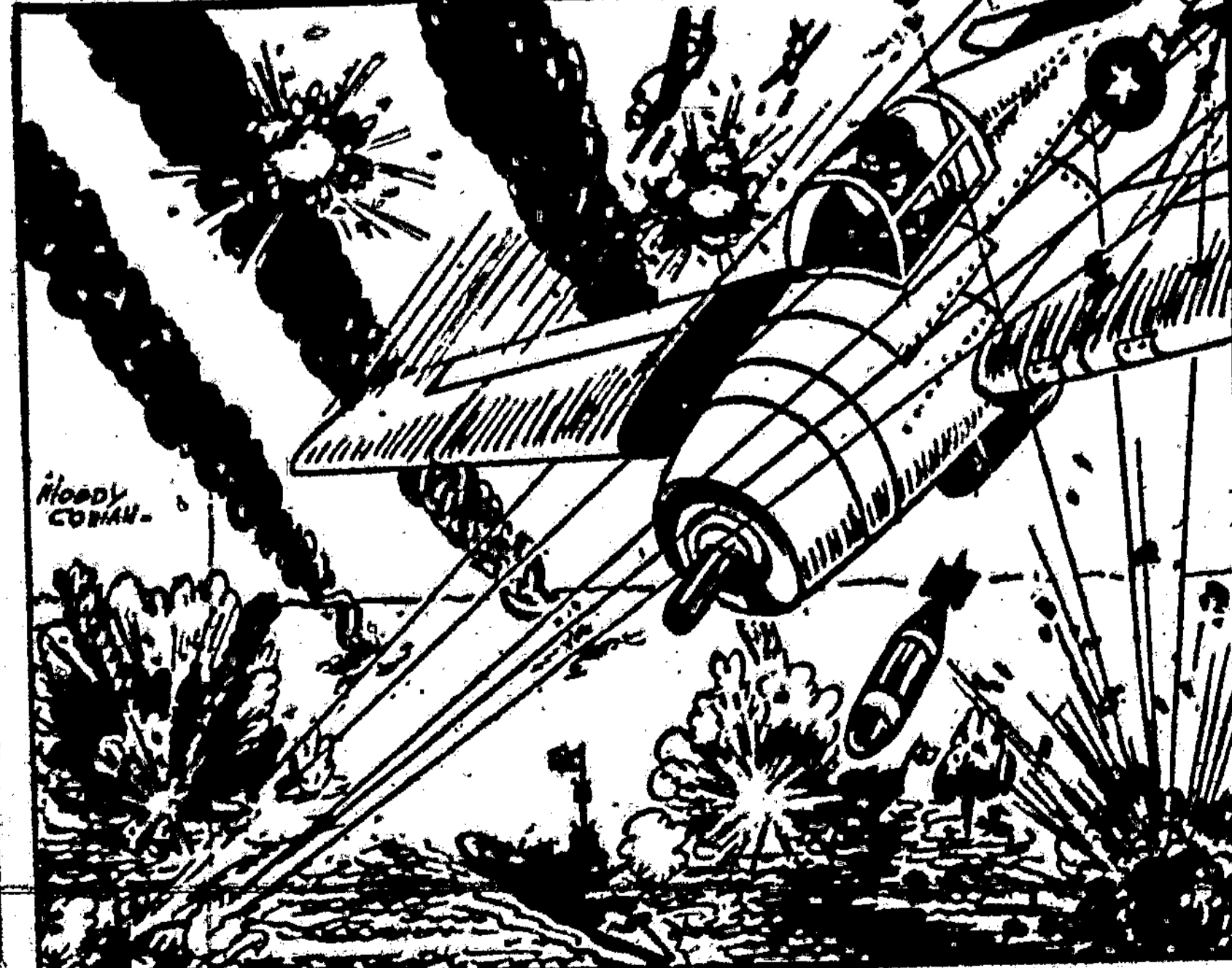
## Nogal Soldier Goes Elephant Hunting

## Your Freedom or Your Shirt

(Industrial News Review)

Pressure from the folks back home has resulted in a new meat program. War Mobilization and Reconversion Director Vinson, in consultation with the OPA, WFA, OES, the Army and the Defense Supplies Corporation, has made recommendations which revolve around increased subsidies, while price ceilings remain untouched.

How long this method of taxing people to pay for their food, can hold the lid on prices which the consumer should rightfully pay to meet the cost of production, remains to be seen. The Senate Agricultural Committee in its report on the meat situation and the government agencies handling the same, finds that the past policy of the agencies which discouraged the feeding of cattle, has contributed to meat shortages and states:

"The way to stimulate the feeder to place cattle on feed . . . until they are finished is to give him a price sufficient . . . to do the job and to earn a reasonable profit."

This nation must soon decide how far it will go with a government "planned economy." You can't long mix it and a free economy—one or the other must eventually give away.

Under a planned economy, we will eventually lose our freedom of action; under free competition we might lose our shirt temporarily, but still have a chance to recover it. Higher subsidies are just another form of inflation via the tax route.

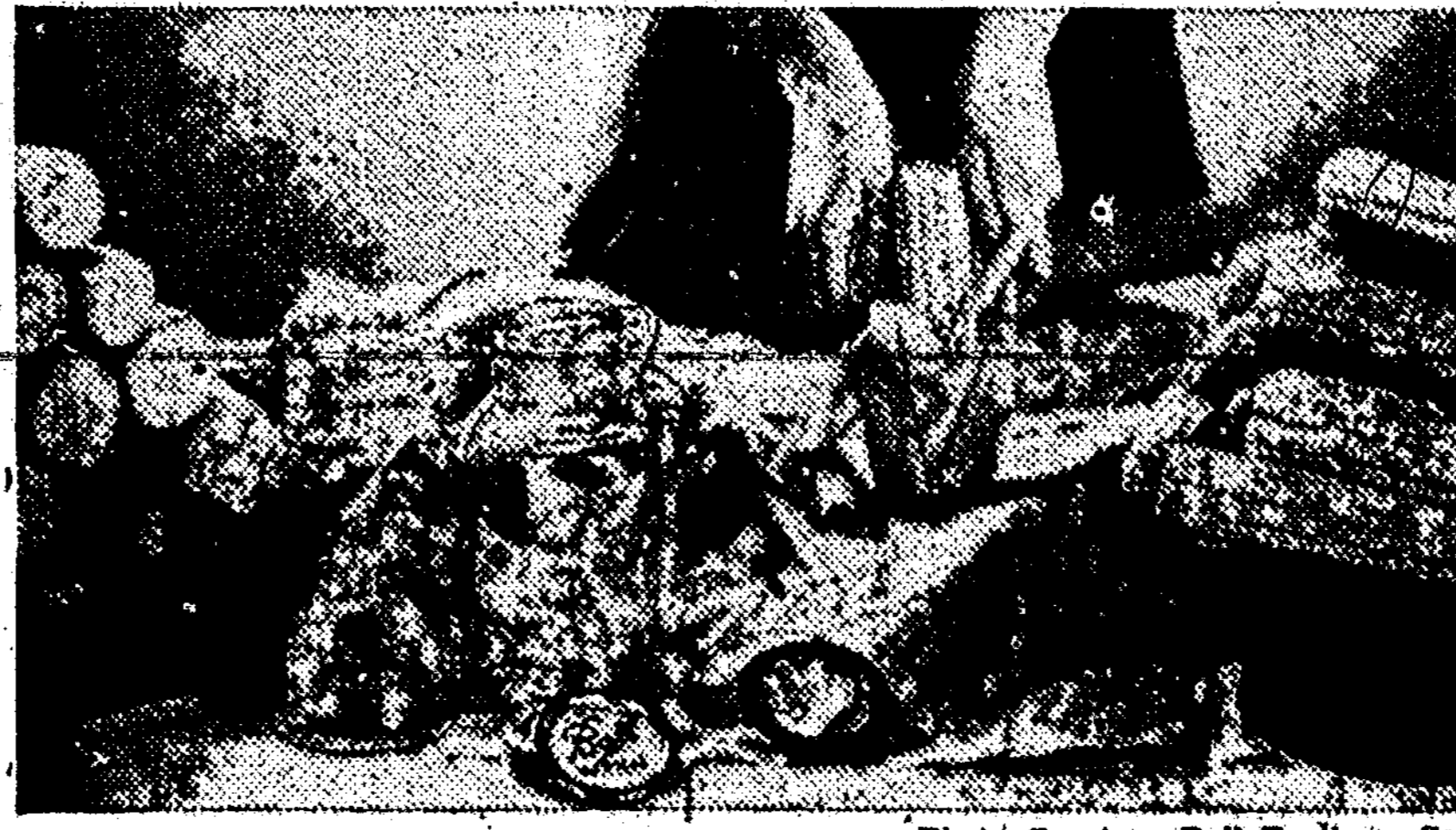

## Can Corn Fresh and a Little At a Time for Good Results

Corn is a stumbling block for many an otherwise successful home canner. For some it spoils; for others it turns brown and has poor flavor.

Gladys Kimbrough, Home Service Director for Ball Brothers Company, glass jar company with headquarters at Muncie, Indiana, considers it far from easy to persuade the general public to adopt practices and procedures which give satisfactory results.

If you have never canned corn but want to this season because of rationing, or if you have tried and failed, you may profit by following Miss Kimbrough's advice. In an informal discussion of the subject she said, "Sweet corn, particularly the deep yellow, is rich in flavor and food value, but field corn cans as well, keeps as well, as the garden varieties and is the preference of many persons who could, if they chose, grow a patch of sweet corn for table use. So, take your choice but don't pay your money unless you know the corn is fresh from the stalk and that it is at the most perfect stage for table use. At this stage the kernels are plump, shiny, and all but bursting with milk-like juice.

### Can Corn Early

As corn matures, the milk gives way to a substance called dough. Then people say the corn is too hard and they say right because it is hard to keep it by canning once it has passed from the full milk to the dough stage.

Bacteria, particularly those which cause flat sour, like warm corn. This is one big reason why it doesn't pay to gather, prepare, and can corn by the "wagon load." Flavor is another good reason for the can-a-little-at-a-time rule. Corn loses its sweetness more rapidly than any other vegetable with the possible exception of green peas. This fact, plus bacteria's special liking for corn which has stood several hours, explains the wisdom of the old slogan, "two hours from garden to canner."

Jars, caps, lids, rubbers, canner and all other utensils needed should be ready for use when the corn is brought in for canning.

It is a waste of time, energy, and food to put anything in a jar which can't be sealed airtight. The smallest nick or crack can cause trouble. Commercial home canners take time to examine the sealing surface of every jar and lid. Jar caps, glass lids and rubbers should be washed in warm soapy water, rinsed, covered with warm water and then boiled. One can't be too clean about canning. Used jars, caps, and lids should be boiled 20 to 30 minutes. New ones need only be brought to boiling and kept hot.

Any jar, cap, lid, and rubber worth using is worth using by the manufacturer's instructions. Such instructions are given on a circular packed with the jars and printed on the cap cartons.

Two sharp knives are needed—one

small, one large. And you will want a cutting board. A well scrubbed plank will do if you have nothing better.

When everything is ready lay an ear of corn on the board, then use the strong knife to cut through husks, corn and cob at each end of the ear. Next, stand the ear upright and use both hands to peel off the husks. If eased along with the thumbs, most of the silks will come off with the husking.

This method may sound troublesome, but after you get the hang of it you will find the work goes faster and with much less muss than when the husking is done in the usual way.

Discard any ear of corn which seems a bit hard. Rinse and drain the corn after it has been freed of silks, then cut—don't saw—the kernels from the cob, taking care not to cut the cob. This is where you need that small sharp knife.

The danger of spoilage is far less when whole kernels are used. Cream style is made by slicing the tips of the kernels and then scraping out the pulp. It is folly to can cream style unless one has a steam pressure cooker with an accurate gauge.

Pint size jars are best for any kind of corn and practically a must for cream style, because heat passes through corn slowly.

It doesn't do to keep corn waiting its turn in the canner. If you happen to have some left over because of faulty judgment in estimating the amount needed to fill the jars, put it in the refrigerator to keep cool until the next batch can go into the canner.

### Adding Water Essential

Be sure to add one and one-quarter cup boiling water to each four cups of whole kernel corn and two cups of boiling water to each four of cream style. The water is needed to help the heat get through the corn in a hurry and to prevent the corn turning brown.

That brown color and overcooked flavor you dislike is caused by caramelization of the corn sugar. This doesn't happen when the corn is young and juicy, enough water is used, and the processing done at the right temperature.

Most persons like about one-half teaspoon of salt to each pint of corn. A little sugar won't hurt anything, nor will it hurt if you forget the salt. The amount used is too small to help prevent spoilage.

Some persons manage to can corn by processing it three and a half to four hours in a hot-water bath canner but it is far better to use a steam pressure cooker provided it is in the right working order and worked right. That last "right" means follow the manufacturer's instructions.

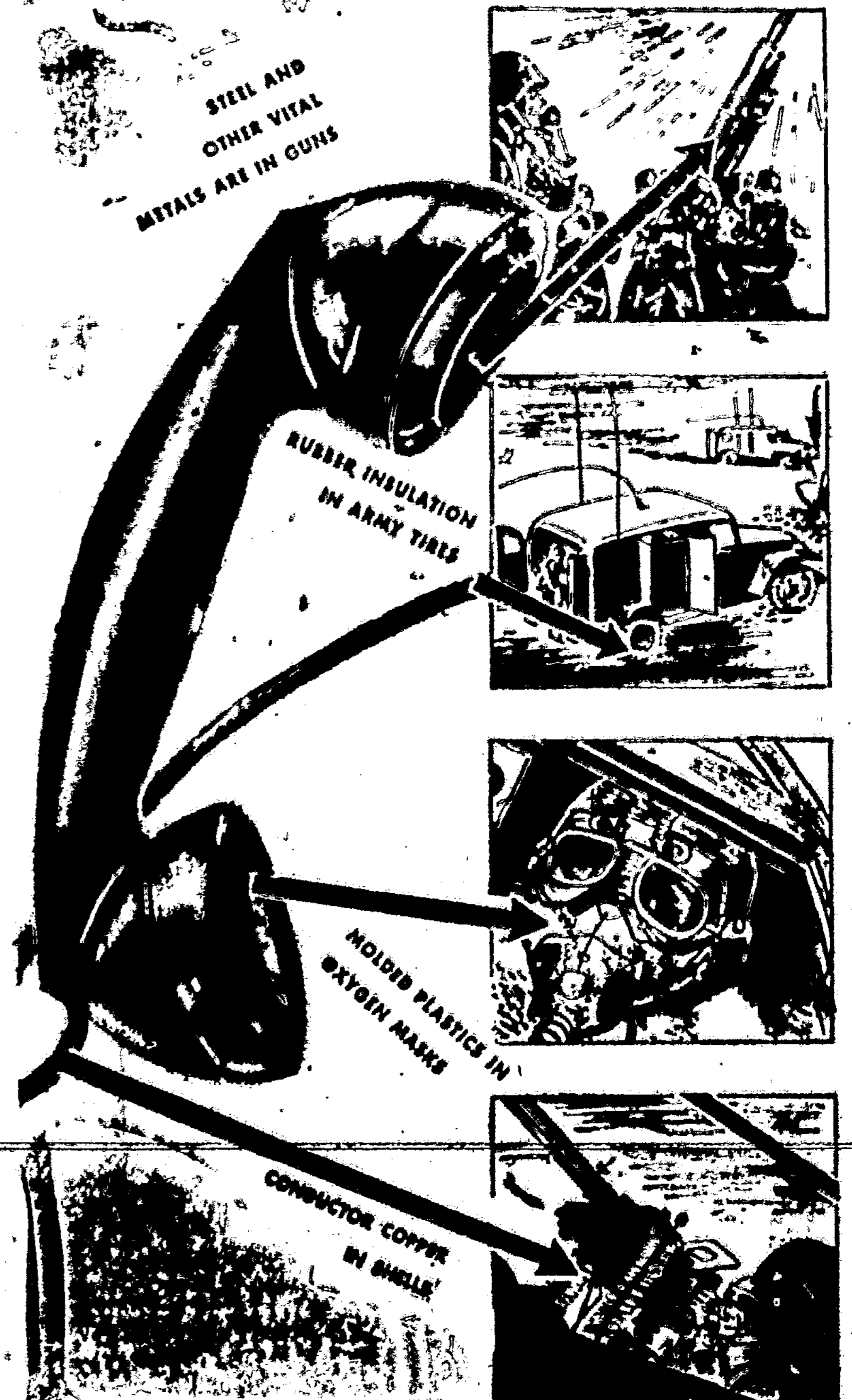

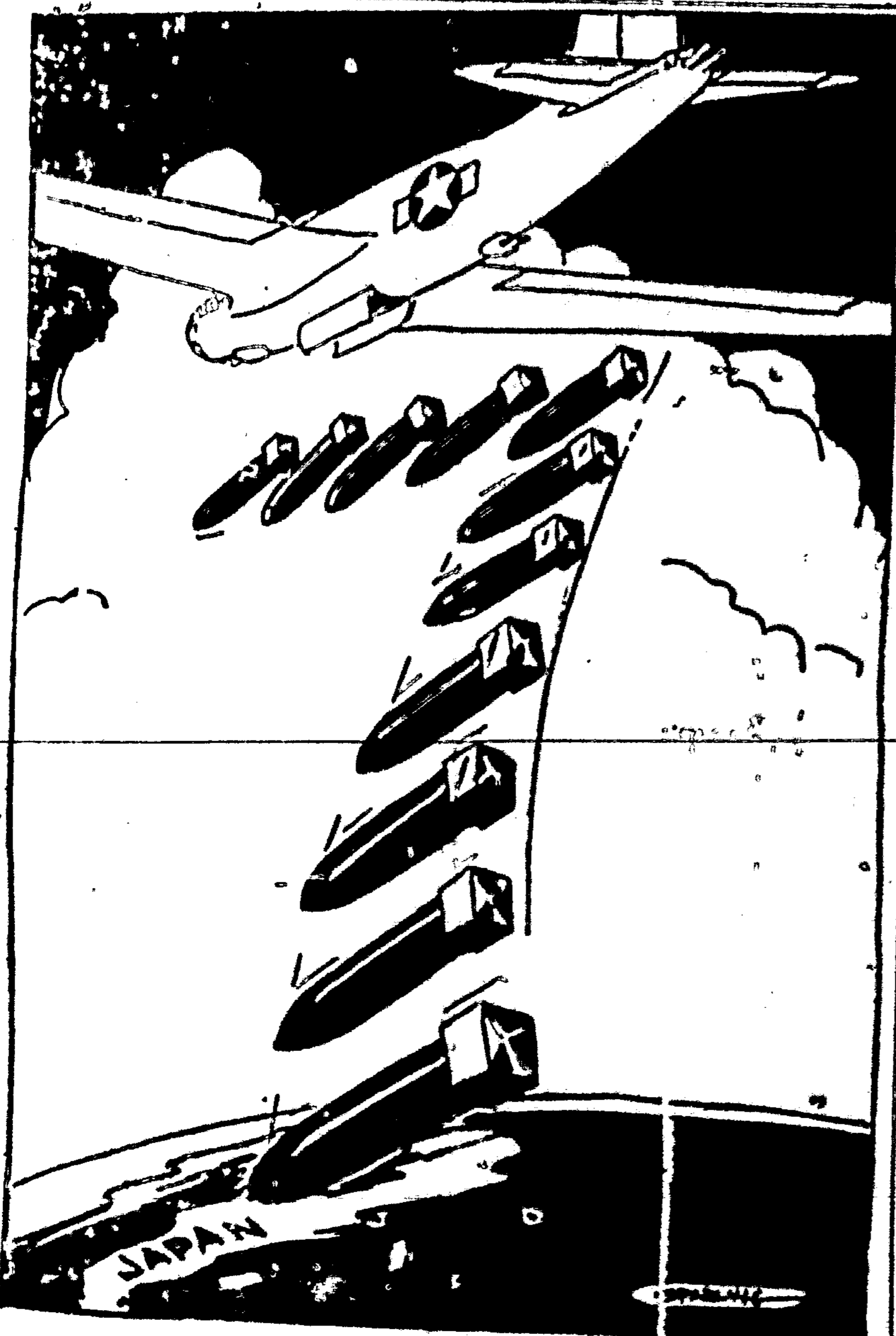
