Jones was enrolled here this week for Keesler Field's 76-day basic airplane and engine mechanics course, having qualified for the Army Air Forces Training Command technical school with outstanding marks on the Army aptitude tests.

He Warns Soviets About U. S. Press

Moscow, August 15.—General Dwight D. Eisenhower left by plane for Leningrad and Berlin today after telling Soviet newsmen the Russians must realize there would be times when some American newspapers would "give you the devil." "In our country there is no censorship of the press," he said "Occasionally there are portions of our press that give me the devil. We should keep our sense values and not be upset by a few crackpots." He added at a press conference that he was convinced the Soviet union and the United States must understand each other if they want to be friends.

Letters May be Sent Prisoners of War

The Red Cross organization has made arrangements to send letters to Americans who have been prisoners of the Japanese, according to a statement made yesterday by Mrs. Clifton Dunn, Home Service Secretary for the local chapter. One letter only may be written each prisoner, and that must be sent by the next of kin. A small photograph may be enclosed with the message. Form letter No. 1616 has been prepared by the government and may be obtained, together with the instructions, from Red Cross headquarters at the Dunn Funeral Home.

The letters must be in Washington, D. C., not later than August 25th.—Tucumcari American.

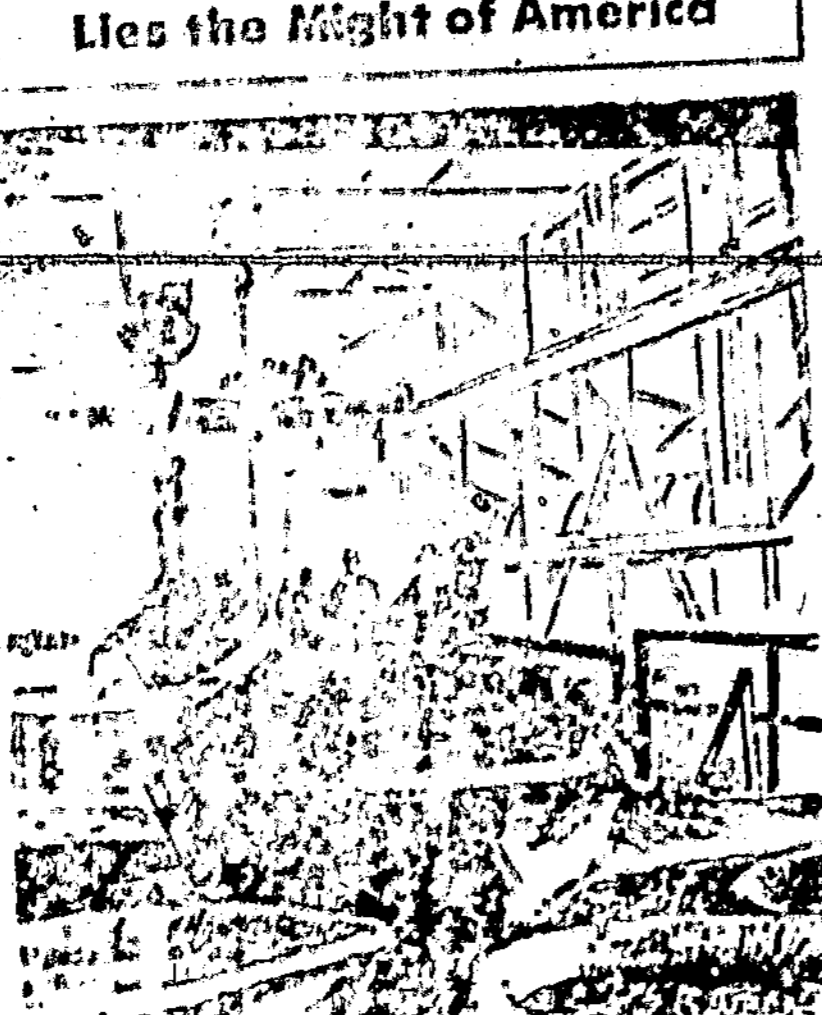

5 Good Country Tricks for Saving More Used Fats

THIS year our domestic supply of fats and oils will be approximately one and a half billion pounds less than last year. Right now we are facing our worst fat shortage since the war began. To make up for this staggering loss, the government is depending on the women of America—and particularly women on farms and in smaller cities.

Every spoonful, every drop of fat is needed to help make battlefield and homefront essentials. So roll up your sleeves and do an all-out job, won't you? Clip this checklist and pin it up in your kitchen as a reminder.



1. **FRIED SALT PORK**—with milk gravy. Salt pork yields so much grease, you won't need it all for gravy. Pour the rest into the calvege can.
2. **DEEP FAT FRYING**—use the fat over and over, but when it's too dark and smelly to use any more, don't forget Uncle Sam wants it!
3. **ROASTS AND CHOPS**—save all trimmings (scraps from plates, too.) Keep them in a small bowl; once a week melt them down.
4. **SAUSAGES**—they're better if you parboil them first. Skim the fat off the cooking water—scrap the fat from the frying pan.
5. **CHICKEN SOUP**—chill it before you use it. Scoop off the hardened grease (soup tastes better, too!)

When the salvage can is full, take it to your butcher promptly. How will you get 2 red points and up to 4¢ for every pound of used fat you turn in.

TOPS FOR INDIVIDUAL FLAVOR— HOME-MADE FRUIT PICKLES

Even when plentiful in the shops (try to find them now!), pickled fruits are costly and lack the flavor of a good homemade product. The commercial packers do a top notch job but it is a mass production proposition and must, for practical purposes, lack the touch of individuality found in good homemade pickles.

First-quality pear or peach pickles are plump and tender and the color of amber. The sirup, honeylike in thickness, is flavored to please one's own taste.

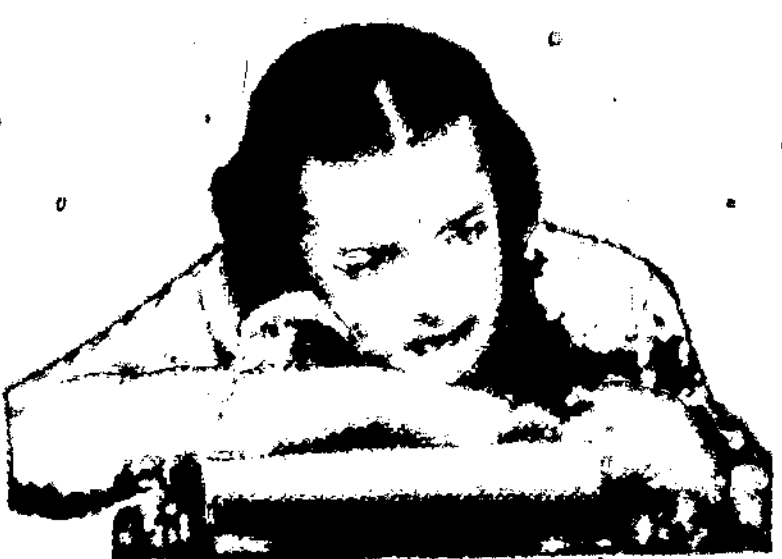
Here's a secret. Follow the recipe to the letter until you come to the spices, then go on your own. You dislike clove? Leave it out. You like ginger? Put it in. And if you can get them, use oil or essences of spices rather than the whole ones called for in recipes. The oils won't discolor the fruit, but go slow, a drop at a time. These oils are expensive and as strong as "all get-out!"

The select pears for packing are

seekels but any good, firm ripe ones will do. This is how:

- 1 gallon pears
 - 6 cups sugar
 - 2 cups water
 - 4 cups vinegar
 - 2 pieces ginger root
 - 2 sticks cinnamon
 - 2 tablepoons whole allspice
 - 1 tablepoon cloves
- Select firm pears. Pare and leave small ones whole; halve or quarter and core large ones. Boil 20 minutes in clear water. Boil sugar water, vinegar, and spices (tied in bag) 10 minutes. Add pears. Let stand overnight. Cook until tender. Pack pears into hot jars. Cook sirup until thick. Pour over pears. Process 5 minutes in hot-water bath.
