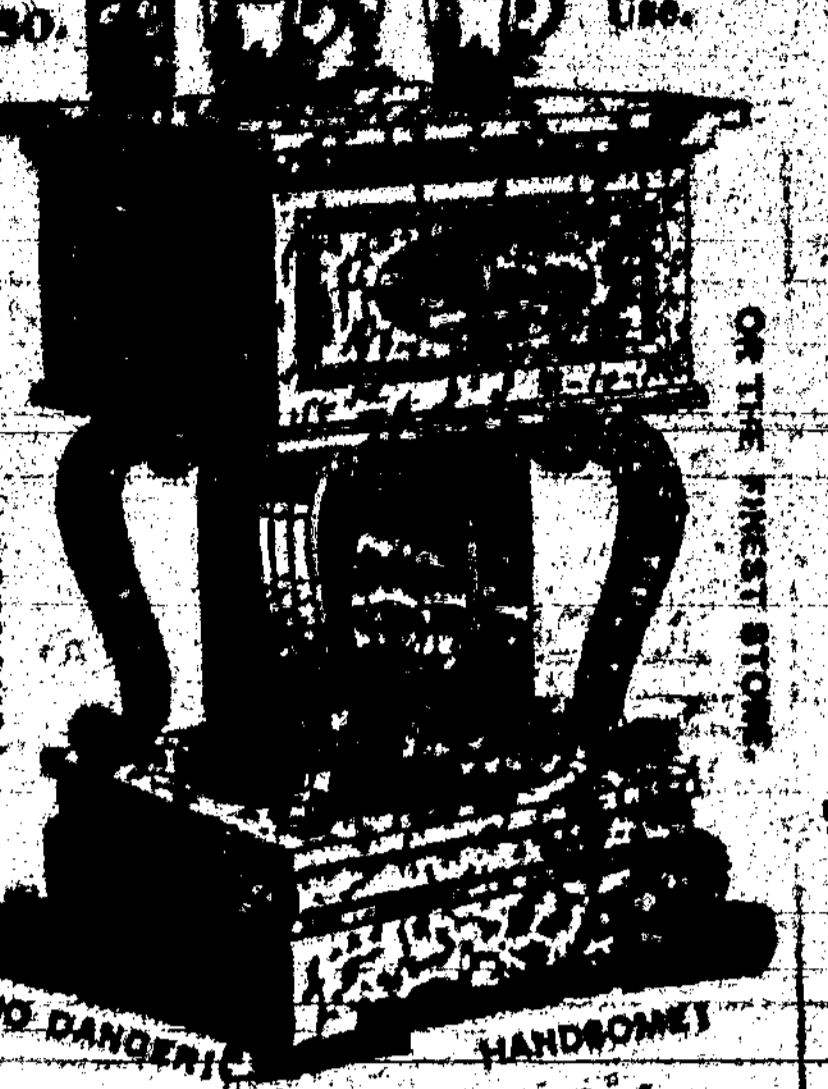

## NEW LAWS.

The School Book Act provide for the adoption of a list of textbooks by the Territorial Board of Education, which, after adoption, shall not be changed for four years thereafter. The Board is authorized to contract with publishers to supply such books to the extent of the needs of the Territory, and each school teacher, or school of pupils, who shall deposit in the rates in this behalf made by the Territorial Board of Education, shall be entitled to receive text books other than those provided by said Board, shall suffer the penalty of a fine, not less than one dollar, and not more than five dollars, for each copy of such books so received. The act creating the office of county surveyor, provides that each officer shall make the books of record of the county, and shall be held responsible for the same. ## WOMEN IN EUROPE.

Observations Made by an American Working Woman in the Old World.

When we landed at Liverpool and went to the Adelphi Hotel, our un-sophisticated eyes were opened to an unusual extent to find all our wants attended to by women instead of men, as we had been accustomed to have in our own land. The white-capped maid—this term is applied to all ages—answered bells, brought up water, took our mail, or whatever was required. We actually expected to have her bring up our luggage, but a male porter, fortunately, did this.

Our stay in Liverpool being very short, we had not much time for observation, but as we advanced every thing seemed to us very strange. In water, that American luxury, is a thing rarely used by the English people, and such a thing as a man behind a bar is unheard of. Males—selected, I was informed, for their beauty as much as any other consideration—attend the bar of every hotel; and, although we American women look upon this with peculiar feelings, in old England it is a custom, and the position is regarded as respectable as any other a woman may occupy in service. At the hotels there are no housekeepers in the modern use of the word. The first chambermaid takes most of the responsibility of such a position, while the actual labor is shared by the under-chambermaids. The scrubbing, cleaning and dusting is done by housemaids.

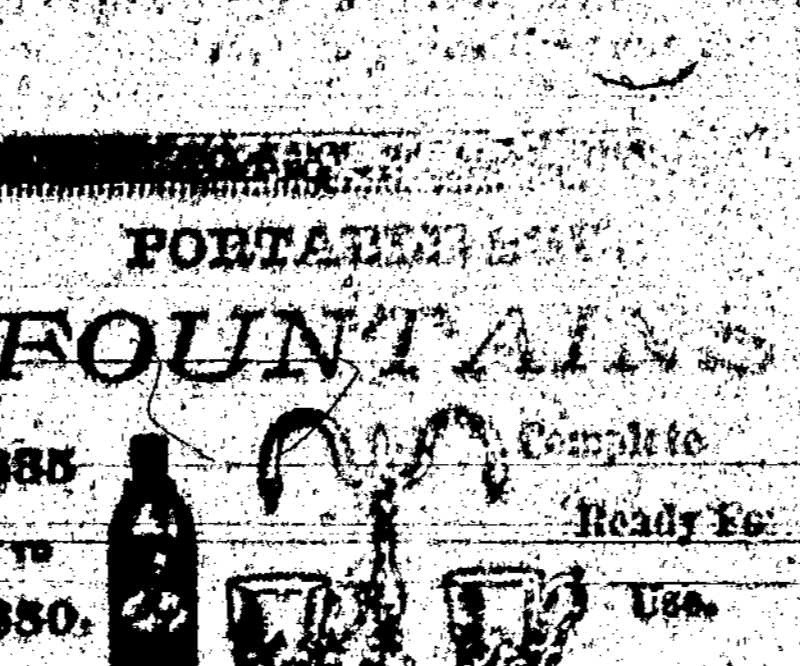

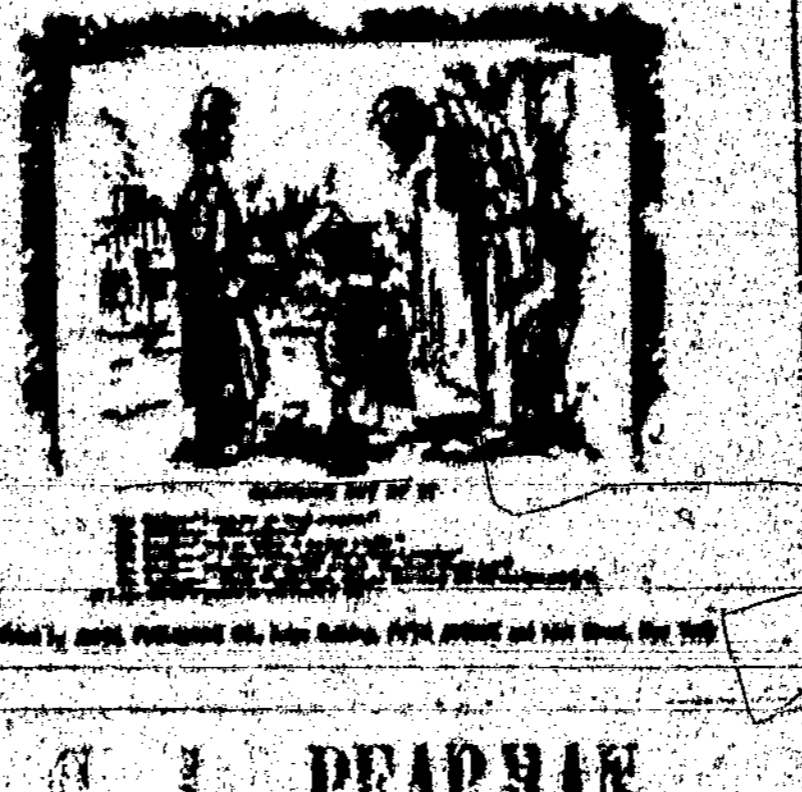

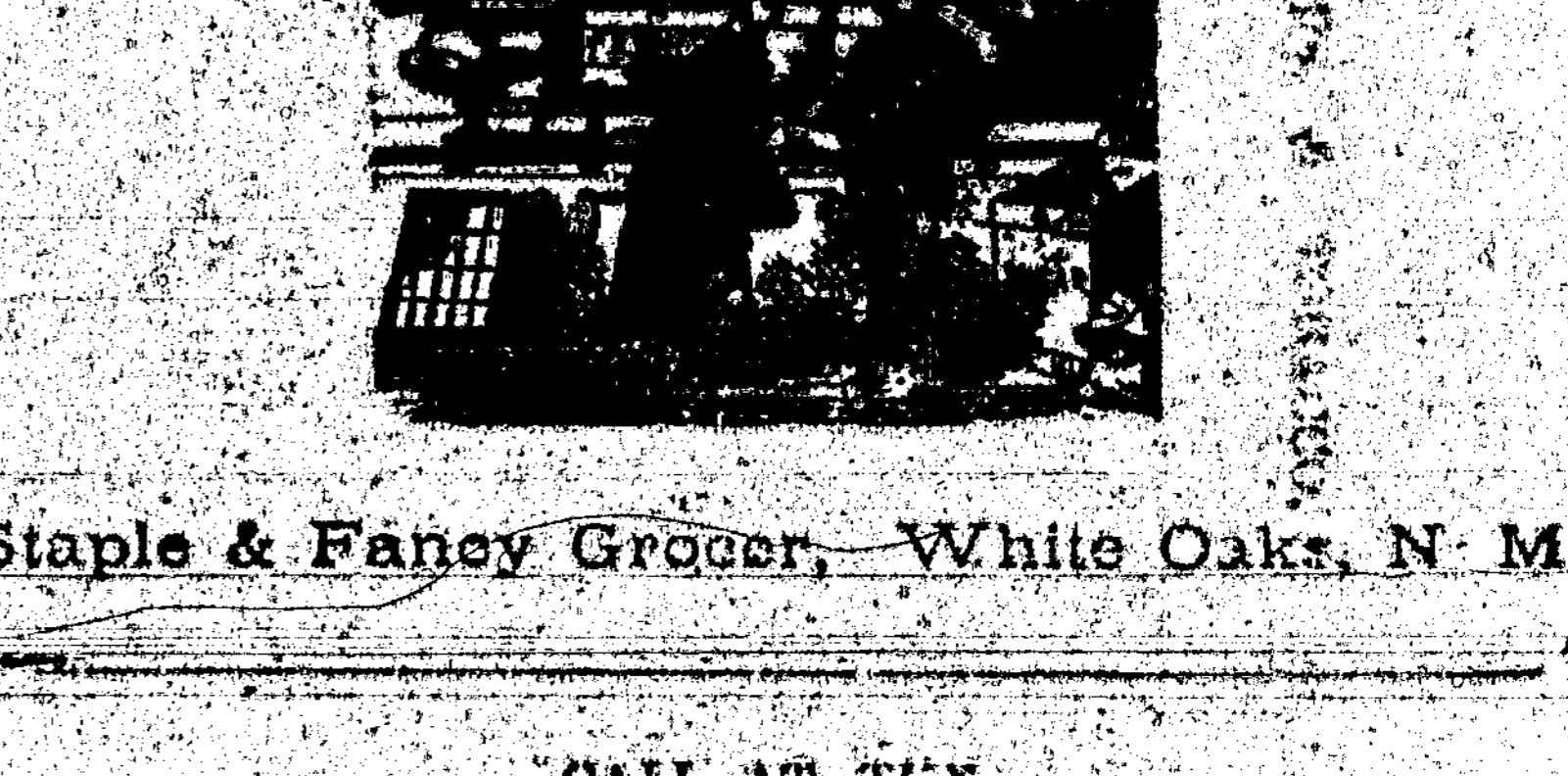
