EX-PRIVATE IS GENERAL



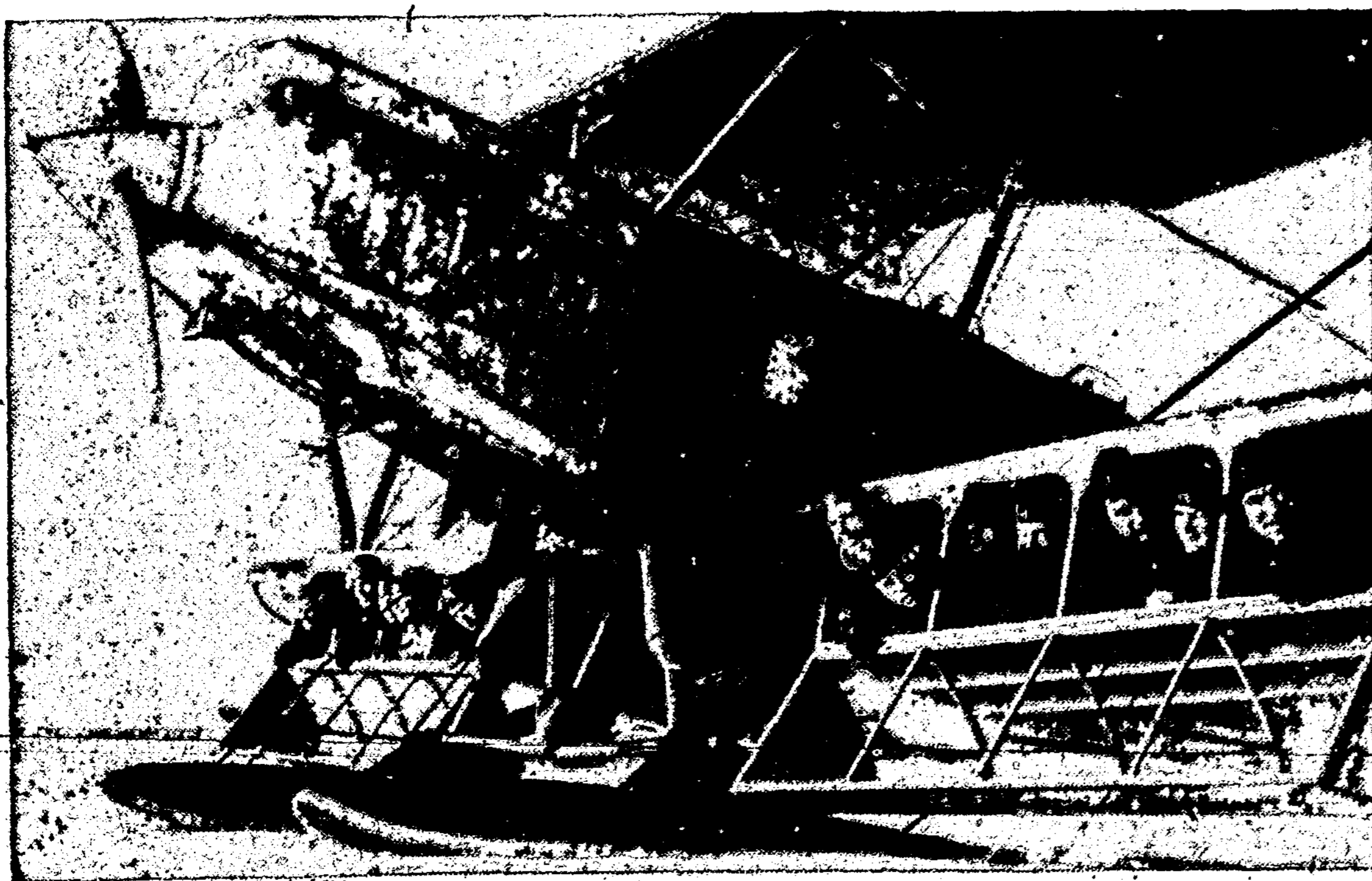

Glory Vs. Undernourishment. OF INTEREST TO THE HOUSEWIFE

Should soup, vegetables or gravy have been made too salt, simply add a small quantity of coarse, brown sugar to them, stir well, and the dish will become palatable again.

To clean windows and mirrors rub them with cold starch, let it dry and then wipe off with a soft cloth. This will clean as well as give a brilliant polish.

Boiled rice, well seasoned and served with creamed salmon, or shrimp makes a good luncheon dish.

In removing basting threads cut them every few inches and do not pull a very long thread out at one time, as you are very apt to leave holes in the goods.

A half tablespoonful or half teaspoonful of any dry ingredient, or solid fat, is always measured as follows: Fill the spoon full. If it is a dry ingredient, level it off then measure it lengthwise of the spoon into halves, scraping off the unused half. If a solid fat is being measured, first pack it down into the spoon, then level it off, and proceed as directed.

For a fourth teaspoonful or tablespoonful, first measure a half, then divide it into quarters.

N. M. Forest Excell. For Skiing

Albuquerque, N. Mex. With America fast becoming ski-minded and many of New Mexico's outdoor enthusiasts caught by the contagion, the Forest Service is searching out possible skiing areas in many parts of the state, it was said by Landis J. Arnold, regional recreation inspector.

New Mexico has areas with possibilities for skiing and other winter sports of a caliber fully equal to those in other parts of the nation, he said. The possibilities were disclosed by a survey which regional officials conducted during the past month, on National Forests and adjoining lands in this state.

Graeme McGowan, skiing expert for the Rocky Mountain Region of the Forest Service, who came from Denver to aid the survey, declared, "natural condition near Taos are superior to those of New England for skiing".

The Forest Service is planning practice slides for beginners, and steeper slopes for more expert devotees, but will especially encourage ski-touring over high forest areas where scenery is at its best and long distances can be covered with greater ease than in summer hiking.

Skiing enthusiasts are active around Santa Fe and Taos. Farther south, in the Sandia Mountains near Albuquerque, good snow conditions are available only at higher altitudes, where roads are frequently blocked in winter. Plans there have accordingly been confined to development of a hillside in Dry Wash Canyon just south of Cienega Canyon. This will probably be undertaken before next winter, said Mr. Arnold.

Ski runs and toboggan slides have been established in Tres Ritos Canyon on the Carson National Forest, between Las Vegas and Taos. A shelter for winter sport fans is under construction there. The Tres Ritos location is the gateway to forest trails adaptable for ski touring.

At Hyde State Park, eight miles from Santa Fe, the National Park Service has cleared an excellent practice hill. Old logging roads are also available. Cowles, 20 miles from Pecos and 45 miles from Santa Fe, was reported good for skiing in late winter.

Cloudercroft, in Sacramento Mountains of Lincoln National Forest; accessible by good roads from Alamogordo or Roswell; offers good natural conditions for skiing.

"The notion that slides must be built is entirely erroneous," said Graeme McGowan. "Hill-sides cleared of brush and rock are needed for the beginners turns. These need not be large and in many parts of the state exist naturally."
