Make It a Morry Yuletide Feast!

Holiday Banquets

The big feast is almost at hand and the cupboards are undoubtedly even now growning under the load of goodies. The kitchen has been the scene of many a cooking adventure during the past few weeks. but there's still lots to be done before Christmas dinner graces the table.

Usually, we overest during the holidays, so now it would be a good plan to decide on a sensible menu. Yes, make it a feast, but select

foods that are not too rich. One way to do this is to . take it easy on the foods we should save-

eggs, sugar, flour and fats, Plan salads that are light; yegetables that do not take heavy rich sauces, and serve smaller portions of dessert. The family is pretty well filled by the time they get to the last course.

Start off with tangy juices that are colorful, in place of rich soups, and conserve on the trimmings.

There are many types of Christmas dinners that are favorites, so today I'm giving you several menu suggestions. Select that one that will appeal to your family's tastes as well as to the budget.

A roast of beef dinner is in the English tradition, and some of you may like that best of all. To others there's nothing like plump, tender deep pink ham oozing juices through its crust of brown sugar and cloves; still others prefer a roast shoulder of pork, because roast suckling pig in former times was a Yuletide favorite.

Then, of course, there's roust turkey, without which some would not feel it is really Christmas. Whatever your choice, here are suggestions among which you're certain to find some real help.

Purchase by Southern Pacific of another 20 powerful Diesel-Electric freight locomotives, and 20 additional Diesel-electric switch engines was announced yesterday by President A. T. Mercier.

The new orders raise to more than \$152,000,000 the postwar equlpment program announced to date by the railroad, and will increase to 230 the Diesel-electric locomotives of various types owned by the Southern Pacific Transportation system.

The new freight locomotives, like 20 ordered a year ago, will be 6,000 horsepower each, equal to the rated horsepower to the most power-Iful steam locomotives on the company's lines. Fresent plans call for their operation over the railroad's transcontinental and other lines out of Los Angeles, where shops and other facilities for the servicing of Diesel-electric locomotives are now being installed.

The new switch engines, of 1,000 horsepower each, wil raise to 182 the number of Diesel-electric switchers owned by Southern Pacific Transportation System. This is one of the largest fleets of Diesel switchers in the United States.

Deliveries of the 20 Diesel-electric freight locomotives ordered last year are scheduled to be completed next month. The company has also received delivery of five 6,000 horsepower Diesei-electric passenger locomotives and 23 Diesel- electric switch engines since the war, as well as approximately 5200 new freight train cars, and more than frigerator cars of which Southern and refrigerator cars remain on order, or authorized, as well as 107 streamlined passenger cars, President Mercier, said.



WASHINGTON.—As the foreign ministers' conference plodded along in London, American delegate Marshall probably frequently found himself reaching for one document to support his cause, that wasn't there. If it had been he would have had concrete proof to place before the world that America is not engaging in the wellknown game of bluff.

That is why, shortly after the second session of the 80th congress opens in January, you will see and hear a lot more about universal military training than you ever did before. The President, as requested by the American Legion, is expected to proclaim a UMT week, (January 6 through 12), and although there will be no active propaganda on the part of the government departments because the administration, especially the war department, is going to lean over backwards to avoid the charge of trying to influence congress, they will do whatever they can within their prescribed limits.

Inflation Worry Grows; CIO Seeks Pay Raises

INFLATION

What's to Be Done?

Administration pressure to force the adoption of President Truman's proposed anti-inflation panacea involving wage and price controls was increasing steadily.

Latest in a procession of cabinet members testifying before congressional committees in favor of price controls was Clinton P. Anderson, secretary of agriculture.

He bluntly warned the house banking and currency committee that unless rising meat costs are halted price controls on that commodity would be necessary by early spring. Describing meat and grain as foodstuffs in which early shortages can be foreseen, Anderson pointed out the likelihood that early 1948 would see fantastically high prices of meat.

There was a profusion of thinking on the inflation problem which so far had done little except to promote widespread disagreement and uncertainty among the people.

The administration, congress as a body and private citizens remained at odds concerning what should be done. Robert S. Nathan, former government economist, called for an immediate 20 to 25 per cent rollback in prices and predicted a "bust" next year if the situation remains uncontrolled.

Secretary of the Treasury John Snyder issued a direct challenge to congress to come up with some workable idea of its own to combat rising costs of living.

Earl Bunting, president of the National Association of Manufacturers, epitomized the attitude of private business and industry in general by calling for greater production per man per day, reduced taxes and a curb on exports.






