DEVOTIONAL READING: John 14:2-6.

Eternal Life
Lesson for March 28, 1948

"THE Lord has risen indeed," and because he lives, we too shall live. Easter is the day that reminds us of this blessed truth—the truth of eternal life. Well has Henry Burton expressed it in these lines:

*"There's a light upon the mountains,
And the day is at the spring,
When our eyes shall see the beauty
And the glory of the King;
Weary was our heart with waiting,
And the night watch seemed so long,
But his triumph day is breaking,
And we hail it with a song.*

"He is breaking down the barriers;
He is calling up the way;
To build up the gates of day;
But his angels here are human,
Not the shining hosts above,
And the drumbeats of his army
Are the heartbeats of our love."

BREAKFAST BY THE LAKE
READ John 21:1-14 for the requisite account of Jesus appearing to his disciples in the early morning at the sea of Tiberias. They had been toiling all night, and had taken nothing. Bringing their boats near to the shore, they saw one standing there, "but the disciples knew not that it was Jesus." Jesus told them to cast their net on the right side of the ship, which they did, and they caught 153 "great fishes." Jesus then summoned them to breakfast. He had prepared the bread and fish on coals of fire. And they did eat.

BLESSED ASSURANCE
BEFORE his death, Jesus had said to his disciples, "Because I live, you will live also," John 14:19, but they did not fully grasp the meaning of the great words. But that morning on the sea shore, they understood. They remembered that he had died on the cross, and now they were assured that he was really alive, for this was the third time he had appeared unto the disciples after the resurrection.

How happy they must have been! How happy we should be on this recurring Easter season, assured that he is alive evermore. And because he lives, we too shall live.

WHAT IS ETERNAL LIFE?
SUNDAY'S lesson leads us on to the answer to the question, "What is eternal life?" In Colossians 3:1-4 and 12-17, we have the declaration, "Your life is hid with Christ in God. . . ." If we have believed on him — cast ourselves in implicit trust into his keeping — we have eternal life, which is his gift to every believing heart.

Paul goes on to admonish those who have "entered into life eternal," through faith in the risen, reigning Saviour, to put on the garments of his presence and power and peace — kindness, humility, meekness, long-suffering, forbearance, forgiveness.

The evidence of eternal life is to be found in the fruits of the Spirit in our daily lives.

CERTAINTY OF ETERNAL LIFE
WE READ in John 17:3 this word of further assurance, "This is eternal life, that they know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom thou hast sent." And in 1 John 5:11-12, we read, "And this is the record, that God hath given to us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. He that hath the Son hath life; and he that hath not the Son of God hath not life."

In another passage John tells that we know that we have passed from death unto life because we love the brethren.

Easter is the day of eternal hope. It lifts above the fog of earthliness the glory of the blessed hope that fadeth not away. We have God's own testimony that we shall live with him forever, through Jesus Christ, our risen, reigning, returning Lord.

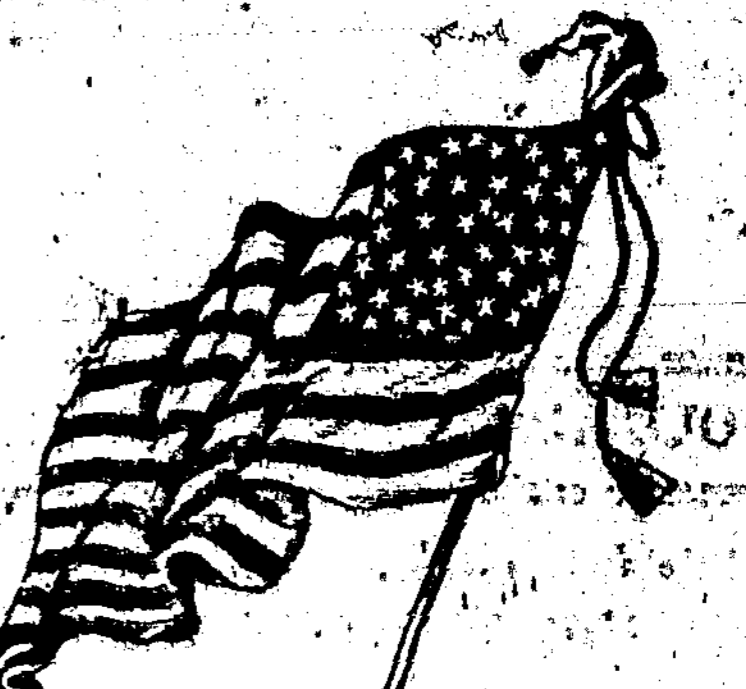

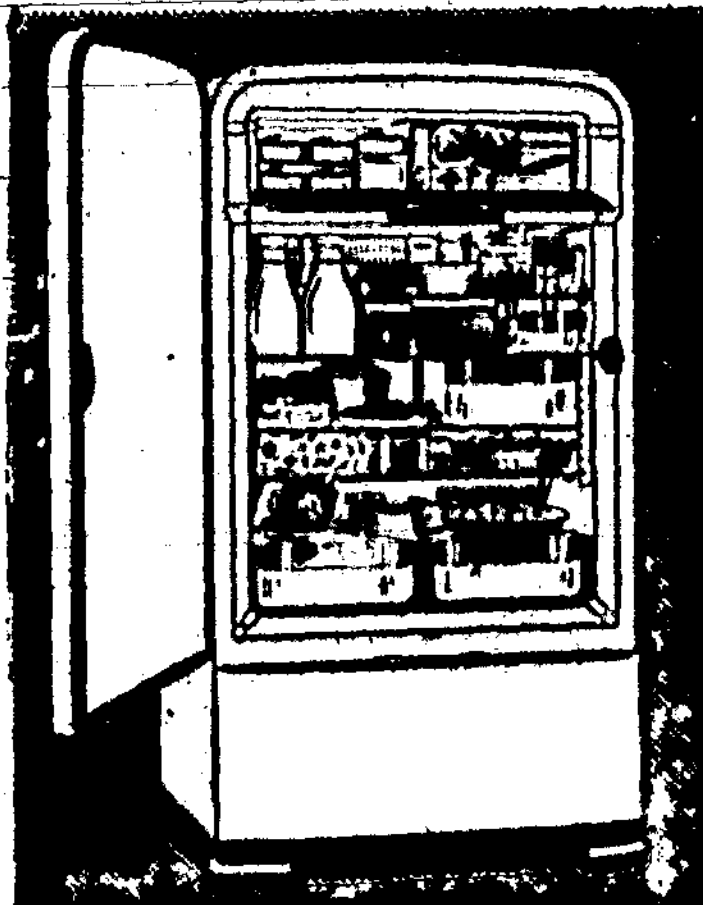

Pack of Seed Nets Million Dollar Crop Plant Immigrant Has Typical Success Story

One package of seed sent home by a missionary less than 30 years ago has developed into a crop now valued at more than 200 million dollars a year. That is the success story of a plant immigrant — Korean lespedeza.

Only three decades ago Dr. Ralph Mills, a medical missionary, sent a package of lespedeza seed from Korea to the U. S. department of agriculture. Department specialists planted the seed at the experimental farm across the Potomac river from Washington. In a few years there was enough seed to plant lespedeza at several state experiment stations.

The imported crop fitted well on the poor, slightly acid soils unfit for such crops as alfalfa and soon was being grown widely in the East Central states as a seed and pasture crop. Now, its use is becoming more widespread, particularly in areas of low fertility land.

The U. S. crop of Korean lespedeza, developed directly from the single package, now is valued at more than 200 million dollars a year. Value of the seed crop amounts to 20 million dollars. The hay crop makes up another 100 million dollars of value. Although value of the pasture crop is difficult to estimate, specialists contend that it amounts to at least 100 million dollars. These figures do not take into account the profitable use of millions of acres of low fertility land made possible by introduction of the new legume crop.

He's a Rat

What is the most destructive animal in the world?
No—it's not a puppy or a small boy!
The common Norway or brown rat has absolutely no competition when it comes to the ability to destroy. Annually, rats alone destroy about



4 per cent of the total grain and cereal crop in the United States, figures compiled by extension service entomologists indicate. As if its destructive abilities were not enough, the rat is host to carriers or is itself a carrier of bubonic plague, typhus and other diseases which are deadly to man.

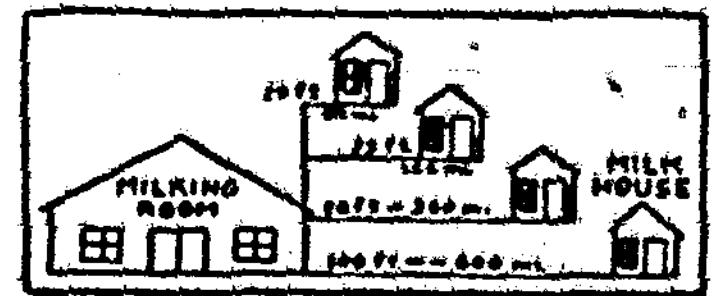
Few farms are entirely free of rats, although rat populations can be reduced quickly. Cleaning up the premises, rat proofing, cutting off food supply, poisoning and trapping are major points in an effective rat control program. But, once the control measures begin to show results, there can be no relaxing. Rat control is a permanent, year-around program. A few days of poisoning will have only a temporary effect on the rat population.

Modern Dairy Buildings Will Boost Efficiency

Increased efficiency has entered the dairy industry with more widespread use of milking rooms and milk houses.

The ideal location for a milk house is attached to the milking room or barn. In most areas, sanitary requirements permit construction under the same roof.

Adjacent construction permits the dairyman to coordinate feeding, caring for the cows, milking them and handling the milk into an efficient system.

Rabbit and Chicken Raising Is Profitable

To offset high meat prices, home production of rabbits and chickens can be carried on very economically, making the family at least partially independent of commercial sources.

Raising of rabbits and chickens at home has a big advantage in the economical use of feeds, because such animals mature more quickly and at a lower feed cost per pound of gain in weight.

Fraulein Won't Wed G. I. to Get 19 Million

Claimant to 'Huge U. S. Fortune Needs Citizenship

BERLIN—Germany's "million-dollar Cinderella" had an offer of marriage from an American to help her collect a 19-million-dollar fortune which she wants to give to the sick children of Berlin.

Several G. I.s stationed here said that marriage with "Cinderella"—Ursula Bauer—was "nothing to sneeze at," and Pvt. George A. Beaudoin, an M.P. from Stamford, Conn., volunteered to marry her.

But chubby, red-haired Ursula, with a fortune dangling before her—retorted "none of these Johnnies for me."

She said she is engaged to a Hamburg engineering student and "marrying him is more important to me than G. I. bride passage to a few million dollars."

Ursula claims she inherited the money from a distant American cousin, Henrietta E. Garrett of Philadelphia, 10 years ago, but war and occupation have kept her from getting to the United States to collect.

(Executors of the Garrett estate in Philadelphia reported that Ursula is only one of 26,000 claimants from 16 states and 53 foreign countries. Mrs. Garrett, widow of a snuff manufacturer, died in 1930. She left no children, the estate's value now is 25 million dollars.)

U. S. officials here said that Ursula's fortune would remain frozen and maybe seized for reparations unless she could attain American citizenship—which would take years, if she has to sweat out the huge immigration backlog. Marriage to a U. S. citizen would solve her problem in a matter of minutes.

Sheriff Issues Warrants to 54 Students on Fraud Charge

BROOKINGS, S. D.—Fifty-four State college students received warrants of arrest charging each with "obtaining a South Dakota resident hunting license for the 1947 season fraudulently."

State's Attorney W. R. McCann described the arrests as "technical" and said that none of the college students has been jailed.

The arrests followed an investigation which was prompted by the appearance of many bearded hunters in pheasant fields. Wardens noticed that bearded hunters invariably carried resident hunting licenses but that their automobiles often bore out-of-state plates. The students had grown beards for Hobo day at State college.

Man, Told Death Is Near, Throws All Day Taxi Party

MEADVILLE, PA.—An elderly gentleman hailed a taxicab and ordered the driver to "cruise around."

Throughout the day the driver, on his passenger's orders, accepted calls on his two-way radio. The passenger paid all fares.

At the end of the day the driver received a large tip when the passenger paid his bill. Thanking the gentleman, he asked him why he had made the day-long "good will" tour.

"My doctor told me I haven't long to live," the gentleman replied. "I'm spending my money according to my whims, and this is one of them."

Navy Plans to Build 80,000-Ton Air Carrier

WASHINGTON, D. C.—Secretary of the Navy John L. Sullivan revealed navy plans for a 80,000-to 80,000-ton aircraft carrier and eight other experimental ships and speedy submarines.

The new construction plans include four submarines capable of extremely high speed under water, one "hunter-killer" ship for destroying such submarines and the giant 80,000-ton carrier which would be almost twice the size of the largest carrier the navy now has.

Secretary Sullivan said the navy asked congress for 230 million dollars for the whole shipbuilding program which he estimated would take up to five years to complete.

Work on the navy's two guided-missile ships, the Kentucky and the Hawaii, was suspended indefinitely because the art of guided missiles has not progressed fast enough to warrant finishing the ships now.

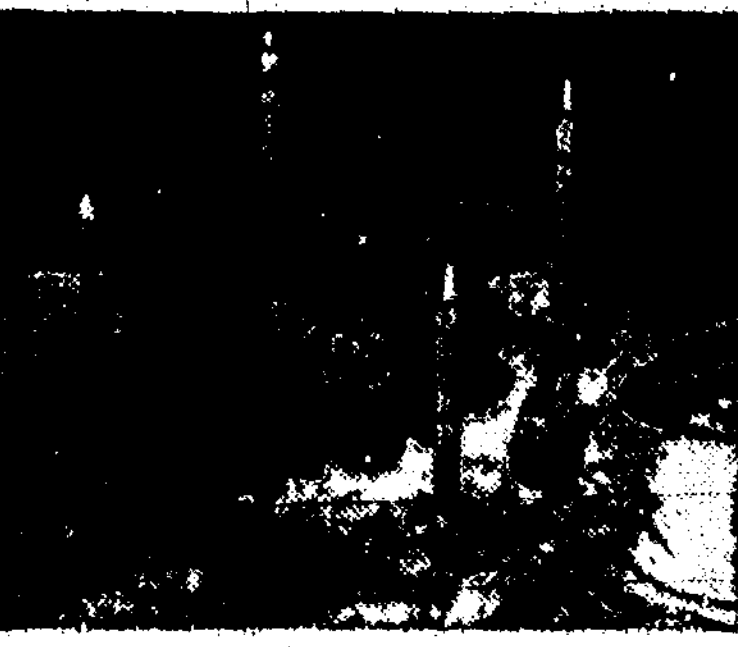
Squirrel Has Free Snack, Escapes Through Window

Gay Easter Menu Heralds Approach Of Spring Season



A table setting perfectly expressive of Easter and all the tradition that goes with it can easily be done the day before. The bowl or basket in which you place the eggs may be decorated with shredded crepe paper in pastel colors.

Easter really heralds spring and we like to make the day as gay and lovely as possible. That means bringing out your delicate china, pastel china, and sweeping the menu with a touch of spring, both in choice of foods and colors.

Many people like ham for Easter and it's a real economy to have it because you can make so many interesting left-overs, have sliced ham for snacks and sandwiches, and still have a lovely meat for the table the first time you serve it.

Start off with chilled orange juice but add excitement to it by placing a small scoop of raspberry (or mint or lime) sherbet on top. The dessert I've chosen is light but pretty and is balanced for the menu.

Your centerpiece can be made of traditional Easter eggs nestling in a basket or bowl. You'll find a package of inexpensive dyes with a handy egg dipper, a special pencil and decals of popular comic characters to help you decorate more successfully.

If you use the decorated eggs for place cards, set it on stiff paper.

Of course many people like to spend Easter evening eating the eggs with salt and bread and butter sandwiches, but if you have any left, use them for egg salad, creamed eggs or eggs a la king.

The ham is easy to prepare and always popular. For small groups, buy half a ham, but decorate it, too.

You may buy the ready-to-eat type or the cook-before-eating. Whichever one you select, however, keep it refrigerated. The ready-to-eat variety is baked, but only enough to heat it through. Give it 10 minutes to the pound.

Here's how to prepare the other type:

Place ham fat side up in an open roasting pan. Do not cover and do not add water. Bake in a moderately slow (325 degree) oven allowing 22 to 25 minutes per pound for cooking a before-eating ham.

How to Glaze.

Half an hour before the ham is done, cover with glaze and finish baking at the same low temperature. If ham is to be scored, do it at this time. Brush ham with 1/2 cup of honey, molasses or apricot jam. Baste frequently during rest of cooking time.

If you do not want to garnish the ham, simply fill peach halves with bright colored jelly and place around ham before serving.

Escalloped Broccoli. (Serves 6)

- 2 pounds broccoli
- 1 1/2 cups thin cream sauce
- 1/4 cup grated American cheese

Cook broccoli in boiling, salted water for 15 minutes.

Place layers of broccoli and cream sauce with a little cheese in casserole until all is used. Sprinkle cheese on top and heat through in moderate oven (about 15 minutes).

If you are particularly fond of asparagus, serve that in place of the broccoli. It's excellent just buttered; or, if you wish a sauce, here's a good way to do it.

LYNN SAYS: Ways for Serving Vegetables Are Many

Green lima beans may be creamed for variety, or served with crumbled bits of crisp bacon.

Cream sauce and asparagus with a few mushroom caps are delicious, too. Try a bit of nutmeg for seasoning.

Of course, you can combine lima beans with other vegetables. Try them with scallions, tomatoes, string beans or corn.

- Orange Juice with Raspberry Ice
- *Baked Ham
- Sweet Potato Casserole
- Escalloped Broccoli
- Cloverleaf Rolls Jelly
- Molded Carrot Salad
- *Pineapple Torte

Asparagus, Lemon Sauce. (Serves 8)

- 3/4 cup butter
- 3/4 cup flour
- 2 cups milk
- 2 egg yolks, beaten
- 2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 2 pounds asparagus, cooked

Make white sauce with butter, flour and milk. Add egg yolks, lemon juice and seasoning. Arrange hot asparagus in serving dish and pour lemon sauce over it.

The molded carrot salad is easily prepared the day before. To serve six, simply shred carrots fine, using two cups, and add to lemon or orange flavored gelatin. You may add grapefruit wedges or green pepper or celery, if so desired.

*Pineapple Torte. (Serves 6 to 8)

- Crust: 24 graham crackers
- 3/4 cup butter
- 2 tablespoons sugar

- Filling: 2 cups milk
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 3 tablespoons cornstarch
- 3 egg yolks
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 cup crushed pineapple
- 3 egg whites, stiffly beaten
- 6 tablespoons sugar

To make crust, crush finely the graham crackers and mix with butter and sugar. Press 2/3 of the crumbs against the sides and bottom of a well-buttered tin.

To make filling, bring milk to the scalding point in double boiler. Blend thoroughly the sugar, salt and cornstarch. Beat in egg yolks, add hot milk gradually. Return to double boiler and stir until thick. Cool.

Add vanilla and pour into crumb-lined tin. Put drained pineapple on top of custard. Beat egg whites stiff, add gradually the six tablespoons of sugar, spread on pineapple, sprinkle with remaining crumbs. Bake in a moderate (350 degree) oven. Chill overnight before removing from pan.



Let your ham reflect the holiday spirit by garnishing it with flowers, the petals of which are made with candied or fresh orange peels, the stems of candied citron and the centers of maraschino cherries.

Here's a good use for leftover ham the following day:

Baked Ham Casserole. (Serves 6)

- 2 cups ground, baked ham
- 1 cup cooked peas
- 3 eggs
- 2 tablespoons green pepper, minced
- 1 cup milk
- 2 teaspoons horseradish
- 1/2 cup grated American cheese
- Paprika

Place ham in greased eight-inch square pan. Top with peas. Beat together eggs, green pepper, milk and horseradish. Pour over peas. Top with cheese. Bake in a moderate (350 degree) oven for 40 minutes. Let set in warm place for 10 to 15 minutes. Cut into six inch squares. Serve with tomato sauce, if desired.

Beets do very well with a dusting of ground cloves or a bit of horseradish.

You can do all sorts of things with corn. Make fritters or pudding out of it if you want to dress it up a bit.

Mustard sauce goes well on string beans, and mushrooms are a nice addition to either plain or creamed string beans.

Broccoli is delicious when seasoned with some parmesan cheese, but you also may serve it with cream sauce or hollandaise sauce.

should be plotted on a map to the scale 1"=200' and a contour interval of 2'. Upon receipt of this map this office will prepare a master layout which will determine whether or not it is financially feasible to construct an airport on this site.

From our observation in the field it appears to me that this site is definitely a favorable one both in its location and its possibility for development.

From my conversation with you, I believe that it is the city's desire to establish a better public landing area than you now have and this as soon as it can be accomplished. I, therefore, recommend that you engage an Engineer to make the suggested survey as soon as possible so that we may initiate an airport development at Carrizozo this fiscal year. If you have any questions concerning such a project in this preliminary stage please do not hesitate to call upon us. With a little notice an airport engineer can be sent to Carrizozo to lend assistance. However the actual preparation of maps must be done by an outside engineering organization since this office does not have the personnel to do such work.

You will remember that during our site inspection we drove across the site in the prevailing wind direction. The south end of a strip in this direction intersected U. S. Highway 54 just north of a few farm structures on the west side of the highway and headed north through the water tank adjacent to the abandoned house. We were able to travel 4200 feet along the proposed center line of this strip before the north end dropped off into a shallow draw. This length is sufficient for Carrizozo's present needs and can be extended some time in the future if necessary with a fill of approximately four feet. The other possible site is a ENE/WSW which heads into your strong winds blowing through the gap in the mountains. The grade on this strip is in this case is satisfactory. A contour map is the evidence which this office needs to substantiate observations made during the site inspection and to permit this office to have something on record which would justify final approval.

With perhaps \$10,000 of the \$18,000 which the City of Carrizozo could raise, based on its present appraised valuation, there can be constructed in my opinion a completely satisfactory Class I airport which can be extended to a Class 3.

PAMPHLET ON SMALL BUSINESS AND LICENSES RELEASED BY COMMERCE DEPARTMENT

Government licenses and where and how to obtain them present a problem to any person just starting a new business, according to T. U. Purcell, District Manager for the U. S. Department of Commerce in El Paso.

"Most business enterprises require a license of some sort," Mr. Purcell said, "and just which—federal, state, or local—apply to a particular business is not generally known—if the type of inquiries received daily in my offices can be taken as an indication.

Recognizing the need for a handy reference to this type of information, the department of Commerce has just released a pamphlet entitled "Small Business and Government Licenses", which outlines and reviews license requirements of federal, state, and local governments.

The book sets forth the more common Federal licenses required for small businesses, the agencies from which they are obtained, and directions for obtaining them. It includes licenses required from various manufacturers, processors, wholesalers, retailers, importers, carriers, utilities, and service establishments. It also discusses various permits which the small businessman may obtain for the use of Government property and special postal services.

A chapter on state licenses covers both license taxes and regulatory licenses, and gives state requirements for a number of small establishments such as beauty shop, drug stores, contractors and embalmers.

Other chapters deal with local licenses and describe the purpose type and effect of licenses generally.

"Pointing out that licensing controls are subject to frequent revision, the pamphlet emphasizes the importance of checking with the appropriate licensing agency for the latest information", Mr. Purcell said.

N. M. A & M AID NAVY IN ROCKET TESTS

New Mexico A & M College was responsible for setting up telemetering stations, preflight testing, flight reception and recording, and for the reduction of ballistic data and preparation of reports during recent testing and launching of a new liquid-fueled Navy rocket.

This rocket, known by the code name AEROBEE, reached an altitude of approximately 70 miles. Its estimated maximum speed was about 4400 feet per second.

Simple in design and comparatively inexpensive to build, the rocket is launched by a small team with minimum facilities. In addition to being a vehicle for upper at-

mosphere research, it is expected to produce data on rocket flight which may be applicable to other missile projects.

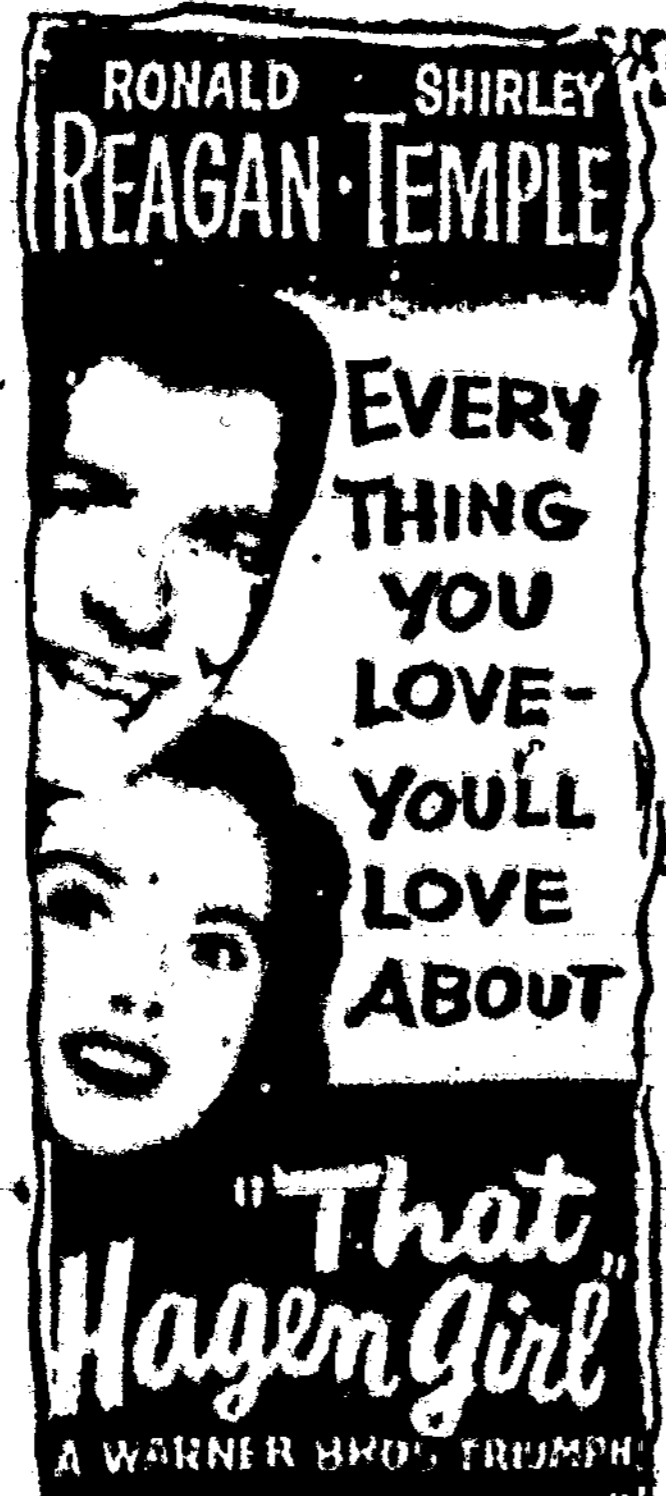

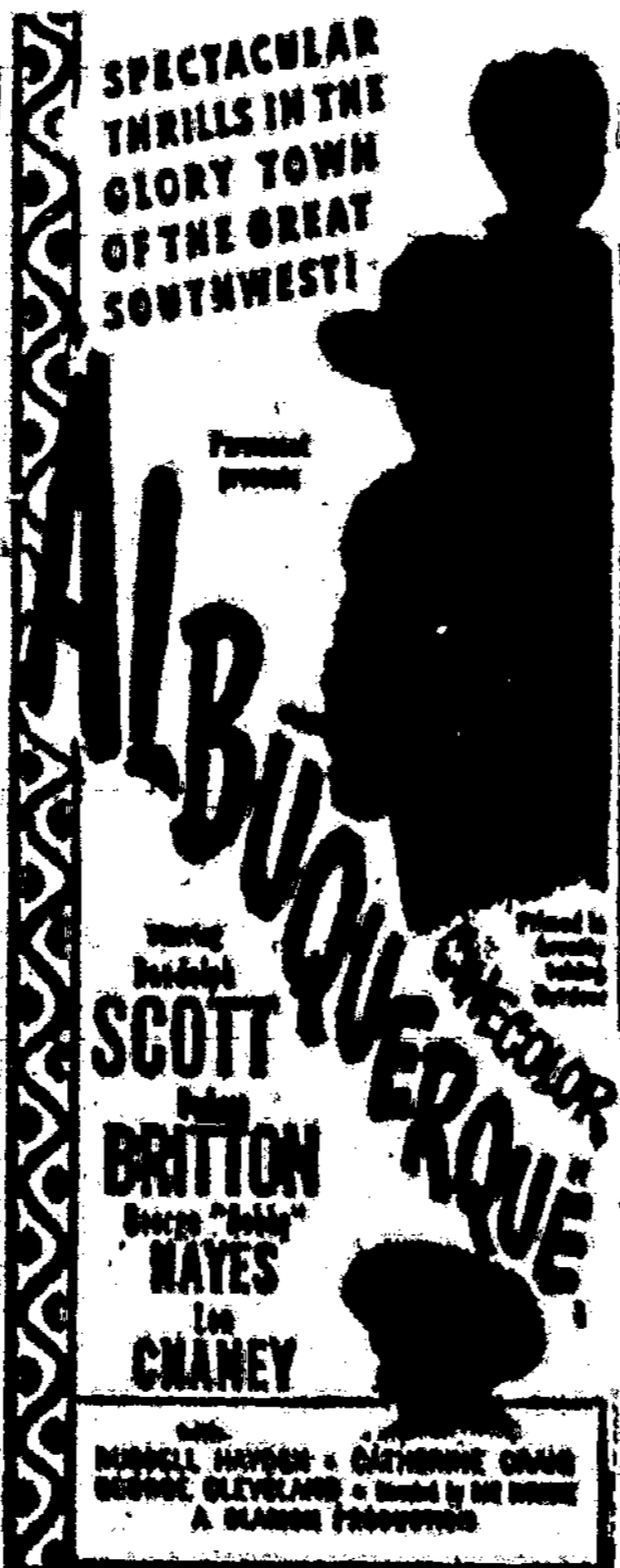
