



Last week, I wrote the first of two articles regarding the cost of our state government. This is the second of the series.

In last week's article, I pointed out that the total amount of the state's budget was approximately \$57,000,000 for the last fiscal year. further stated that of this annount, some \$49,000,000 went for institutions of higher learning, highway construction, health and welfare. I showed that only approximately \$4,000,000, or 7 per cent, of the total state budget, went for purely administrative offices. This sum of money supports some 40 departments-eleclive and appointive -- charged with the enforcement of various LIWE.

When all of us interested in reducing cost of government talk about reducing such cost, we usually think of these administrative departments. Not many of us will admit that we want to rive up any of the services performed by the other agencies of our state, such as public health and welfare, construction of lighways and support of our educational institutions. So let's

The actual administrative manch of mate government costs approximately \$4,000,000 a year, or 7 per cent of the total state budget; even though the work of these departments has vastly in creased in the last few years, I would like to point out-as an · sample-that the revenues collected by the Bureau of Revenue tas increased from about \$15, 148) 600 in 1942 to around \$46, (an) 000 for the last fiscal year. This bureau has had a tremend ous increase in the number of business establishments it must service. For example, in 1946, there were only 17,341 business talts to service, compared with 17,338 in 1949. 

"Residents of Carrizozo, N. M which is undergoing a water shortage, will have more water next week, F. A. Page, water Bu pervisor of the Southern Pacific's Rig Grande Division, said Friday,

"The water shortage developed when the Southern Pacific closed its reservoir for repairs. Water is now being piped into the town as the rate of 56,000 gallons a day

"Page said that if there is o water shortage, it has been caused by the residents' inability to conserve water by cutting down on unnecessary usage.

"He added that the reservoir will be in operation next week and that the town will be able to use as much water as it needs then. The town normally receives 77,000 gallons of water from the reservoir daily."

In the June 17 insue of the Al buquerque Journal appeared the following statement by P. D. Robinson, Southern Pacific division - aperintendent:

"Division Superintendent P. D. Robinson inslated there is no water shortage. He said the railroad pumps so much through the pipelines and M towns along the line use too much, the levels of the reservoirs drop, and water must be rationed.

" However, he said, 'there is still plenty of water in Bonito and other dums."

"Robinson anid the railroad supplies only surplus water from the dams to communities along its route, and the communities distribute it."


