affiliating themselves with some socialistic movement out of Washington. You are an independent community, joining yourselves together to get better lighting and power facilities.

"You do, however, contact one bureau in Washington to get cheap wholesale electricity. This is the Bureau of Reclamation, The Bureau of Reclamation gives you prior rights to electricity at cheap rates. These rates cannot be duplicated by you. Your plant, at the present time, produces electricity for approximately 4 cents per killowatt. The Otero County REA will procure electricity from the Reclamation Service or the Elephant Butte Hydro-Electric System for 11/4 cents per killowatt hour. As more users join in the REA system. and more electricity is used, they even hope to reduce this charge to 1/4 cent per killowatt hour. however, it is not available at this time. .

"You can now readily see why the Otero County REA can provide you with cheaper electricity and a better electrical service. The rate per killowatt hour charge they propose to offer you, should you sell your system to them is substantially under your present rates.
