In short, REA wants to take over an established, paying business at no risk to themselves. The fact is, they want it bad enough to try to force it to a vote of the people even though a member of the City Council told them it was not for sale at the price quoted in the paper.

Another point that was brought up at the meeting was that in one of the City Council meetings, and in the contract published in the October 20 issue of the local paper, it was agreed to leave the existing plant as a stand-by to take care of any possible power outages. Apparently Mr. Walker, co-op attorney for Otero County, had lorgotten this. He was un-Leertain as to whether or not the I believe it was agreed to change the wording co-that the co-op would keep up the plant as long as "practicable or until another line was brought into Carrizozo." The only joker in that is the fact that it is only about 10 miles to the Nogal line. It would be no problem to bring the Nogal line into Carrizozo, but since that line does not have the capacity to handle their existing load, it would be were than useless to the village of Carrizozo.

Medical School, Police: Board Urged By Mechen

Republican Candidate for Gov. ernor Edwin L. "I aim to see that there are no deadheads in the statehouse." Mecham declared.

Mechem has recommended setting up a non-partisan liquor control board, saying such a move is necessary to do away with the abuses now exercised through one man control.

Paul Larrazolo, candidate for lieutenant governor, said "we stand for a new purchasing act. Such legislation should save us at least one million dollara." Larrazolo spoke out against the misuse of state cars, said the practice must be stopped.

General Charles H. Corlett, candidate for land commissioner, said he proposed to stop practices in the state land office which are costing New Mexico thousands of dollars. He declared that "confusion and cover-up tactics have made the land office records inadequate to show the true facts on our oil and gas leaces."

New Mexico Still Needs More Electrified Farms

Only a little more than 65 per cent of the forms in New Mexico are electrified, the Rural Electrification Administration said this week in its annual unelectrified farm survey report. According to the report, 19,435 darms in the Synahine State have electric power, white 10,260 do not yet have central station power.

.For the nation as a whole, the five million farms with electricity represent 86.3 of the total farms in the U.S.

The survey also showed that: The number of American faring which are in position to use electricity in meeting the nation's defense needs has increased by more than 3,200,000 since 1950.

About 800,000 farms, moinly in - areas most difficult jo reach, are still without the benefits of electrie power. In addition to these unserved farms, there are hundreds of thousands of unelectrified non-farm dwellings, crossroads businesses, tehools, churches and other must estab. Itshments which are not included

in this survey. Thiring the year ending last June 30, a total of 471,560 farms seceived electric service for the flight time. This is near the record level connected by all power suppliers for the year ending June 30, 1949, when 562,000 were con-

When REA was created in 1935, less than 750,000 or 10.9 per cent of all farms had electricity. Since that time more than 4,300; 000 have received service. Of this total, 2,551,000 or 59 per cent are being served by REA financed cooperatives and other bor-



Senator Russell of Georgia, chairman of the Senate Appropriations Sub-Committee which Announcements handled the 1951 REA appropriations, expressed this belief: "No loan should he made for construction of such facilities unless in areas where private power companies cannot or will not furnish adequate power at reasontime." Since the village is furnishing adequate power now at a rate that is reasonable, and in the law it would be impossible for the Otero Co-op to obtain a loan to build into Carrizozo.


