### Finding Of Lodge Pin Renews Search For Jurist

The recovery of a Masonic lodge pin, identified as belonging to Judge A. J. Fountain, Las Cruces jurist who disappeared January 30, 1896, while en route to his home from Lincoln, has

purred a new search. "We believe we were at or near the scene where Colonel Founain was buried," said the leader of a search party which visited a lonely canyon in the San Andres Mountains over the weekend.

The canyon Itself, said Robert Armbrust, "matches the description of a canyon described in a story by one of the alleged killers several years ago."

Additionally, he said, a manmade pillar of stones was found. the pillar was composed of a 316foot headstone, woveral other stones outlining the grave and a iquare shaped footstone, resem: bling the fashion of old-time vestern burials.

Armbrust has been investigat. ing more than a year on behalf of the Las Cruces Masonic lodge. Joining in the search now underway are Arthur and Henry J. Fountain, the judge's sons.

State and county authorities reported in Las Cruces and Santa Fe, that they knew nothing about such a search, however.

In May, 1949, a veteran New Mexico peaco officer said a brother of Tom (Black Jack) Ketchum-hanged in Clayton, N. M., in 1901—told him Ketchum murdered the father and son, then burned their bodies.

Lewis of Magdalena. He said Sam Ketchum "told me he was killings. There was a third man in the party, too, he said, but he would not reveal his name. He told me Black Jack wanted to get rid of Pountain because he had been too successful in prosecuting their outlaw frienda."

A mailman apparently was the last person, except the killer or killers, to see Fountain and his con alive.

The mall carrier, according to newspaper files which do not give his name, met Fountain and the boy near the White Sands

Fountain is supposed to have told the mail carrier that he believed three men on horses were following his buckboard.

"They stay well behind us, Fountain is supposed to have told the mail carrier. "When I speed up they speed up; when I cut down to a glow walk, they do the same."


