### REA GRANTS PHONE LOAN TO HONDO-

#### RUIDOSO VALLEY

The Ruidoso-Hondo Valley is to receive better telephone service in the near future as a result of a recent loan of \$56,000 by the REA, the News was informed this week.

The loan funds will be used to build 58 miles of new line and install new automatic dial central offices at Hondo, Hollywood, West Capitan, Mayhill, Cottonwood and Hope.

As a result of the new construction, modern service will be afforded the present subscribers and extended to 653 now without telephones. In addition, the cooperative will have as regular subscribers 27 families now residing in the valley. The proposed system will consist of 583 miles of line furnishing modern telephone service to 607 subscribers. It is being designed to meet the needs of all potential subscribers in the operating area.

## LINCOLN COUNTY 20 YEARS AGO

(From the files of the Lincoln County News, December 30, 1932)

Mesdames Sullivan and Cleghorn of White Oaks were Carrizozo visitors Wednesday.

The fire whistle blew yesterday at 4:30, causing quite a little excitement. The fire was at the Grandview hotel next to the City Garage and was caused by a stove exploding. Prompt action prevented any serious damage.

This barn and the smaller building to the right were situated too close together with the result that when one caught fire the flames quickly spread to the other. Farm buildings should be at least 100 feet apart. Fire frequently is spread by flying sparks, but fire-resistant asphalt roofing materially lessens the hazard.


