Pictured above is Carrizozo's new water well, delivering 200 gallons per minute, after 12 hours of test pumping. The output of water later reached 600 gallons per minute during a trial period to "see what she would do." It is believed the well will produce at a steady rate of 350 g.p.m. An analysis of the water showed it to have a hardness of 28 grains (parts per million). No iron was present. Tests on the well's production were continued for 92 hours by well driller George Perry (center of picture.) Mayor Marvin Roberts said this week that the town's next steps would be to advertise for bids for moving and erecting a storage tank, buying a pump, and building a pipeline from the tract south of town into Carrizozo.

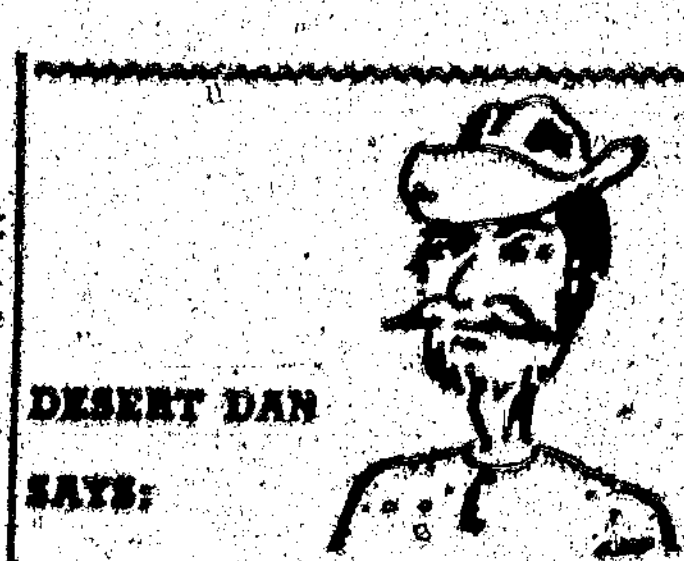

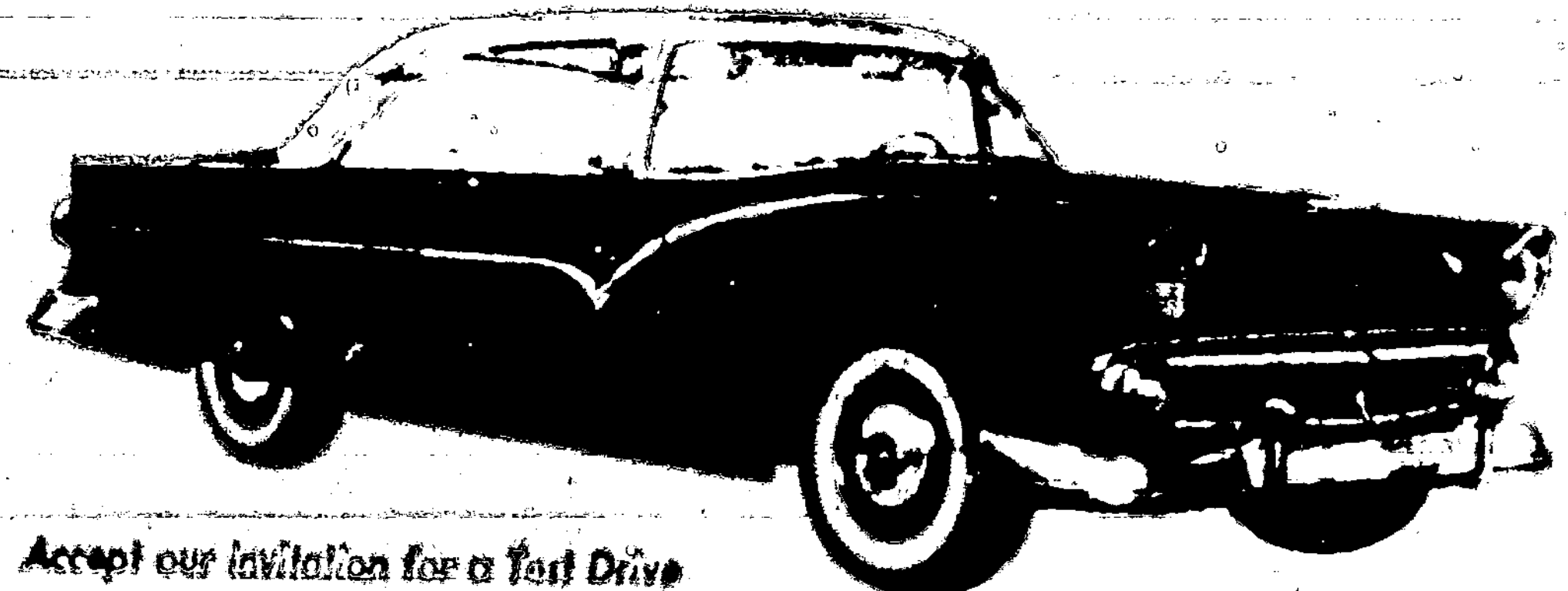

**Newlyweds Establish Home in Carrizozo**

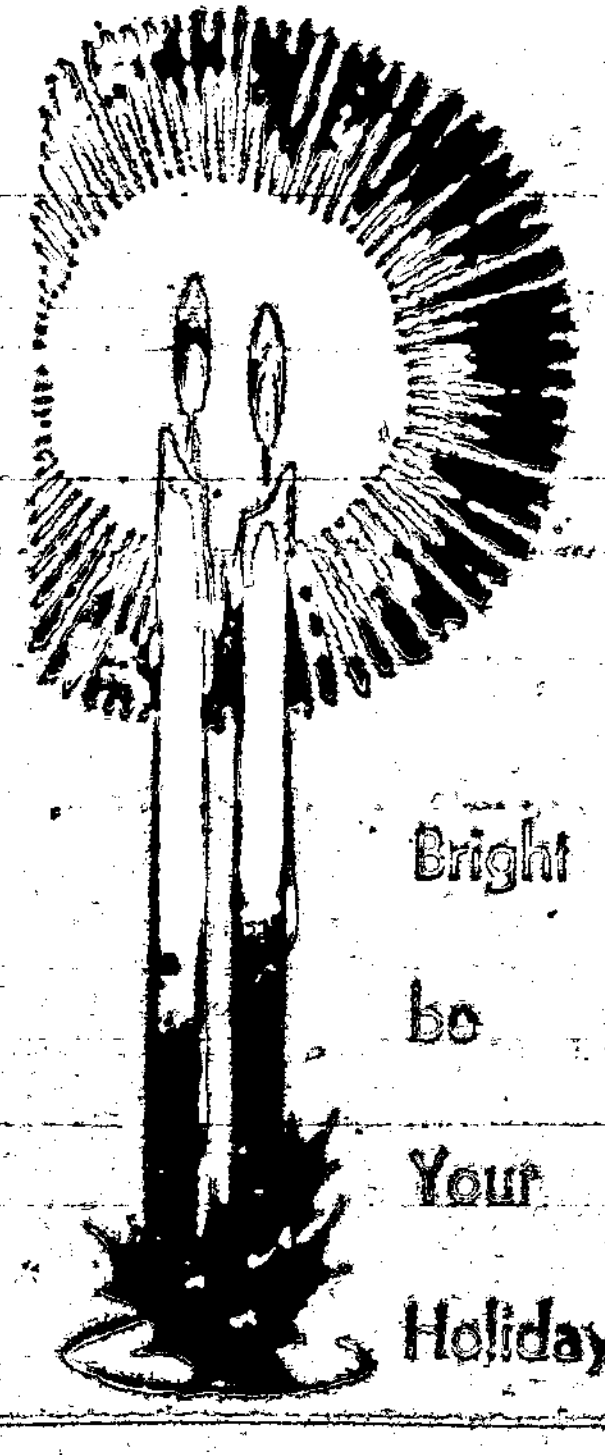

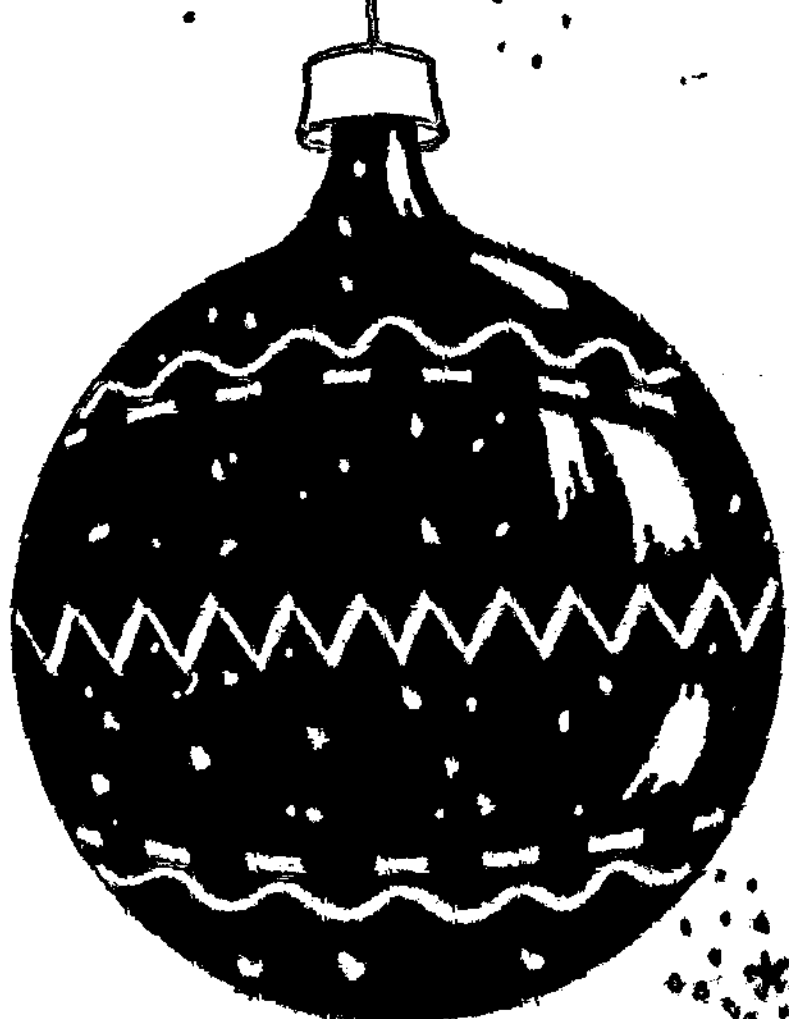

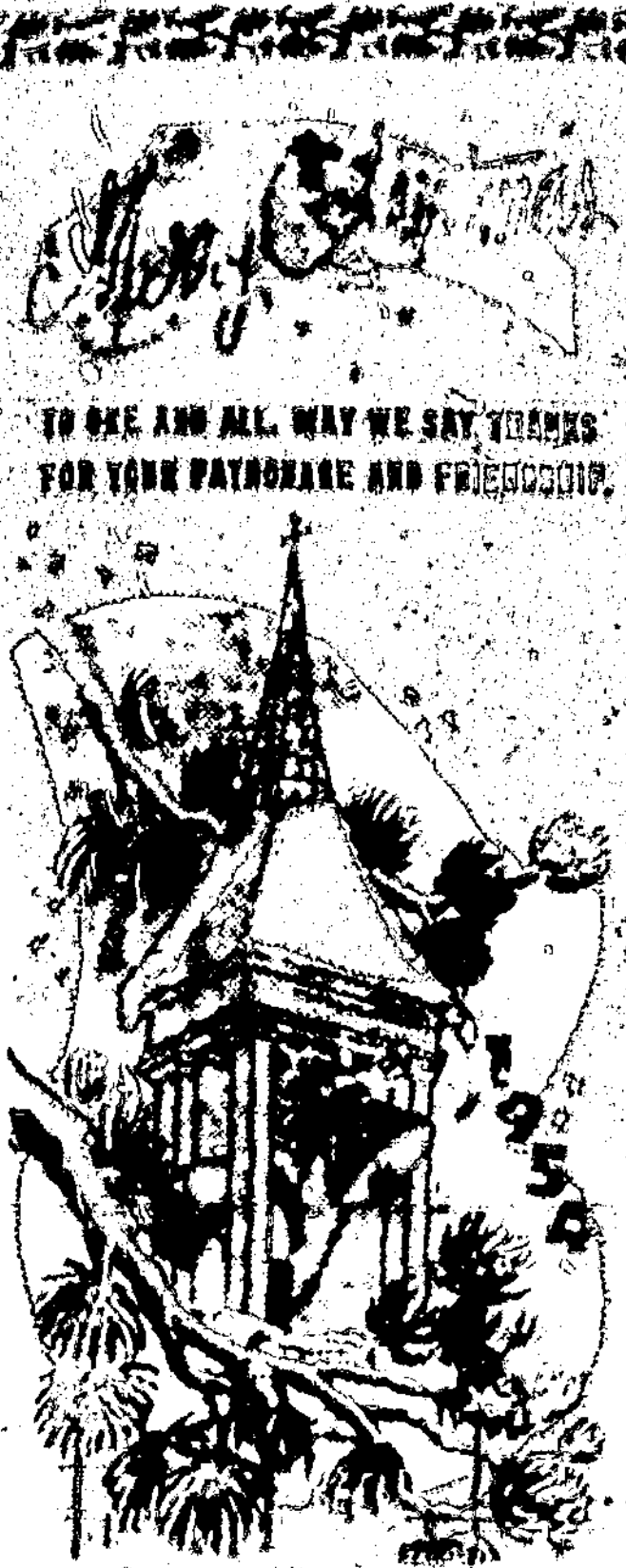

## Municipal Water Rates In State Vary Greatly

According to the Albuquerque Journal, that city's water rates are among the lowest in 22 New Mexico cities and towns. The Albuquerque newspaper published a survey of rates made by W. F. Turney and Associates, consulting engineers, and released by Albuquerque city officials.

The Turney study shows Albuquerque's rate for 5000 gallons per month is \$1.50. The city's approximate \$3 rate for 25,000 gallons used in any one month is seventh lowest of the 22 cities.

Rates for 5000 gallons in the other cities range from a low at Roswell, which has about the same rate as Albuquerque, to about \$7.50 in Roy. Roswell's rate for 25,000 gallons is about \$3.50—lowest of any of the 22 cities. Roy's is the highest—\$32.50.

Artesia, Deming, Portales, Clayton and Carlsbad all have rates for 25,000 gallons between those of Roswell and Albuquerque. Between \$3 and \$3 for the 25,000 gallons are Farmington, Lordsburg, Tucuman, Del Rio and Alamogordo. Cities in which the cost for 25,000 gallons is between \$3 and \$12 are Bernalillo, Las Vegas, Las Cruces, Aztec, Capitlan and Grants. Santa Fe residents pay about \$12.50 for the same amount; Sulfur residents about \$10.25, and Encino residents \$20.

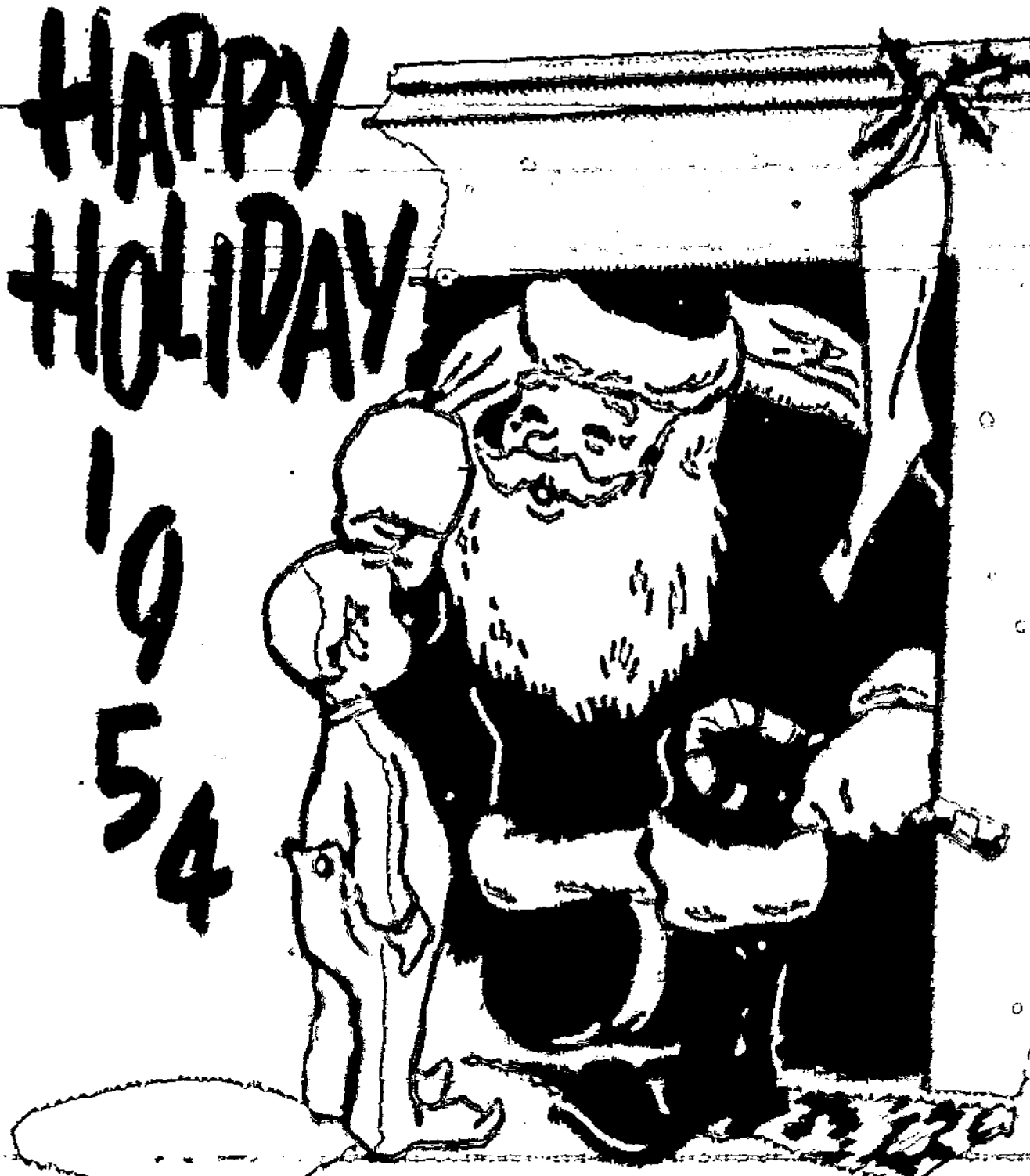
