Pruning shapes a tree and determines the distribution fruit when it starts bearing. controls quality and quantity of fruit production. It removes dead and diseased wood and helps combat insects and diseases. Pruning also lengthensthe life of trees by protecting properly shaped trees against limb breakage and decay, can be of help in reducing the amount of thinning required at

a later date. All fruit trees are not pruned about how to prune a particular quest with the Capitan Municithe same way. If you're in doubt tree, ask at the Lincoln County Extension Office in Carrizozo for "Pruning Hardy Fruit Plants" (USDA Farmers'. Bulletin No. 1870.)


