



The Albuquerque push for a larger share of the house membership on a formula based on population atone has developed an undisguised fight to block the Rio Grande city from eventual domination of the chamber. The anti-Albuquerque group is willing to increase the number of Albuquerque representatives from six to nine, but will not go for the other proposal which would—automatically—increase the number as the city grows.

There is also a gang - up against Albuquerque on the proposition to double property taxes to raise money for city government. The proposal provides that the tax doubling would come about only upon a vote of local people but it permits everybody to vote, not restricting the question to property owners as in a bond election. 


