





1955 Wool Marketed Incentive Payments

Wool sheared after January 1, 1955, and sold after April 1, 1955, Incentive payments provided for in the National Wool Act of 1954.

Wool producers who shear their sheep between January 1 and April 1 this year and who want their wool to be eligible for incentive payments should be careful to retain ownership of the wool until after April 1. The wool may be stored in a commercial warehouse or consigned for future sale, but the The market outlook for cattle owner will need to retain title


