How often do you eat lamb? The average person in the United States ate about four pounds of lamb in 1954 in contrast to 73 pounds of beef, 80 pounds of pork, 37 pounds of veal, and 4.6 pounds of poultry meat. One of the reasons why you used less lamb is because the supply available is less than that of other red meats. But if you asked for more lamb, eventually the supply would increase. At least, that's the farmer's and rancher's usual response to consumer requests.
