RAKES LIN' AROUND

There was good news this week for the proponents of Carrizozo's municipal swimming pool project. The town trustees at their meeting this week discussed using the proceeds from a newly enacted State law for the benefit of the swimming pool. Under this law the State turns over to municipalities 16 per cent of the tax collected on cigarettes. This money is earmarked for recreation purposes. The town trustees instructed Attorney Frank C. Boyce to look into the possibility of selling revenue bonds to be paid for from the proceeds of the tax. It is estimated that Carrizozo's share of the cigarette tax money would be from \$1200 to \$1800 annually.

Another act passed by the 1955 Legislature, when signed by Governor Shimm, will make an additional amount of road funds available to Lincoln County and its municipalities. State Sen. J. G. Moore estimates that \$25,000 additional money will be made available by House Bill No. 45 which returns to counties 37% of the license fees collected, instead of 15% formerly. The municipalities share 10% of the increase. This additional money, which previously went into the State's General Fund, will assist Lincoln County in maintaining its roads.

The overstatement of the year was made last week by Chet Hoffield, a California representative who appeared before the House hearing on the Colorado River Bill. He said "The population of Los Angeles is increasing at the rate of a million persons a year." It has taken Los Angeles over a hundred years to attain its present size (3,000,000 claimed), but according to Mr. Hoffield its growth is now so fantastic that within ten years Los Angeles will be the world's largest city!

Regarding the Upper Colorado River Development Bill, Congr. John J. Dempsey states: "It appears that the opposition testimony presented in three days of House Committee hearings had the effect of creating considerable doubt in the minds of several committee members of the validity of Southern California's argument against the legislation." He predicts a favorable committee report.

The Golden Anniversary issue of the American Forester gives a very interesting resume of the 50-year growth of the Forest Service. E. S. Walker, State Land Office commissioner, has mailed to newspapers a copy of Senate Bill 28, which he states, is a new law, "covering the filing of mineral claims and many important changes in procedure have been put into effect." The law relates to the leasing of State mineral estates and lands for most minerals; defines and limits the powers of the Commissioner of Public Lands; prescribes certain procedures for such leasing; recognizes and confirms certain prospecting permits and leases heretofore based on such lands and repeals certain relating statutes. It is an act that mining men will want to familiarize themselves with.

If the present rate of decrease in highway traffic death continues in New Mexico, this year's toll will fall considerably below 1954, when 371 persons died. Up to March 1, 42 persons had lost their lives in traffic in the State, compared to 66 at the same date last year—a decrease of 27. Lincoln County was one of 12 counties reporting an increase—four deaths, compared to one in the comparative period in 1954.

Construction Starts on VA-Approved Home

Construction was begun in Carrizozo this week on the first of seven VA approved homes. The site is E Avenue and Teath st., and the other home sites are in the vicinity, known as the Harkey Bros. addition.

The builders are Messrs. Larry Wright and Tommy Ghoulson of Albuquerque. Under construction is a 3-bedroom house of approximately 1000 sq. ft. floor space. It will be of frame and stucco construction, have hardwood floors and automatic heat control. Each house will have street gutters and sidewalk. VA loans have been secured for each of the seven 3-bedroom homes, with low down payments. The selling price for each is \$6650.

NEW POWER RATE SCHEDULE FOR CARRIZOZO

A new schedule of electric power rates for Carrizozo was adopted by the town Board of Trustees Monday, when they met in a special session with Engineer W. F. Turney.

An ordinance putting the new rates into effect will be adopted and go into effect at the date of the May 1st billing.

Principal change in the rate structure is a revision downward in the No. 3 schedule which gives relief to the large users of commercial power. Some reduction is also reflected in the No. 1 residential rate and a slight increase in the No. 2 residential rate.

The No. 1 schedule is for Residential and commercial users (except cooking, water heating and power units of 1/2 h.p. and over.)

The No. 2 schedule applies to

all residential uses where consumer uses electric range, electric water heater or both.

The No. 3 Schedule applies to all power or commercial refrigeration users, commercial lighting and other uses where consumer has permanent power-connected units totalling 2 h.p. or over.

TO DISCONTINUE DISCOUNT

The practice at the town of Carrizozo allowing a 10% discount on utility bills is to be discontinued. It was announced this week. Hereafter the 10% discount will not be allowed, but a 10% penalty will be added if bills are not paid by the tenth of the month. This practice, it was stated, is similar to that of other municipalities.

Mr. Turney stated that in Schedule No. 3 the minimum bill has been increased, "in lieu of the complex rate that would be required to meet the demand for standby power."

Mr. Farris is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Lewis Farris of Carrizozo. He was born in Christoval, Texas, November 14, 1909. When he was a small boy, the family moved to Merton, Texas, where Arnold was graduated from high school.

His parents came to Lincoln County in March of 1940, and have lived in and near Carrizozo since that time. Arnold Farris had followed the mechanical trade—all his life. He worked in Carrizozo, Alamogordo and Capitlan prior to World II. At that time he went to Marion, Ill., to work in a defense plant. There he married Miss Edith Davis. She remains to mourn his departure.

No. 1118 — Credit Claimed, for Domestic Corporation for Taxes Paid or Accrued to a Foreign Country or a Possession of the United States.

No. 1120, Schedule PH — Computation of U. S. Personal Holding Company Tax.

No. 1120 L — U. S. Life Insurance Company Income Tax Return.

No. 1120 M — U. S. Mutual Insurance Company Income Tax Return.



April 15 Deadline For Filing State Tax

Santa Fe — A concentrated campaign will be waged this year against persons who fail to file or fail to pay their New Mexico income tax returns, Bureau of Revenue Commissioner Mike M. Gallegos said today.

Deadline for filing state income tax returns is April 15. All single persons who earned \$1500 last year and all married persons whose combined income was \$2500 or more must file. The return must be filed even though no tax is shown to be due the state.

State Income Tax Division Director J. Leon Miller pointed out that persons failing to file are liable for ten percent penalty charges for negligence, up to 100 percent for intent to defraud the state, and one percent interest charges from the date tax is due.

Miller pointed out that information returns are required by law from all employers who paid any individual \$1000 or more last year.


