Many interesting accounts of life in the Southwest in the early days are contained in a book written by Max Krueger, a Coast, in 1868, Because of lung trouble as a boy he left Northern Germany to find a warmer, sunnler climate. He went first to Spain; then to Cuba and worked his way to Texas as a stoker on a steamer.

Mr. Krueger is an uncle of Mrs. Monroe Howard of Capitan. In Indianola the young immigrant found employment and earned enough money to buy a horse and saddle. He learned to ride and began the life of a cowboy. It was a fascinating experience for him. Later he acguired the Twin Sisters and introduced a thousand head of Rambouillet sheep and was one

The most important item of E cowboy's outfit is the horse! itself. Before the year 1870 most of the animals in Texas were the olf-spring of horses left by Spanish Conquistadores in blexico and Texas. These shorses were short and slout, with wellformed head, intelligent eyes and long mane and tall nearly touching the ground. Their hoofs were so tough that it was seldem necessary to shoe them. and their endurance was never equalled by other horses. In later years they were crossed with native or American sires, I especially Morgans, and in many fustances Arabiah stal-Hons were imported for breeding purposes. But for herding cattle the Spanish ponics were best suited." -

The vegetation and wild life of the Texas plains greatly interested Krueger, the young cowboy. Among the trees he found in the fiver valleys were pecans, water-elm, burr oak and southern or Texas cypiess, and large forests of pine and filt in the sandy parts of East Texas.

"The mesquite tree belongs to a species of acaclas. Its blossome are a few inches long and delicately shaped and sweet acented. The beans developing from these blossoms are from four to six inches long and are a favorite food for horses and cattle. When dried on the trees they keep for years and were kathered for food. The mesquite tree is found on an area of more than 50,000 square miles in Texas. The sweet resin from this tree was used in place of gum arabic in pasting.

"There was not, as far as I can remember, in 1868, a single bridge across the western rivers after the flood of that year. When crossing a deep river we cowboys used to push our horses from a high bank into the water and gain the opposite bank by holding on to their tails. Vehicles, generally drawn by six or eight yoke of oxen, had to walt on the banks until the water receded. As there were neither highways nor even passable country roads in those days. it happened very often after a rain that the heavy wheels of the ox cart would sink into the mud up to the axles.

To_us it is not a matter of public power vs. private power. In the case of Carrizozo, we would not draw a hard and fast line between the two. Let's be practical and ask which is the best deal for the town.

Carrizozo has rightly been proud of owning and operating its own power plant. It has done a good job of providing its residents with electrical service. But the question is can we longer afford to generate our own electricity? Costs are still rising for fuel, machinery and supplies. It is doubtful if money could be borrowed today at 4% to finance a new generating

Should the power plant be sold the town would be deprived. of its revenue and other-means would have to be found to meet municipal expenses, including police protection.
