

#### Highway Department To Conduct Survey

The local field phase of New Mexico's accident-cost study, involving personal interviews with a number of local passenger-car owners, will get under way in Lincoln County next week, State Highway Department officials have announced.

The survey, conducted by the Highway Department in cooperation with the U.S. Bureau of Public Roads, is a scientific study of the economic costs of automobile accidents. The period under consideration in the study is the calendar-year 1965, and information is being sought only on socidents which occurred duting that period.

Present estimates are that the live-man survey team, stationed in Morwell, will be in this area for about three weeks.

Members of the survey team will contact all persons who have received accident experietice questionnaires and have not returned them, as well as those persons who reported accidents on their returned questionnaires and a selected number of those involved in injury acci-

Each person to be interviewed will receive a letter from the Highway Department, informing him that an authorized interviewer will be in confact with him in the near future. As one of the main problems confronting interviewers is that of local ting persons who have moved. friends, relatives, and former employers may also be contacted.

Department spokement have emphasised the confidential na-ture of the survey, streamy that all information obtained from either the malled musticapairee or the interviews will be used for statistical purposes only and will not affect anyone's driving
