



In compliance with a law enacted by the 1957 State Legislature, State Engineer S. E. Reynolds this week issued an order requesting new , procedures of New Mexican miners and prospectors who sink mile drill holes or lode discovery holes to depths of 10 feet or more and encounter SANTA FE OUTRAGED water.

The Procedures are as follows: 1. All persons who encounter water in test holes more than 10 feet deep shall report such discovery to the State Engineer Office within 90 days on forms provided by that office. The report will include a drillers' log of the

In the latter inistance, the appropriator also must comply with the statutes and the rules and regulations of the State Engineer which govern the appropriation of water in New Mexico.

-New Mexico's expanding eco. nomy is reflected in the summary of employment service activity for the first six months of this year, ended June 30.

M. F. Mlera, Chairman-Execufive Director of the Employment Security Commission, reported that record totals were reached in nearly every activity, reflecting the widespread utilization of the services's facilities in recruiting qualified workers for New Mexico employers.

Job orders from employers for the first six months of 1957 called for a total of 25,713 Workers, as compared with 22,073 for the comparable 1956 period—an increase of nearly 17%.

Jobs filled by the service exceeded in number those of any similar period in the past, totaling for the first six months of this year 22,354 non-agricultural plecements, as compared with 19200 for the first six months of 956-a 16% increase:

Ringe thoroughly. If a trace of the stain remains, a mild bleach may be needed. Use bleach diluted in water. Avoid chloring if there's chance that the labele has a regin finish, as many wash and wear cottons have these days.

The mooner you treat the stain, the easier it will be to remove. Apply water while the stain is still moist, if possible.

Plain water also works best on the hands to avoid staining them. Most brands of toilet soup will bet the stain unless you rince your hands off first in Clear water.
