





Don Antonio was a devout Catholic. He never failed to at-I tend daily mass if he were near a church. When attending mass, he always wore a black cape and subdued plaid trousers, clothing which Mrs. Armendariz still has in the collection in her. private museum.

He never missed saying rosary at night and he always had his children recite it before they

went to bed. On hunting trips with his grandsons and others he as faithfully recited the resary and indicated that others do so.

On one hunting trip a Catholic man refused to say the resary before wrapping up in his blanket and lying down by the camplire to go to sleep. Don Antonio lited his rille several times. The fellow finally concluded that Don Antonio meant what he said, and he arese and

recited the rosary.

Don Antonio could calculate figures quickly in his mind, but he could not read. He and his wife subscribed to Revista Catolica, then published in Las Vegas. In warin weather it was a familiar sight in Mesilia to see Don Antonio and his wife Soledad either as their front porch dad sitting on their front porch in the early evening while she read the magazine to him from cover to cover. He had the ability of memorizing easily what was read to him.

When Garcia donned charro costume, it was said that his boot heels and spurs were silver. His fur, silver trimined charro facket remains in Mrs. Armendariz' collection.

Don Antonio was credited with saving the life of Gov. Larrazolo of New Mexico when the latter was a boy. Garcia was traveling with the boy in a wagon train

bound from Valle de Ayende to St. Michael's Collège in Santa Fe. The train was attacked by Indians. Garcia concealed the boy under wagon seat, and Lartazolo was unharmed. The attack was repulsed. Larrazolo often expressed his gratitude to Don Antonio in later years

Because he was an expert hand at repairing wagons and other equipment on freighter trains, Don Antonio sometimes traveled from Mesilla to St.
