### OLD BONITO CITY

(Editor's note: Recollections of vanished Bonito City in Lincoln County are contained in the following letter from Hugh Grafton of Lincoln to Mrs. Louise Runnels of New Bonlto City. It also gives an account of the May. berry murders, which varies somewhat from that in last week's column, Grafton relates the story of the murders as it was told to him by his mother who lived in Bonito City. More of Floy Skinner's recollections will appear in the final column next

"Bonito City ... was started in December of 1880. The first settlers of Benito City were a group of Germans, along with the Mayberrys, Charlie Berry, and perhaps a few others that I don't know about. The names of the Germans that I recall were Herman Beck, Jos Beckman, Herman Consbruck, Belderman, Rodemaker, Huber and Schultz. There were two Swedes, Mart Nelson and Pete Nelson.

"The old Christmas tunnel. I balleye, was about the first mine that they opened up . . . ! heard Herman Consbruck say that one time he was wheeling muck out of the Christmas, and when he came out of the tunnel he saw an Indian standing not for away, and he became frightened and ran back in the tunnel. Back in those days the Apaches roused the White Mountains at their pleasure.



### Don't Bring Untested Cattle Into County

Anyone bringing untested cattle into Lincoln County is subject to prosecution by the Cattle Sanitury Board. The only exception is cattle brought from other areas that are certified as .brucellosis-free, and inspected by

Anyone bringing cattle into the county that are not tested or from a certified-free area will have them immediately quarantined and will be subject to a fine and possible imprisonment.

Any cattle bought through the sales ring at Roswell or Clovis will be tested before they are sold, so any person buying from these sales rings will be able to bring them into the county.

### Don't Forget The Spotted Alfalfa Aphid

Just because we haven't had much trouble with spotted alfalta aphids in Lincoln County the past few months is no sign that they're gone. Last year about this time, the alfalfa aphid severely damaged and in some cases wiped out seedling stands of alfalfa.

apotted alfalfa aphida before they ruin a stand of alfalfa is to keep looking for an aphid infestation and control it as soon as you can. Check your alfalfa at least every two days if you have a seedling stand. To check for aphids on small seedlings, get down on your hands and knees and brush your hand or a white paper card over several plants. Look at the ground beneath the plants or the card for the very amall, light yellow insects.

When checking a field, look for areas that seem to be stresned for water-aphids may be at work. Also check along borders and other high spots. Spotted alfolfa aphido often attack stressed plants first.

If you find aphids when you disturb the plants, then start looking at the undersides of the leaves for colonies of aphids and the tell-tale drops of honeydow. If you find an average of 2.3 leaves infested out of every 10
