### NOTICE HOSE SITTON.

During World War I, while we were living at Fort Stanton, I read in a newspaper that 78,000 American soldiers over 21 years of age could neither read or write their own names. Ft. Stanton had 15 children of school age and no school to attend, yet it was a Federal Government post in which they lived. Their parents were working there because they could not make a living on their homesteads.

I took the clipping to Dr. Mc-Reon, the commanding officer, and asked him to help me remedy the situation. He suggested that I write to the state superintendent of public instruction in Santu Fe and to the department of federal education in Washington, D. C. They told me to write Isabel Lancaster Eckles, who at the time was county superintendent of Grant county and that a state public school had recently been established at Fort Bayard.

TAG THAT GAME

"Add a roll of scotch tape or a length of heavy twine to your hunting equiment," says Game Director Pickens. Either the tape or the twine will be a real help in securing the tag to the game taken.

Failure to tag deer when killed has been the most common violation among hunters this season. The tag requirement, as part of the State Game Commission's Regulation 368, reads:
