In later years, Miss Overton became a novelist and published a book entitled "The Heritage of Unrest" (MacMillan and Company, 1901.)

Outside Agencies **Pruise Fort Stanton**

Successful operation of a public institution depends on a facility by the governing public agency, the meeting of professional standards by the staff, clear definition of the manner of operation by heads of the institution and periodic evaluations by accredited representatives of outside agencies,

The last-named activity is one and precinct thereof: which has increasingly held the attention of authorities at Fort Stanton Tuberculosis Hospital, where, since late last summer, when the present administration at Fort Stanton was inaugarated, efforts to streamline procedural methods have been made,

The hospital has been visited by various representatives of public agencies who were invited to review all aspects of the facility in order to make pertinent recommendations, where eyer needed.

Viola G. Ulivarri, RRL president of the New Mexico Association of Medical Record Libra, rlans and Frances M. Pettit, medical record librarian of the AT & SF Hospital in Albuquerque visited Ft. Stanton to evaluate the Hospital's medical records.

Their Joint report, issued late i in March, said in part: "Our findings were very favorable . . . the content of the medical records, the drequency of entries, accuracy of recording of observations, histories and physicals, Fred H. Thompson were excellent and conformed in our epinion, to the criteria by which medical records are judged by the accrediting agen-

Roland Perkins, Lincoln county sanitarian, visited the hospital and following an unannounced tour of inspection through the entire food preparation and messing facility, awarded to Mrs. Emma E. Howard, dietician of Forf Stanton, a New Mexico Department of Public Realth Certificate of Grade A for safe and sanitary food service. In presenting the certificate Mr. Perkins said that the Fort Stanton bakeshop and butcher shop were the cleanest he had seen in the entire state. He also tested the hospital drinking water and pronounced it up to odilcial standards.


A hospital exists specifically for the purpose of restoring health to sick people, so it follows that the greatest amount of attention would be directed to problems relating to patients' weilare.

The Fort Stanton Mursing Service Department was the subject of serious study by a team of three representatives from the New Mexico Department of Health. The team members, Miss Portia Irick, Miss Mabel Mortwedt and Mrs. Louise W. Masters, spent a week at the hospital covering every aspect of the peration.

Their joint report says in part: "The general morale of the personnel at the sanatorium appears to be excellent. Persons contacted in all departments displayed interest not only in their own departments but also in the total Welfare of the institution. The consultants were not only welcomed most graclously but had at their disposat all sources of information desired.


