He was given the Ford Farm Efficiency Award for sheep by Henry Ford II, chairman of the board and president, Ford Motor Company, in Dearborn, Mich., Feb. 16.

The Ford Farm Efficiency Awards were presented this year to 13 outstanding managers of family farms. Each winner produces a different farm or ranch product, and 18 states from California and Washington to Pennsylvania resented

Anchordoguy owns a 9,640 acre ranch near Red Bluis Calif. Besides raising sheep, tie grows outs, barley, and clover. He needs 10 to 16 workers, depending on the season, to help him operate the ranch. When he was 20, he went into the abcop-raising business

with his father. At 31, he took over the family ranch, and doveloped his flock by careful breeding of Columbias, Rambouillets, Suffolks, and Hamp-

His breeding program has improved both the marketing weight of his lambs and the quality of their wool. For example, he has increased the marketing weight from 83 to 112 pounds per lamb, and he shears 10.3 pounds of wool per lamb for a high price of 56 cents per pound. Always interested in offi-


