After Simms the Montoya critics don't have another strong choice. Montoya, who hasn't done anything of note since going to Congress in 1957 except to make a nearly perfect record in voting for organized labor measures has a-

nother strong advantage for No. 1 claim for the first Senate opening. As perhaps the first or second strongest Individual in the Democratic organization he is in a position to nominate a candidate for governor who would be obliged to appoint him to the first vacancy in the Senate.

The most talked of political statement of October was Mead's promise to veto any union-curbing "right to work" legislation after having voted for a "right to work" resolution in 1959.

Organized labor hates "right to work" lows such as are in effect in Arizona and Texas which prohibit union memberchip as a qualification for employment.

Many observers think Mead lost both aldes of the "right to work" irrue in flopping over on the rubicci.
