The action by Callaway is being carried out as part of the state's new excheat, or unclaimed property law.

Under this law, the state takes over certain funds which haven't been touched for 10 years or more. The law covers checking deposits, cavings accounts, uncached bank money orders and the contents of cafety deposit boxes,

The owners have up to 40 years to reclaim the money and valuables once they are taken over by the state. After 40 years they will be owned by the Common School Fund, under the terms of

Area's growth lured Dos Juizzes do la Corte Suprema **Waliboard Plants**

SANTA FE, N. M. — New Mexico's extensivo gypoum deposits have been known for years, but malting gypsum wallboard calls for expensive plants and a hard selling job. The wallboard market is contested by air or eight giant companies of longstanding recognition.

But the time came when the state's population growth, plus the building boom of the 1950's, plus increased popularity of dry wall treatment in homes and commercial buildings, attracted not only one, but two large gypcum wallbeard manufacturers.

Kalser Gypsum Company, expanding castward from California. chose a deposit at Rosario, 20 miles south of Santa Fe, on the Santa Fe railroad. The American Gypsum Company built its plant in Albuquerque and uses gyptum from San Yeldro, 24 miles west of Ber-

These plants cost more than \$3 million each, they employ 100 production workers each, and each can manufacture enough wallboard in a day to do the walls and cellings of a hundred dwellings.

Things looked rosy all through the 1950's, but when the two plants got into production in 1960 the boom had tapered off Now they are forced to sell about 85 percent of their output outside of New Mexico. While gypsum board is light-

weight building material it's heavy enough to make quite a difference in freight costs when shipped considerable distances. To be competitive the manufacturer must absorb the extra cost. So, right now the New Mexico plants are building their volume the hard way, with salesmen heat-

ing the bushes in a dozen states for outlets, Both companies are optimistic, however, They look for New Mexico to resume its forward. stride, Naturally, the more they can sell locally the more prosperous they will be. And they have a trend on their




