State Senator Joe Skeen, reporting to the Lincoln County News Monday, said that the speciol session did a lot of good, deenrmarking funds and putting money in the general fund, got a new distribution formula, and a new set of rules for school finance. Everything was fine until the legislature came out with the budget in the closing hours of the session.

Ed Hartman, finance director for the state and the real finance authority kept telling legislators that the maximum budget they could approve would be in the 'vicinity of \$88 to \$89 million. This would leave the state a deficit of approximately \$8 million when the legislature convenes in January ,1963. Hartman figures that it would not be too difficult to clear

this deficit in the 4-month period remaining to the end of the state's fiscal year, June 30.

Further financial figuring by Hartman is that it will be very difficult for any tax applied by the legislature in January 1963 to raise more than \$8 million in the short time any tax could be ap-

According to Skeen The legislature's approval of a \$91 million plus budget threw the state in the hole at least \$10 million, with the only excuse being that the legislature was willing to gamble that business would be so much better and tax revenue so much higher that a \$10 million deficit could be handled - this seems very doubtful which is why Governor Mechem disapproved of the \$91 million budget, giving the legislature

the chance to go home and tell school teachers they have fine big raise, when effect they had a raise under the proposed \$88-\$89 million budget. The extra \$2 million will be hard to pay off. -

Mechem claimed someone kept selling legislators on a \$270 ADM (average daily members) which made the higher budget necessary. when sounder advice was the legislature could not set of \$261-\$263 with \$88-\$89 million budget without putting the state \$2 million in the hole.

A one-cent sales tax increase applied now would clear up the expected deficit. If applied after the 1963 legislative session the deficit cannot be cleared up by June 30 of 1963, close of fiscal year.

Gov. Mechem is trying to get the legislature to accept fiscal res-

ponsibility, keep the state out of debt, yet finance schools adequate. ly. The Governor did not know the higher budget would be accepted until the last minutes of the special session. He expected the House of Representatives would pass the deficit budget because they are running for office this year, (traditionally the House of Representatives has a 50 per cent turnover) but thought the senate would narrow it down to where it would be a logical budget and stay within anticipated income. When the senate did not do this the Governor had no alternative but to suggest a one-cent sales tax increase -
