NOBODY FAVORS SPENDING LESS
SANTA FE—Strangest aspect of the state money crisis is the complete silence on meeting the \$14 million problem by spending less.

The entire discussion by the governor, legislators, and capital money officials has concerned increased taxes to meet the shortage.

The whole shortage which is likely to fall between \$14 million and \$10 million could not be met with reasonable cuts in spending but a good portion could be handled in that manner without seriously hitting back the state operation.

DEVELOPMENT OFFICE WASTES HALF MILLION
The state is spending \$470,000 a year of the department of development which in all its time has never produced one new job in New Mexico outside of its own payroll and cannot point to one tangible, concrete benefit that it has brought to the state.

STATE SUPPORTING LOCAL HIGH SCHOOL
The state is spending \$195,000 a year supporting the El Rito state school in Rio Arriba county which serves as a local high school with practically no justification for state funds.

A sum of \$202,000 a year is being spent by four interim committees of the legislature which have a high percentage of failure in getting their proposals through the legislature and which are currently intent on sending their members to the Seattle World Fair at the expense of the taxpayers.

PLANNING OFFICE, CIVIL DEFENSE
The state planning office is an abstract, non-productive agency that spends \$72,000 a year on work that not a dozen people in the statehouse and the legislature can describe.

Mrs. Marcus Waltermire and Mark and Ann Waltermire were here last weekend from El Paso.



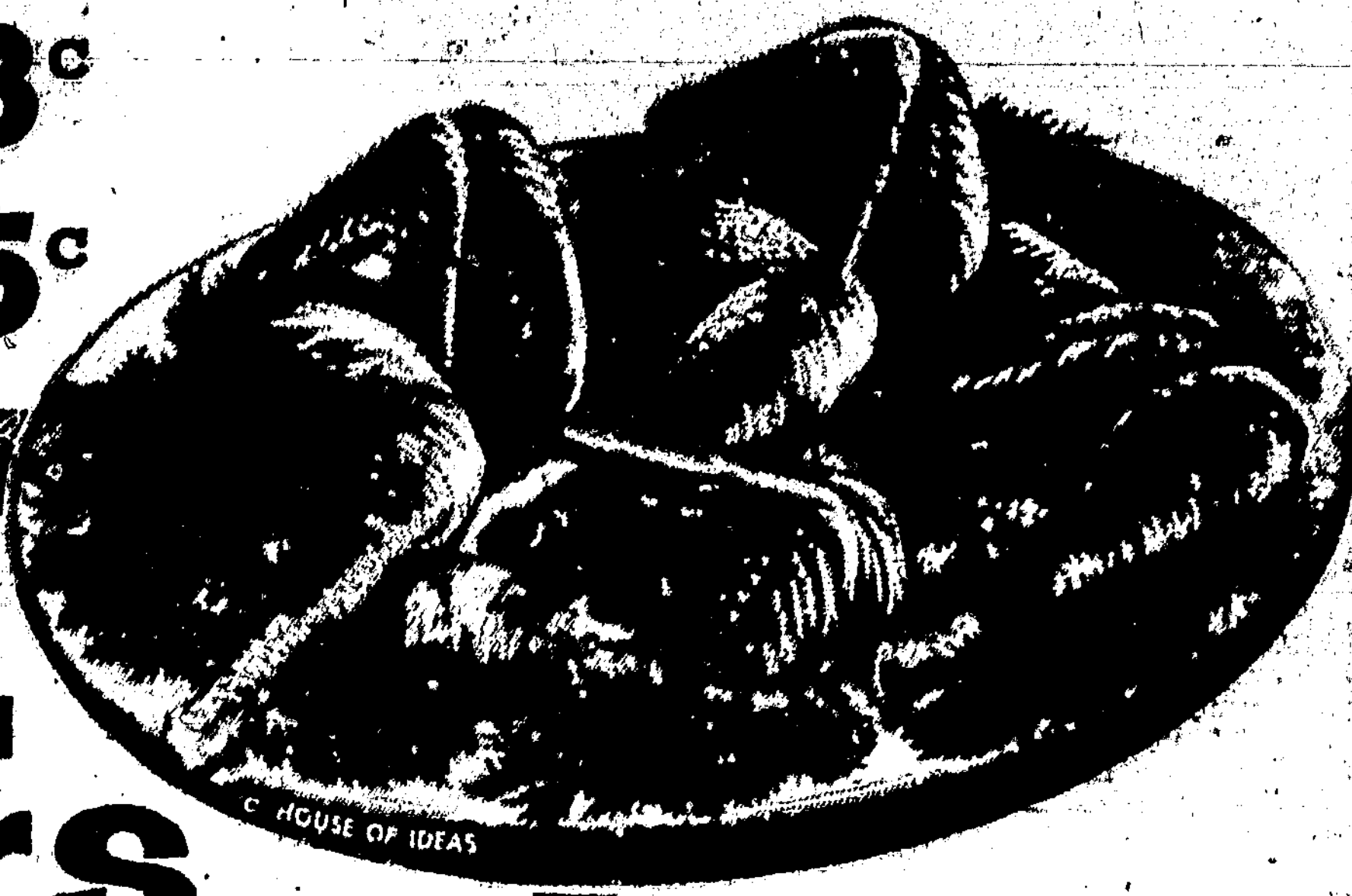
