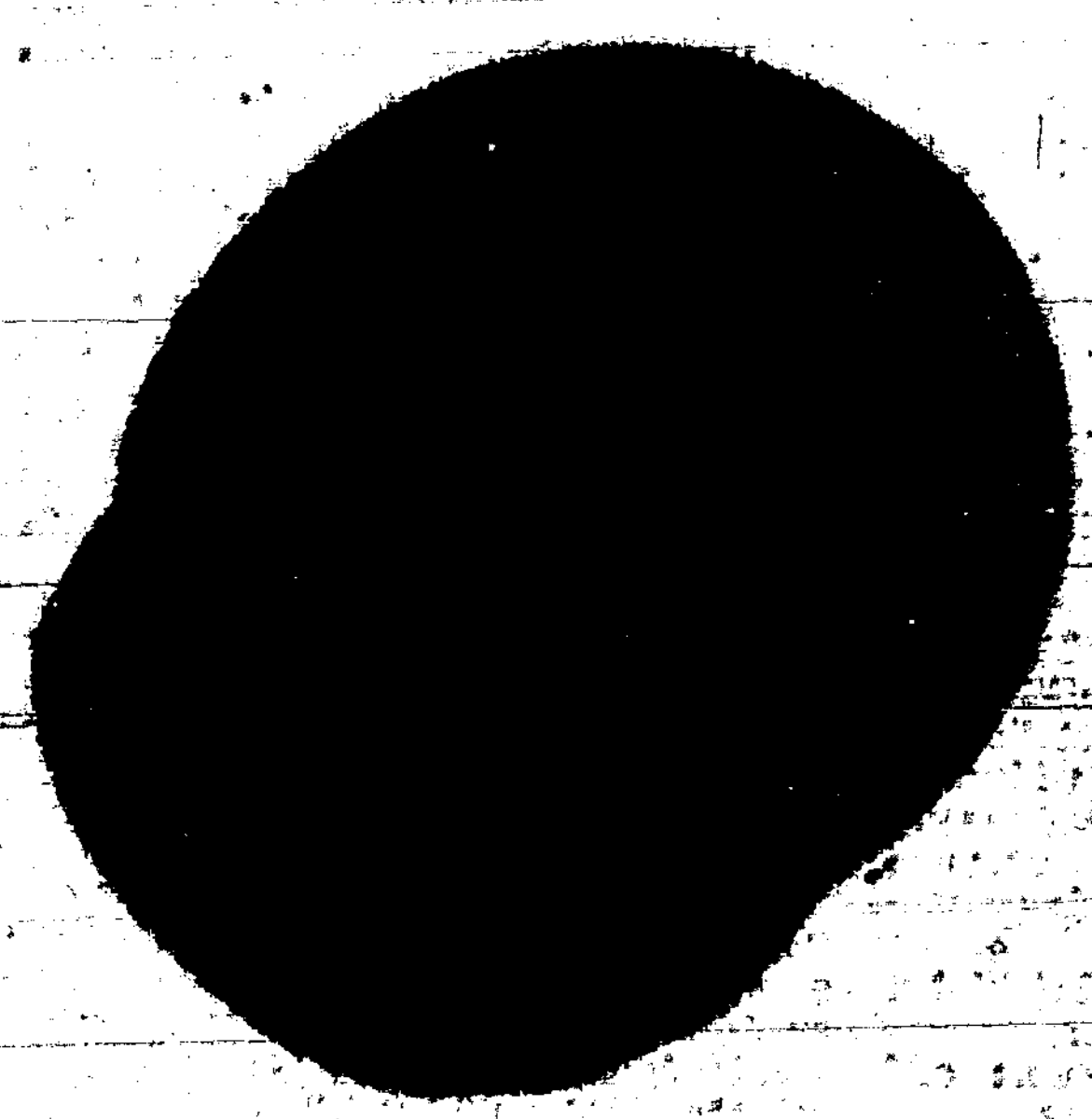

Loelle Kay Freedland and Dale Leslie are visiting with the children in the Zane Leslie home this week.

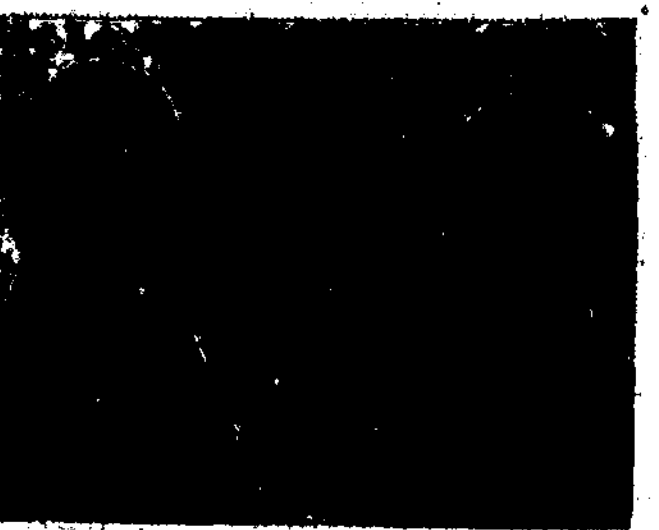
