

Six'legislators attended a recent meeting of the Southeastern Lea County Fee Landowners Association in Jalon water problems. They were Reps. Pattison, George Blocker, Jal; Frank Bateman and Ray McNeill of Hobbs, and Finis Leroy Hefdel. Lovington, and Sen Harold Runnels, Lovington.

A bill will be introduced in the coming legislature to require reappraisal of property in the 13 New Mexico counties that are now reappraising property. The Counties are: Hildago, Luna, Dona Ana, Otero, Eddy, Lea, Socorro, Valencia, Sandoval, Rio Arriba, Mora, Harding, and Union.

Reappraisal programs are under way in the other 19 counties. A bill will also be submitted to allow the state and counties to enter cooperative agreements to keep property appraisals current.

Counties in reappraisal programs will receive a total of \$878,400 in the present fiscal year from incentive features of the programs. Part of the state's 5-mill property tax levy is turned back to participating counties and funds are used for public school and county government operation.

The estimated income to countles from this incentive provisions is \$600,000 in the next fiscal year, starting July 1. The legislature early this year authorized the reappraisal program.

- Sen. Joe Skeen of Picacho, Lincoln County, re-elected as Republican minority leader, favors tightening the present conflict of interest lawfor state officials and employees. Skeen strongly supports repeal of the highly controversial pre-primary nominating convention law.

The Lincoln County rancher also wants to study the possibility of placing state severance tax revenue in permanent funds.

Much severance tax revenue -is now spent on bond issues for capital improvements such as state buildings. Skeen notes, "Once we spend the money it's gone."

This hearing. was held in Alamogordo, N.M. on June 30th; and decision was to have been given with 10 to 30 days. By their own rules, the Department of the Interior must appeal within 30 days. The case then goes to a Federal court where such tactics have already been denounced.

These things make one wonder how far our national government has degenerated so as to permit a Department to use up the prerogatives of Congress

judicate and act as its own enforcement body in violation of the provisions of the Constitution. More that any citizen, in an-honest pursuit, should be subjected to harrassment, expense, mental anguish, distress, and inconvenience by such abuse of civil rights with clouding of his titles by unwarranted official lawlessness.

It is high time that a Cabinet

post be created for Natural and .Mineral resources to protect. and assist private enterprise, that such department be separate and distinct from the Department of Interior which appears to be committed to Federal ownership and control of everything; and that appropriations by Congress to it be severly cut that it may confine itself to proper activities alone.






