Farmers and ranchers are hoping for delayed gift

SANTA FE--Many New Mexico farmers and ranchers hope Santa Claus brings them a delayed Christmas gift in the shape of legislation to control water pollution and preserve fresh water supplies.

Rep. Hoyt Pattison, Curry County Republican and an agricultural engineer, predicts 100 water bills will be introduced in the legislature meeting Jan. 17. Water will be a major issue in the coming session.

Pattison and a delegation of East Side ranchers and farmers talked last week in Santa Fe with Gov.-elect Dave Cargo about water proposals. In the group were Rubert Madera and Joe Smith of Jal, Pat Sims of Eunice and L. B. Harrison and Charles Marshall of Arch, Roosevelt County.

Harrison is president and Marshall is secretary-treasurer of the Water Rights for New Mexico Landowners Association. The organization sponsored legislation in the 1965 session calling for a study of the State Engineer's Office relating to water matters. Gov. Jack M. Campbell vetoed the bill.

Similar legislation will be introduced in January in the 28th Legislature. Also set for introduction are a proposal to create a water appeals board and a rash of other bills aimed at protecting interests of ranchers and farmers in precious supplies in water-short New Mexico.

The proposed water appeals board would be composed of at least three members named by the legislature or elected by districts. The board would hear appeals from the state engineer's decisions in water cases and its decisions would be binding on the state engineer.

Another proposal would require an applicant for an appropriation to drill and use water, if other than the landowner, to prove he can enter on the property and drill without protest from the rightful owner.

The New Mexico Cattle Growers Association approved both measures at its September meeting in Santa Rosa.

Six legislators attended a recent meeting of the Southeastern Lea County Fee Landowners Association in Jal on water problems. They were Reps. Pattison, George Blocker, Jal; Frank Bateman and Ray McNeill of Hobbs, and Finis Leroy Hefdel, Lovington, and Sen Harold Runnels, Lovington.

A bill will be introduced in the coming legislature to require reappraisal of property in the 13 New Mexico counties that are now reappraising property. The counties are: Hildago, Luna, Dona Ana, Otero, Eddy, Lea, Socorro, Valencia, Sandoval, Rio Arriba, Mora, Harding, and Union.

Reappraisal programs are under way in the other 19 counties. A bill will also be submitted to allow the state and counties to enter cooperative agreements to keep property appraisals current.

Counties in reappraisal programs will receive a total of \$878,400 in the present fiscal year from incentive features of the programs. Part of the state's 5-mill property tax levy is turned back to participating counties and funds are used for public school and county government operation.

The estimated income to counties from this incentive provisions is \$600,000 in the next fiscal year, starting July 1. The legislature early this year authorized the reappraisal program.

Sen. Joe Skeen of Pecos, Lincoln County, re-elected as Republican minority leader, favors tightening the present conflict of interest law for state officials and employees. Skeen strongly supports repeal of the highly controversial pre-primary nominating convention law.

The Lincoln County rancher also wants to study the possibility of placing state severance tax revenue in permanent funds.

Much severance tax revenue is now spent on bond issues for capital improvements such as state buildings. Skeen notes, "Once we spend the money it's gone."

Data being collected for value estimates

The enumeration and inspection of urban properties involved in the Lincoln County reappraisal program was completed last week by the field crew of Lon Nelson Associates, according to Harvey H. Cornell, supervising appraiser for the Santa Fe firm.

"Work is now being done in the collection of local market and economic data which will be the basis for the final value estimates," Cornell said. He also indicated that the enumeration and inspection of rural property improvements would begin soon.

"Because of the fine cooperation of Lincoln County residents, the reappraisal project is expected to be completed in advance of the September 30, 1967 deadline," Cornell stated.

FARM NEWS

By County Agent Ralph Dunlap

The "1967 Farmer's Tax Guide" is available at all county extension offices, according to Gene Ott, farm management specialist with the Cooperative Extension Service of New Mexico State University.

Prepared by the Internal Revenue Service, this 64-page publication answers many questions about federal income tax problems, Ott says.

Explanations and examples throughout the book can help farmers in the annual job of filing a tax return, the specialist points out.

The guide contains a summary of the income tax provisions for farmers. It also contains samples of completed returns, announces important dates to remember about filing 1966 tax returns, and has an explanation of investment credit provisions.

1 cup red cinnamon candies
2-2/3 cups boiling water

8 unpeeled apple rings
Whole cloves
1/2 cup sugar

Dissolve candies in boiling water in skillet. Stud apple rings with 3 or 4 whole cloves. Simmer apple rings, 4 at a time in syrup in skillet until tender, turning often. Remove to platter. Add sugar to syrup; boil 3 minutes; pour over apple rings, turning to glaze both sides. Let cool.
