Capitan Woman's Club is filling stockings with surprises and selling tickets for the goodies. The club is sponsoring a community caroling party at the club house on December 21.

Platting rush at commissioner meeting

New regulations for subdivisions in Lincoln County will become law in the near future and there was a rush to get plats of subdivision on file with the county clerk, after being approved by the commissioners.

During the meeting of commissioners Bob Shafer, Joe McKnight and Max Oliver Tuesday there were six new sub-divisions (some replats) put on file, the last being Unit One of Alto North, 49 acres about two miles north of Alto fronting on Hwy 37, being developed by John Mobley. Robert Stephenson was the mapper.

The commissioners have not yet had an ordinance drawn up but have appointed a nine-member planning committee to serve the county first meeting date December 21 at 7:00 p.m. in the courthouse.

Members of this committee are Bob Lankford 3 and Vaden McCray 1 of Ruidoso Downs (figure indicates years on committee), Elmer Pirelli 3 and Robert E. Hollis 2 of Ruidoso, Herbert Lee Traylor 2 and Walton Hall 3 of Capitan, Kennan Fuller 1 of Corona, Ken Nosker 2 of Glencoe and Truman Spencer Jr. 1 of Carrizozo.

Lincoln County has developed at such a rapid rate that controls are needed for areas outside of towns. The planning committee will work directly under the county commission and have jurisdiction of sub-divisions and developments outside of incorporated areas.

Letter sent to college

The steering committee for higher education in Lincoln County with Paul Wrye of Ruidoso as chairman, met in Carrizozo Tuesday night for the purpose of approving final draft of a letter to be sent to the president of Franklin Pierce College at Rindge, New Hampshire.

Robert Scribner has offered 100 acres of land northeast of Alto as a site for the college and the steering committee is negotiating to bring a private college into this county.

There was some discussion as to whether the college was to be primarily scientific, an outpost of White Sands, or a liberal arts college. The committee hopes to have permanent buildings and classes beginning September of '68.

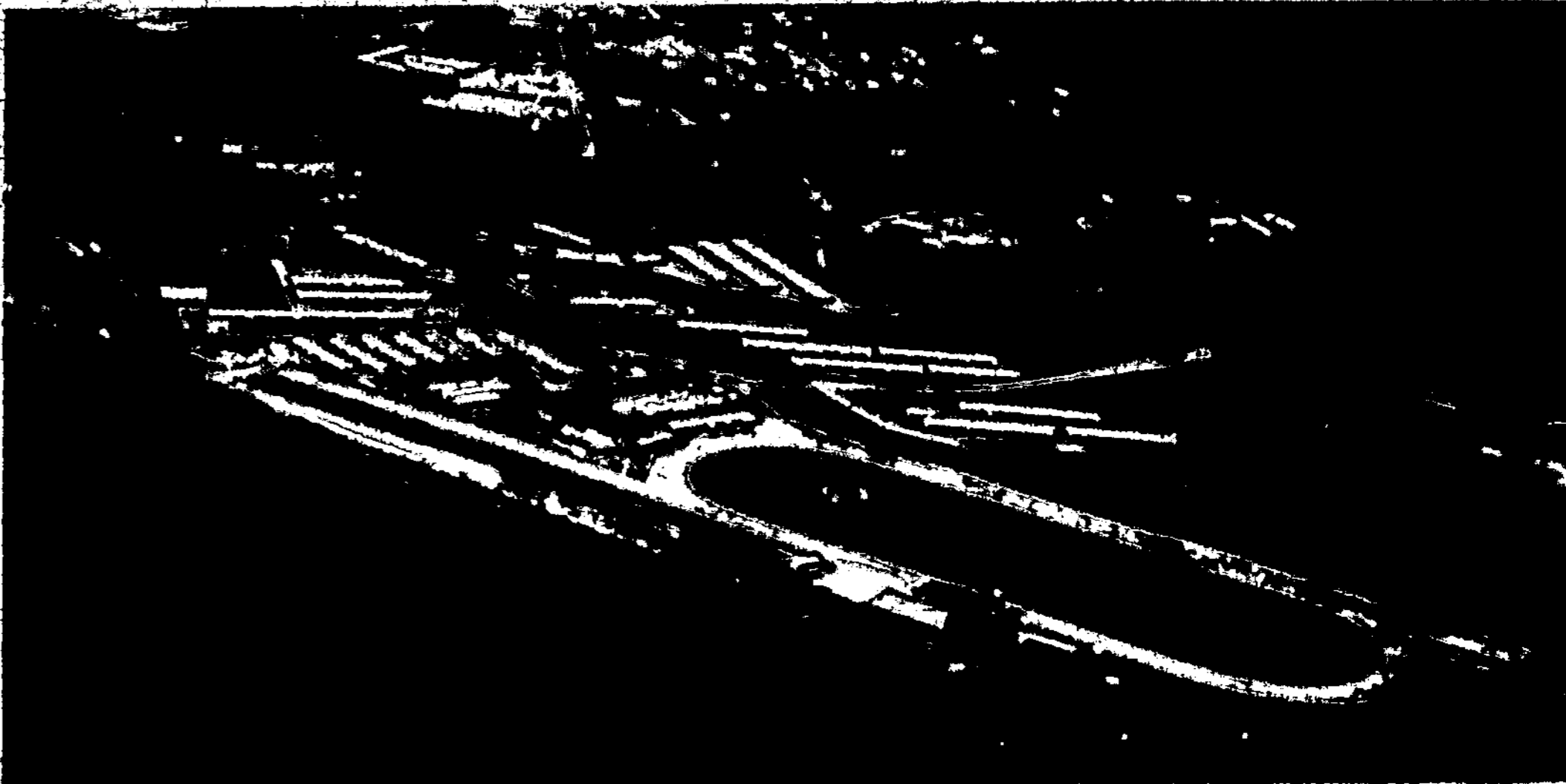
The planning commission is important for another reason. Should several areas of the county want to make application for federal funds it is necessary that the county have a master plan for land use in the county, which is a major project of its own. Implementing the plan is equally a big job.

The next regular meeting of Lincoln County commissioners will be January 9, 1968.
