The contest for queen of Lincoln County will be held Wednesday night during the a contest because the queen selected will reign over the Stampede, Lindoln County Fair in early September and represent Lincoln County at the State fair.

The Fourth of July is a real bengup day in Capitan, A colorful parade forms in the morning and takes off down town at 11:00 a.m. Right after the parade there will be free barbeque for all stampedeguests at the rodeo grounds. The afternoon rodeo starts at 2:00 p.m. and the night rodeo at 7:00 p.m. on July 4.

Rodeo events include: Bareback brone riding, calf roping, saddle brone-riding, steer wrestling, bull riding, ladies barrel race and ladies pole bending.

A special calf scramble will be held for all boys and girls 12 years of age and under.

With added money for each event the total of prize money reaches \$3,000.00, in addition buckles are given in each event.







Do You Want To Save Your Guns?

THESE ARE THE PROPOSED LAWS-

5. 3605, by Senator Dedd, would include rifles and shetguns and ammunition in Title IV of the recently enacted Crime Control Act new on the President's desk for consideration.

S. 3604, by Senater Dedd, would require the registration of all firearms in the nation under a system to be set up by the Secretary of the Treesury. Registration would commence 90 days after enactment. The registration period is six months. Persons who choose not to register their fireurms may, instead, within the six months registration period turn them in and thereby avoid presecution under the Act. Further, no person may sell, deliver or otherwise dispose of any ammunition to any person who does not furnish proof that the firearms for which he is purchasing ammunition have been registered.

H. R. 17735, by Congressmen Celler, is a substitute for Title IV of the Crime Central Act. The busic Important differences between the Celler Bill and Title IV are these: I. The prohibition against "mail order" and any interstate sale to individuals would be extended

to rilles, shetguns, ammunition and components of ammunition. 2. No federally licensed menufacturer, importer or dealer could sell or deliver any firearm or

ammunition (including ammunition components) to a person under 18 years of age.

3. A \$10 license would be required for the manufacture of smallerms ammunition. (There is no. exception for a handleader.)

UNLESS THE SPORTSMEN OF AMERICA CLEARLY EXPRESS THEIR VIEWS WITHOUT DELAY TO THEIR SENATORS AND CONGRESSMEN, INDIVIOUALS WILL BE PROHIBITED PROM ACQUIRING LONG GUNS MI INTERSTATE COMMERCE AND GENERAL PREARMS REGISTRATION WILL BECOME A REALITY. MIDICATIONS IN THE FORM OR STATEMENTS BY SOME PROPONENTS OF RESTRICTIVE OUN LEGISLATION ARE CLEAR THAT THER GOAL IS COMPLETE ABOLITION OF CIVILIAN OWNERSHIP OF PREARMS. THE SITUATION DE-MANOS IMMEDIATE ACTION BY EVERY LAW ABIONIO PREARMS OWNER IN THE UNITED STATES.







Per copy cost will go to 15¢. If you hurry there are a couple of days renewal time at the old price.

SPORTSMEN LIKE CASEY TYPE LAW FOR GUNS

An advertisement in this issue of the news suggests that people interested in guns and shooting for recreation as we know it in this county write their congressmen regarding proposed legislation.

What is being suggested in place of such proposed legislation is a type of law which goes in force in Alaska July 23. It is called a Casey-Type gun law, and calls for mandatory sentence of not less that 10 years for committing certain crimes while in possession of a firearm.

The law reads: "A person who uses or carries a firearm during the commission of a robbery, assault, murder, rape, burglary or kidnapping is guilty of a felony and upon conviction for a first offense is punishable by imprisonment for not less that 10 years.

"Upon conviction for a second and subsequent offense in violation of this section, the offender shall be imprisoned for not less than 25 years."

The new law drew praise from Rep. Bob Casey (Texas) who has proposed similar legislation (H, R. 6137) on a nationwide basis and in Washington, D.C.

Casey said, "This is the answer to our crime problem, and the growth use of firearms by criminals.
