### A \$20 bill at four-to-one

So you still call it the "Land of Enchantment?"

Of course you have your desert of white sand, that bunch of black rocks west of town called the "Valley of Fire" and some rather attractive mountains covered with stands of perpetually green trees.

But is this enough to stake claim to the title "Land of Enchantment?"

I'm sure I've overlooked a few things that would rightly add to a description of this south-central New Mexico landscape. For instance, you'd surely point out that I've forgotten about the horse track over at Ruidoso; and any claim to enchantment would have to include the ski area down (or is it up) at Cloudcroft; and what about Old Lincoln Town, that's been overlooked.

So you see, I know there's a few more sights and scenes around that help fill the bill.

But really, "Land of Enchantment" simply on a list like this?

Let me tell you about enchantment.

Where I come from we have huge emporiums that cater to the money-spending public 24-hours a day, seven days a week. These monuments, to what in some quarters is called sinning, draw more persons in a single day than the Smokey Bear Museum at Capitan will draw in six months. We call them casinos.

Have you even put down a \$20 bill with four-to-one odds on any seven, then watched those little white dice come up a four and a three?

That fans, is enchantment. Or, have you ever been dealt a seven a four at a "21" table, double down with a \$10 house chip and then watched the dealer ease a 10-count card under your stack of money?

Beat that, if you will, for pure fascination.

Or, have you ever quartered a \$5 bill on a roulette table, then watched the little white ball roll around and around and give you a hit. The dealer snovels \$40 your way and you can't make it any faster unless you steal it.

This is enchantment--Nevada style.

Oh, we have other things out there besides open gaming. A quick list would include lots of mountains--most of them without trees; Virginia City--the ghost town that still lives; Lake Tahoe--with water purer than any you'll ever drink from a faucet; and lots of sage brush covered desert.

These things draw many tourists along our highway, tourists that will talk about pretty mountains and pleasant little streams.

But locals remember things like the great that happened at a strip hotel in Las Vegas last fall, when a crapskooter defied the odds of millions to one and made 56 straight passes. He and

Tuesday was the day for candidates to declare their intent to seek office in Lincoln County and Republican Glen Bradley, candidate for sheriff, was the first candidate to get around and sign up at the clerk's office, Ernest Sanchez, Republican is in this race.

Commissioner candidates in District 1 included Charles Jones and Roman Nunez, both Democrats.

In District 2 there will be a primary race between Ken Fuller and Wall Wilson on the Democratic ticket, Holt Lovelace filed for commissioner on the Republican ticket.

Three candidates from Ruidoso are in the commissioner race from District 3, Sam Montgomery unopposed on the Democratic ticket, and a race between E.V. Morris and Don Stark on the Republican ticket.

Alice King, Republican, will run unopposed for county clerk, as will Marian Schalarb for office of assessor, Mary K. Lynch, Democrat, is unopposed for treasurer.

Candidates for state representative and Magistrate have to file in Santa Fe, Max Oliver, Republican and Ralph Petty Jr., Democrat have announced their intent to seek the office of state representative.

R.L. Sherrill went to Santa Fe Tuesday to file for Justice of Peace in Carrizozo, K.A. Huey, Democrat in District 2, has announced for magistrate, in District 3 Alton Gray and Austin Pritchett, Democrats, and H.H. Sheir, Republican are expected to be magistrate candidates.

In making this announcement, Mr. Stearns stated that he felt this was a significant step in assuring all of the people in Lincoln County that this bank foresees a bright future for the area.

At the same time it was announced that Citizens State Bank of Carrizozo, Vaughn and Estancia has applied for a branch bank in Ruidoso. Mr. T.B. Hood, former president of Ruidoso State Bank, now Vice President of Security Bank and Trust in Alamogordo and Chairman of the Board of Bank Securities Inc., will be associated with Citizens State Bank in the Ruidoso branch.

With banking facilities in Carrizozo and Ruidoso, it is felt the bank will be able to conveniently serve financial needs county wide and welcome the association of Tom and Evelyn Hood. Mr. Hood was one of the organizers in 1953 of the Ruidoso State Bank and is well acquainted with needs of that area. Mr. Hood was elected to Presidency of the New Mexico Bankers Association this year.

T. A. Bonnell, Alamogordo, President of Security Bank and Trust and also President of the three Citizens State Banks and officer in First State Bank in Cuba, Ken Bonnell, President of First State Bank in Cuba and an officer in the other four banks and Dan King, Chairman of the Board, Citizens State Bank and an officer in the other banks, made application for charter in Ruidoso. I have had a lot of bad luck in 4-H this year. The first thing that happened we had a bad snow storm and the snow drifted over my chicken coop and buried all of my chickens. We dug them out before they smothered. But later a cat Nancy Knight gave me killed most of them. So I had to start over in bantam chicken business.

Next came spring and lambing. I have four ewes. The first one to lamb lost her lamb. However, one had twins which gave me a hundred percent lamb crop.

I took most of my caving and bought two registered angus heifers. The first one that calved had trouble. Tommy Knight saved the cow but he couldn't save the calf. The second heifer had a bull calf but there is something wrong with him. We think he has a vitamin deficiency. We gave him a shot of ADE and a shot of U-

quamecin and he seems to be better.

In April, a snake bit my horse on the nose and his head swelled up and burst open and he almost died. He would not come in for feed, he got so poor we had to put him in the corral and feed him. Its two months later and he is fast getting fat enough to ride. My mother says God is trying to tell me not to be a rancher.

But I have had some nice things happen to me this year. Joan Lovelace started a new 4-H club at Corona and I have been able to help her some with these new kids. I found out I knew more about judging than these kids did and its been a lot of fun telling them what we have learned in the Ancho Jr. Ranchers.

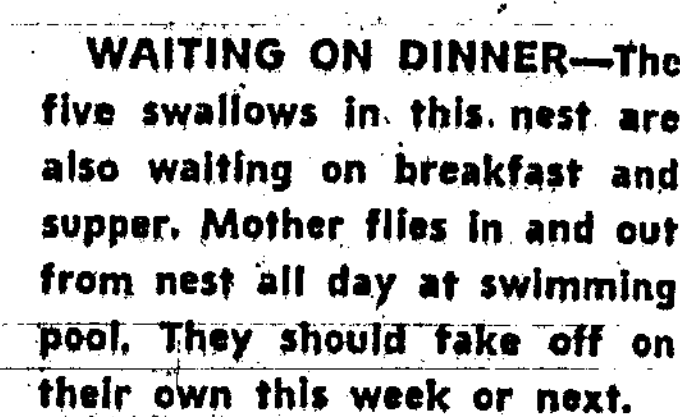
**Maverick 4-H does judging**
